A Little Letter Of Thanks

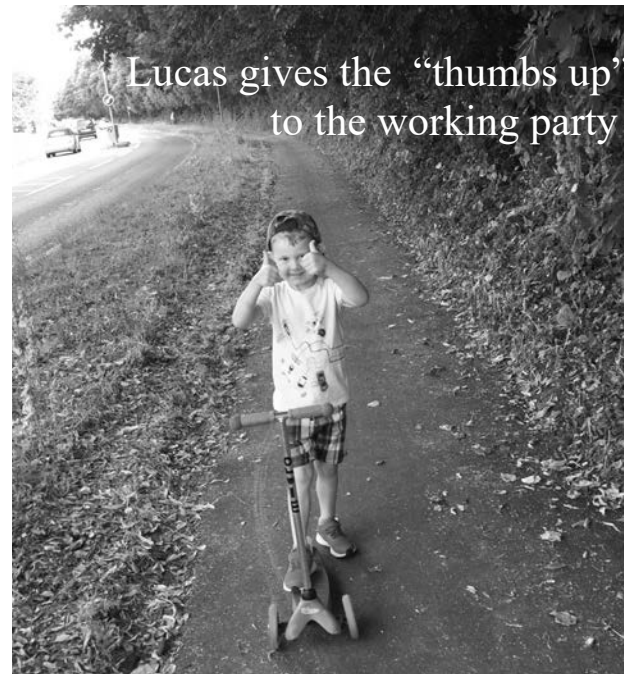

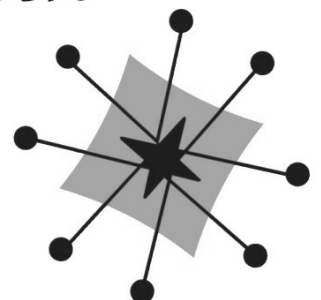

Paws Animal Sanctuary

All Dogs have to be Microchipped. This very sensible and much needed law began in April 2016. I wish it also applied to Cats. While some owners move and don't always update their new address the system is generally a good one and works very well.

We often get lost dogs in the evenings and weekends, They can be returned to their owners who have usually lost them when walking them on the downs and the dog has run off. During the day we ring Russ the dog warden who will come and pick them up. But the big headache for us is our ongoing problem with stray cats.

Almost every week someone will ring with a stray cat in their garden, or the local Vets tell us someone has taken a stray cat into their surgery - if it is not microchipped they do not have the facilities to keep them.

We currently have three stray cats from different Vets. Young cats (probably last years kittens) each one needs to be neutered. We wait 7 days and if they are not claimed we have them neutered and microchipped and find them a new home.

Our Vet offers a Best Start In Life Plan and covers the microchipping, inoculations, worm and flea treatment for 3 months and 10% off neutering, for only £49 - Tel. 01903 282 240. Also, Caroline an ex-veterinary nurse offers a local mobile microchipping service, she will come to the house to microchip your dog or cat for only £12.50 - Telephone 01903 531 404 or ring her on her mobile 07765 295 423.

The owners who ring us reporting that their cats have gone missing usually tell us they didn't get their cat microchipped

Fake Emails Are After Your Amazon Login Details!

Action Fraud have issued a warning about fake emails purporting to be from Amazon. The content of the emails contain links leading to websites designed to steal your Amazon login details.

Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information. **Never** automatically click on a link in an unexpected email or text.

Fraud

Police are again reminding West Sussex residents to stay on the alert for bogus phone calls and visitors. Five cases were recorded within four days during July.

In each case residents have received phone calls from someone saying that there were problems with their credit or

debit card accounts, and that they needed to supply their PIN and other card details over the phone, and hand the card or cards to a courier who would arrive at the door.

PC Bernadette Lawrie, the Sussex Police Financial Abuse Safeguarding Officer said; "Remember - your bank will never ask for your PIN or bank card – do not give them to anybody!"

Snippets of Past News

Valerie Martin shares some odd tales from Findon's archive of news:

Here's a a strange notice from the Findon parish church magazine dated 12th January 1889:

"The unmarried men over 16 years of age were invited to a party in the School Room. Over 60 were present, not counting the Muses, the concertina or the baby.

The Christmas decorations were very pretty. The berries were red, and the holly was very prickly. The vicar was seen for a moment with somebody's scissors. They are now lost".

That same year (1889) our area was struck by an earth tremor which made houses shake on the nearby front at Worthing. It is said that in the disturbance glass and other ornaments rattled. What a fearful few moments for the simple village folk not knowing what was happening.

This following is a good story from our District Nurse's memories of Findon. Joan Day put pen to paper in 1984.....
"One summer afternoon, a message

was left asking me to visit a stroke patient...at the address given to me. No reply from the front door, so went around to the back and let myself into the kitchen, pleasantly surprised, everything was ready for me on the table, a note saying that the wife had gone to the chemists for further supplies.

Going into the small square vestibule I heard very deep breathing coming from the bedroom, so opened the door and went in. Looking down at the patient, I thought,

"I bet you are soaking wet"... and congratulated myself on bringing both pads and mackintosh.

Putting my hand between his legs to see what I had to contend with, the patient leapt up in bed and said something not very complementary. He apparently was not the patient but the lodger who was on night duty. The real patient was in the next room. I made a hasty retreat.

The next day I met the gentleman who apologised for his rude remarks, he said...

"I've been tickled in a good many places, but never there before!"

Readers' Comment

Last year I complained to the Parish Council about the state of the grass verges in the village. I thought a monthly cut had been agreed. I must have been wrong. This June and July the village has resembled a Wild West deserted town. All it needed to complete the picture was some tumbling tumbleweed! This state of affairs, apart from the look, is not fair to our contractors. They have to work twice as hard when the grass is so long. Also this mower is not designed for long grass. You need another type for haymaking.

I have seen it suggested that people cut their own verges and indeed I did just that until, like many residents, I got too old. We have a great shop and a working party for the pavements. We should be proud of our village.

There are nearly 1,000 houses in Findon and it costs £400 per cut. For just over £1.00 extra per household we could have seven cuts per year. With climate change this is needed as some years the grass is still growing in November.

An Insight into Travellers/Gypsies/Roma

Findon resident David Hutchison has been in contact with Findon News and thought "It would be be educational if Findon readers gained an insight into travellers/gypsies/Roma before they next engage with them on Nepcote Green."

His thoughts were inspired by "Stopping Places" a book by Damian Le Bas who grew up in Findon. The book featured on BBC Radio 4 'Start the Week' in June (still available to hear via the BBC iplayer radio).

Damian Le Bas was born in 1985 into a long line of Gypsies and Travellers and spent his early years in a caravan in Findon. He was raised within a network of relations (mother Delaine

Lister) who taught him how to ride and drive ponies, tractors and trucks, sing melancholy cowboy ballads and speak the thousand-year-old Romani tongue. He was awarded scholarships to study at Christ's Hospital and the University of Oxford. Between 2011 and 2015 he was the editor of Travellers' Times, Britain's only national magazine for Gypsies and Travellers.

Damian now lives and works in Kent. He returns to Sussex to see his nan, who taught him the old Romany Travellers' little-known routes and ways.

"Stopping Places" is published by Chatto & Windus and available to purchase via amazon and other retail outlets.

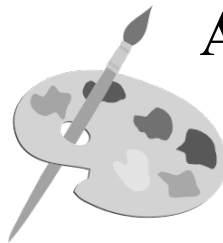

The Law And Your Pet!

The RSPCA reports that half of all UK households own a pet - equating to 20 million pets in the UK!

With so many pets around many owners may not be aware of a few laws (some originate in the 1800's) that may affect you:

Not to carry a waste bag when dog-walking

Daventry Council (Northamptonshire) impose a potential £100 fine if you walk a dog without carrying a bag to dispose of its waste. If you use a bag and have no spare you're still liable for the fine.

Make a dog bark

Unless instructed by a police officer, it is illegal to incite a dog to bark while walking along the Lancashire Coast.

Letting your pet mate with a pet from the royal house

Allowing your pet to mate with a pet of the royal house without permission was previously an executable offence! Dating back to the 1600's the offence is still punishable. To be safe when anyone Royal is around keep your pooch on a lead!

Drunk in charge of a horse or cattle

Cited in the Licensing Act 1872 it is illegal to be drunk while in charge on any highway or other public place of any carriage, horse, cattle.

To have cows on the street from 10am-7pm

The Metropolitan Streets Act of 1867 states that 'no cows may be driven down the roadway' between 10am and 7pm unless it has been approved.

To have a pigsty at the front of your house

Owning a pet Pig is becoming very popular in the UK but keeping them in your front garden is a criminal offence?

The Town Police Clauses Act 1847 says that unless hidden it is illegal to have a pigsty at the front of your house.

Not to microchip your dog

Not everyone knows this! The Microchipping of Dogs Act (England) Regulations, states that all dogs must be microchipped.

The Green Thing!

In the line at the store, the cashier told the older woman that plastic bags weren't good for the environment. The woman apologized to her and explained, "We didn't have the green thing back in my day."
