Findon Parish Council Report – June 2016

June has proved to be a fairly quiet month for your council, after a hectic May with both the AGM and Annual Parish Meeting.

Good news – We have received notification from Arun DC that our well argued proposal to assume ownership of Pond Green has been accepted by the Assets Dept of Arun DC. Although it may take several weeks to complete the necessary legal agreements, it does mean that we can use the green as we think fit, so long as it remains a 'public space', and more importantly we shall be able to maintain it in far better state than Arun DC are able to.

An important meeting with Rob Ainslie, Development Manager of SDNPA Planning Directorate, took place on June 16th. Mr Ainslie was given a tour of the village by Councillors Del Henty, Karen Roberts and Melissa Oligario,

particularly of those sites where planning decisions had been made by SDNPA against the objections of our Planning Committee. Our Chairman of Planning (Del Henty) has informed me that the

meeting has resulted in a better understanding of the thinking behind some of the decisions that SDNPA have made in the last couple of years.

The Greens Mower has given us a few problems lately, but we hope that the recent service and some work to the cooling system may have solved the problem. What is fairly certain is the fact that our budget for greens and verge mowing will exceed its annual allowance by some margin due to the very rapid rate of growth and frequent mowing that Tony Arthur has had to do in this humid and warm weather.

The new website is gradually being accessed more by villagers, the website address is - www.findonvillage.org.

The completed Neighbourhood Plan remains with the Examiner, but we expect to hear within the month whether it has met the 'Basic Conditions', or it still needs modification prior to going forward for approval by the village in yet another referendum!

Only 2 missed sessions



News from PAWS Animal Sanctuary

Little creatures continue to arrive every day, but weekends we are at our busiest.

We said we would try to keep the number of hens down to about 20 but every week people arrive and ask us to take a couple of hens when they are moving or giving up their chickens through ill health. We find it difficult to refuse any and agree to take another two. We counted them up, and now have 42 hens, 3 Quail and Mary the Turkey. But we do get lots of lovely eggs.

One Saturday recently we were presented with a minute baby hedgehog - icy cold and almost dead. We slowly warmed him up and he has survived so far being bottle fed.

On a Sunday we had calls about a baby injured fox cub, a baby blue tit, and two unwanted Guinea-pigs. Sundays we are open to the public, so we were in turmoil phoning round trying to get help, we phoned all the numbers we have for fox rescue but no one was available to help. The agitated man with Guinea-pigs wanted them picked up straight away because he didn't have a car and the Guinea-pigs needed their nails cut. We were then presented with a baby starling

someone's cat had brought in. The Guinea-pigs were only five minutes away so Sheila took care of the visitors while I collected the Guinea-pigs - they are five years old and had the longest nails we have ever seen curling round twice into their feet, and were so difficult to cut. We also had another two female Guinea-pigs arrive that turned out to be a male and female - both in together, so although we split them up we won't be surprised if we soon have more! We were asked to take in six baby Guinea-pigs from an elderly couple. They had been given two Guinea-pigs and thought they were female! The six babies we took were they're offspring!

With all our own animals to feed we cannot feed baby birds every few hours, so any baby birds are taken to Brent Lodge Wildlife Hospital,in Sidlesham. This is 30 miles away and takes at least 90 minutes. Luckily, Brent Lodge never close so we take it in turns to take them over.

A stray cat was brought to us from Waterlooville. It was in a pitiful condition; thin, filthy and with his mouth bleeding. we got an emergency appointment at the Vets and rushed him in. Although he purred all the way he must have been suffering for a long time as he had a huge tumour under his tongue and the Vet said it was kinder to put him to sleep as nothing could be done. So sad.

We rely greatly on donations to pay our Vet bills and other expenses. Our grateful thanks to Terry Kendrick who recently shared his winnings with us from the Village House bonus ball draw.

A Gardener's View

Italy has arrived at the top of stable lane.

Over the past 6 months I have been working on transforming a large back garden that was nothing but lawn and weeds with a big west facing slope down to a lower level of much the same, into an instant Mediterranean garden. Large mature olive trees, herb parterre framed in lavender, back drops of Italian Cypress trees and grape vine arches plus much much more.

The process has been amazing but challenging. The clients brief was for an instant garden so that means planting lots of trees and shrubs and very BIG ones. Some of the plants we have planted came in three hundred litre pot sizes. To put it into perspective your average garden centre perennial or shrubs are in two or five litre pots. We had to use a digger just to move the large olive tree into position let alone plant it! To make matters worse the soil is very shallow chalk so digging just for small plants was quite a challenge. The garden is at the end of the first stage of planting now. As it is not a good idea to be planting any large shrubs of trees in the middle of summer as the dry weather can be fatal if you're not on the mark with your watering.

The garden is very much an instant garden but by no means is it low maintenance. Every plant has been pruned and trimmed to fit in with the architectural flow. The Italian cypress trees will need trimming at the very least 4 times a year with a few snips here and there whenever a branch strays. The brilliant thing about being a professional gardener is that I get to work in and create gardens that I wouldn't have myself.

Our own sensory garden has been well documented, but my front garden is about twice the size and is actually used as our main family garden is almost completely dedicated to vegetables and fruits, cottage garden planting and roaming chickens. It is a million miles away from the formal Italian garden I have been creating. When gardening you can express yourself how you want, and do what you want.

July is with us and I will be spending most my time with a hose pipe making sure my clients plants don't die... No pressure!



Veterinary Advice

You can teach old dogs new tricks!

In this article I would like to give some tips into caring for the older dog so that quality of life can be maintained for as long as possible.

Life expectancy in dogs ranges from breed to breed and surprisingly; we should start to manage the aging process in our dogs earlier than we once thought. As a rule of thumb,the larger the breed the faster they age - therefore small to medium breed dogs should start to be monitored a little more closely from the age of 7 years and giant breeds from the age of 5 years.

Tips to help care for your older dog:

Respect by all members of the family including other pets and children, do not allow them to bother your older dog.

If your dogs sight and hearing is deteriorating, stick to their normal routine, do not move furniture around and keep their walks to a regular time and distance each day.

Regular exercise is important to maintain bone strength and muscle tone. If your dog has a locomotive problem such as arthritis, degenerative joint disease or just difficulty in standing up, you may have to adjust any exercise routine. Speak to the vet who will advise you on supplements and alternative treatments (such as hydrotherapy) that can help.

Be understanding if your dog fails to respond to you, hear you, or have little accidents.

Keep dog bedding comfortable or warm. If they are used to being kennelled outside on hard concrete surfaces, consider bringing them indoors on softer bedding to reduce the risk of developing sores, or hard callous on their joints such as elbows or hocks. These can become extremely painful or ulcerated.

Memory foam beds can be an excellent idea for older pets with arthritis (www.petzedz.co.uk have a great range)

Keep your dog clean and groomed more regularly, as they may have difficulties in grooming themselves .Dog nails should be trimmed short, and you may have to have them clipped more regularly. Regular nurse clinics are available for nail clips

Measures to support older dogs:

Take your dog for a regular check up at the Veterinary Practice - at least twice a year - to identify any signs of disease or 'wear and tear'.


A dog's immune response starts to decline in later years, so do keep vaccinations up to date. Vaccinations in elder dogs are just as important as earlier on in their lives.

Regular teeth cleaning to help prevent against bad breath and dental disease Nutrition plays a vital part of the process of preventative health and commercially produced foods contain more than the adequate levels of all of the essential nutrients needed by normal dogs. Older dog, on the other hand would benefit from a diet with reduced levels of protein, calcium, phosphorus and sodium. This type of diet may be helpful in preventing the onset of clinical diseases common in older pets. Keep a close eye on your dogs weight. As dogs grow older they are more prone to weight gain due to a reduction in exercise and their ability to metabolise energy. Our veterinary nurses are always happy to advise you on the correct food at any stage of your dog's life and help with weight loss programs.

Over the past few months there have been some dogs in the surgery who - as lovely as they may be - are in need of some extra help with their behaviour. Behavioural problems in dogs can be really difficult to diagnose in the surgery as the animals behave differently than they do at home or out on walks, and often a longer time is needed to evaluate any behavioural issues Behavioural problems in dogs may include being shy around people or other dogs, disobedience on walks, and aggression. If you are concerned about your dog or would like advice I would thoroughly recommend speaking to Emma Aguado at Train My Dog (www.trainmydogsussex.co.uk)- Emma provides both group sessions and personalised one to one appointments and the clients I have sent there have all responded really well!

Findon Bypass

A Reflection by Valerie Martin

The routing of the Findon bypass was to take traffic around the narrow roads and avoid the village centre. During construction I understand that many wellknown Findon features vanished for ever in the name of progress.

Findon Well was located at North End and the picture [top right] was taken



c.1904. Having no stream, river or spring in the vicinity the inhabitants had to dig for water. This was a complex and time-consuming business and undertaken by men employed as "well sinkers". The wells they dug ranged from basic stone-lined with wooden lids to those of a more complicated design. A notable feature of wells sank in the 1800s were the "well-heads" containing the winding gear....such as at North End. In a letter John Ranger told me that when the council were repairing the top of the old well he went and had a look down. "It was about 6 feet in diameter and water could be seen in the gloom about 50 feet below".

During the construction of the bypass, the well was filled in by the West Sussex County Council and a manhole cover (on the northbound carriageway of the A24 [opposite the North End junction]) is now the only reminder of the North End Well.



Long gone are Orchard Croft Cottages (pictured left c. 1910). These properties once stood on the west side of the main road at the entrance to Findon from the Worthing direction. The Cottages were demolished to make way for the bypass as work commenced in 1938 and continued into 1939 when the bypass officially opened.

The original old Black Horse pub in the High Street was demolished, along with six cottages, in readiness for the intended bypass. The photograph [*below*] is the earliest photograph I have of the Black Horse Pond. Taken in 1902 it depicts the Findon postman (1902 until 1920), Fred Smith. This pond was diverted from its

course and is now at the west side of the A24 - a shadow of its former self.

There was a 10 mph speed limited through the village until the bypass was built and the policeman of the time - PC Morris - kept a strict watch on this. How we all wish he was around today. ►



In November 2002, John Linfield of Horsham (one time a resident of Findon) wrote to me, "....the Findon by-pass was started at the Black Horse in 1938, and all concrete was mixed by hand there, and transported in skips on rails, to the area being worked. It was mainly Irish navvies that did the work. The grader driver was Russian, and worked for 18 hrs a day, 7 days a week."

As an extension to the Findon churchyard, the cemetery was also created along with the bypass.

When construction was complete trees and hedgerows were planted beside the bypass. The trees were only some 2½ ft in height and the hawthorn hedge mere striplings at 1½ ft tall. Along the central reservation shrubs were planted and the first tree to go in at the School Hill




roundabout was a Holly. The planting was to prevent dazzle from headlights of approaching cars. Ideas changed about this since I have lived in Findon and most of the trees have now been culled.

The picture above is a watercolour by Findon Artist Charles William Taylor (1878-1960). The painting depicts the new bypass, looking south in the 1940s, with Cissbury Ring in the background.
