

From the Rectory



If you see someone walking around the village in a clerical collar and looking lost it may be me. I was ordained deacon at Chichester Cathedral on 1st July and I am delighted to have been appointed Assistant Curate to the Parish of Findon, Clapham & Patching.

Having now finished the first part of my training for ordained ministry at St Augustine's College of Theology I will be learning the ropes from Helena who is my training incumbent. As a brand new curate I am very aware that I have a lot to learn especially getting to know people and remember their names.

I am what is called a self-supporting minister, so I will only be working part-time in the parish. I live in Rustington with my wife, Marilyn. We have one grown up son, Timothy who is married to Emma and we have two grandchildren aged five and one. I do however have family ties to Findon and my mother lives in the village. I was born in Sussex and have lived most of my life in this area.

I took early retirement from the Civil Service a couple of years ago and I do some voluntary work with the Worthing Churches Homeless Project helping out at the Breakfast Club in Littlehampton.

On my days off I have been painting and antifouling my boat to try and get ready to get back into the water at Chichester harbour. I have a small 20 foot sailing boat which was a long held dream but unfortunately hasn't seen much use yet. I also enjoy long coastal walks and photography. Whilst I worked for the Civil Service they sponsored me to do a computer science degree and I have always had a keen interest in computing right from the time the earliest personal computers appeared on the market.

Although I have come to ordained ministry rather late in life, it is a calling I had right from the time I left school. In fact I started training in my twenties after being sent by the church to work in an inner city parish in Birmingham, which is where I met my wife. I ended up stepping back from training at that time due to the difficulty of managing full time work, study and family commitments.

In the words of the ordination service, Deacons 'are to serve in the communities in which they are set'. Next year I expect to be ordained a priest but the call of service is what all ministry is about. This goes back to the teaching of Jesus at the Last Supper where he washed his disciple's feet as an example they were to follow. The one who washed feet in those days was the most menial servant as it was a rather dirty and smelly job.

At church, deacons preach, lead intercessions, read the gospel and distribute communion. Out and about in the parish they visit, take communion to the sick or housebound and prepare people for baptism. An important part of being a deacon is to be committed to a life of prayer in order to bring the needs of the parishioners before God and to stay close to the Lord.

If you would like to know more or would just like to have a chat you can contact me through the Church Office at the Rectory in School Hill. I am available most days except Monday which I am currently keeping as a day off.

Update on Shop/PO

The first full Management Meeting has been held with all those appointed to the new Committee.

The following lists the appointments that have been made. All are volunteers apart from the Shop Manager.

The shop was completely stripped of all fixtures and fittings last week by the previous owner. This will mean a full shop fitting is needed, and the work should start in early August, together with the ordering of essential equipment like fridges, freezers, till machines, computers etc. In the meantime we shall have time to effect repairs to the roof above the flat, quotations are expected shortly. We still hope to open the shop in early September, providing that we can source a shop fitter once the shop has been cleaned and decorated.

We are grateful to Bob Easterbrook who has offered to get a small team of volunteers together to decorate the shop once access has been gained, and to Mike Maidment who will clear the discarded rubbish at the rear of the shop.

We shall be advertising for another qualified P.O. assistant next week to bring the paid staff up to strength, and all the staff so far recruited will be issued with new employment contracts ready for opening in September.

The first meeting of Volunteers is now scheduled for Wednesday August 2nd, and all 52 shop volunteers will be briefed on their potential roles and given the necessary training prior to the shop opening. The meeting will be held in the Village Hall at 7.30pm.

An Updated Findon Neighbourhood Development Plan (housing site allocations)

The 2016 Neighbourhood Plan did not include any sites for housing development outside the village boundary, although several had been considered. The SDNPA subsequently decided to allocate two sites for development at Elm Rise and Soldiers Field House, both outside that village boundary without having undertaken any direct local consultation.

Following a community led initiative to set up a working group to review alternative, less landscape sensitive sites, Findon Parish Council, as the Neighbourhood Plan qualifying body, have decided to support the preparation of an updated Neighbourhood Plan that will include housing site allocations, delegating authority to the working group to prepare the updated Neighbourhood Plan, the working group having met the criteria set you by the Parish Council.

Preparation of an updated Neighbourhood Plan is now underway. The Working Group is formed of community volunteers representing different areas of the village and includes Parish Council representation.

All the less landscape sensitive sites in and around Findon, which may have some capacity to absorb small groups of dwellings are being reassessed, rather than just one or two larger sites, to reflect the original preNeighbourhood Plan Questionnaire response to that specific question.

A community-wide consultation day will be held (16 August, Village Hall, 2.00-9.00pm), when everyone can look at layout plans for the possible sites and express preferences for which ones should come forward as housing site allocations in the updated Neighbourhood Plan. It is vital that housing site allocations do meet the housing requirement for Findon of around 30 dwellings over the 19 year period of the Plan, otherwise the SDNPA will continue to allocate sites.

Following the consultation day there will be a period of up to two weeks when preferences can also be expressed via flyer, email or the Parish Council or Findon Village websites.

By the Sheep Fair weekend it is planned that a full draft updated Neighbourhood Plan will be on display when further discussion and comment can evolve, leading to a formal submission of the draft updated Neighbourhood Plan to the SDNPA who will then initiate formal consultation, as required by Neighbourhood Plan Regulations, in October.

News from PAWS Animal Sanctuary

Almost every night of the week I receive phone calls about injured birds, those stuck in nets on roofs, baby seagulls falling off roofs. I ask people to please try to put them in a cardboard box and bring them in. The problem is most people don't see them until they arrive home from work. They then ask me to go and pick them up because they have only just got home, or they are going out, or its inconvenient.

One man last night said his own cat had caught a bird and pulled most its feathers and all its tail feathers out. Could I go to Pulborough to pick it up, I asked him to bring it in and told him I would take it to Brent Lodge Wildlife Hospital in the morning. When I opened the door he pushed the bird, in the cardboard box into my hands and dashed off saying "I haven't had my dinner yet".

Most evenings people bring in birds, unwanted cats, rabbits or guinea-pigs just as I am about sit down to eat my dinner and hopefully watch Emmerdale. I have learned to quickly put my meal in the Microwave for safety out of the way, or it would be eaten by one of the cats by the time I came back! All our cat pens are full again with new arrivals, we also have some ducklings. A mother duck was seen walking along the road in Steyning with all her offspring following her. Later they apparently were scattered by a dog, the mother couldn't be found so we took in three of the ducklings. They are now three weeks old and have grown so big splashing in the water and eating all the time. As soon as they have feathers they will be able to join all the other rescued ducklings at The Old Gardens Animal Rescue. We have since been told that the mother duck was later reunited with four of her ducklings the very next day, after calling them all night, but unfortunately it is too late to take ours back to her now, she wouldn't recognise them.

If you have any dandelion leaves growing in your garden we would appreciate some. They are a favourite with our tortoises, rabbits and guineapigs and there seems to be a shortage this year. There are plenty of the yellow flowers everywhere but hardly any nice leaves.

An incident occurred in Findon Valley on 11 July at about 2.52pm in Parham Close. A woman in her 30s is reported to have been grabbed from behind but released when another woman appeared on the scene. The offender made off into nearby woods. The victim was shaken but not injured.

The police have said that a 32 year old man from Worthing was arrested on 14 July on suspicion of attempted kidnap.

Thefts of Quads, Trailers and Tools

In recent weeks Sussex Police have noticed a sharp rise in the number of thefts of trailers in the County, not just those parked on agricultural premises, but those parked anywhere. These items are expensive and costly to replace.

Fraudulent Sales of Vehicles and Machinery

Fraudsters have been advertising vehicles and machinery for sale on various selling platforms online. The victims, after communicating via email with the fraudster, will receive a bogus email which purports to be from an established escrow provider (a third party who will keep the payment until the buying and selling parties are both happy with the deal).

These emails are designed to persuade victims to pay upfront, via bank transfer, before visiting the seller to collect the goods. The emails also claim that the buyer (victim) has a cooling off period to reclaim the payment if they change their mind. This gives victims the false sense of security that their money is being looked after by this trustworthy third party, when in fact it is not and the money has gone straight to the fraudster.

Pet Fraud Alert

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) and Action Fraud have recently noticed a rise in the reporting of pets, and in particular puppies and kittens, being advertised for sale via popular online auction websites. The fraudsters will place an advert of the pet for sale, often claiming that the pet is currently held somewhere less accessible or overseas. Upon agreement of a sale, the suspect will usually request an advance payment by money transfer or bank transfer.

However, the pet does not materialise and the fraudster will subsequently ask for further advanced payments for courier charges, shipping fees and additional transportation costs. Even if further payments are made, the pet will still not materialise as it is likely to not exist.

Searching Through the Findon Archives by Valerie Martin

In July 1965 the Findon vicar, the Reverend R.F.G. Adams made this appeal... "Loss of the Rights of Way. With the ever increasing use of downland for the cultivation of crops more and more footpaths are disappearing.

Last year part of the path from Tolmare Farm to Myrtlegrove disappeared under the plough, and this year the path across the crown of Church Hill has also ceased to exist.

What can the Footpaths and Open Space Committee do to preserve our fast diminishing access to the Downs?

How one longs for he days when the Downs were the home of the shepherd and his flock and man could walk the springing turf in freedom and peace, unhampered by that appalling invention, barbed wire!!"

A notation for the date of 1849 caught my eye....life was not easy in the nineteenth-century rural Findon "By order of a vestry meeting, the Overseers were to take all practical means of security the apprehension of Mr...... of Findon, he having deserted his child, and left the same chargeable to the Parish of Findon".

Also in the year 1849 the Vestry was ordered to move a Findon man, his wife and four children back to Findon from Brighton. Findon it appears was their native parish and the family had become chargeable to the Overseers of the Poor at Brighthelmstone (Brighton).
