Arun District Council (ADC) Cracks down on Litter and Dog Fouling

Under a new scheme anyone caught dropping litter or not picking up after their dog in the district will face an on-the-spot-fine.

Following recommendation by the ADC Environment and Leisure Working Group, contractors have started work in response to the complaints that ADC receives regarding littering and dog fouling. The officers will be targeting areas where ADC have identified issues with a view to undertaking enforcement as part of an initiative to improve the streets and make Arun a nicer place.

The service is a one year trial and comes at no cost to ADC. ADC will not generate any revenue from the scheme. The objective is to achieve a cleaner environment - identified by residents as being important.

On 16 May, 25 Fixed Penalty Notices were issued for offences. ADC anticipates these numbers will reduce

over the next few weeks as the public are educated regarding these issues and choose to dispose of litter correctly and pick up after their dogs. Officers are hopeful that cleaner areas will reflect in the way public spaces are treated.

Once the contractors have established their work in the area, ADC will be encouraging the public, agencies and towns & parishes to identify problems and work together to resolve any issues.

Please do encourage the reporting of any issues – ADC will then be able to dedicate resource to the area's most requiring it. Issues can be reported via the ADC website

Findon Parish Council Annual Report for 2016/17

A busy start to the year in April with the launch of the Village Community Website (by Richard Bell) and the newly formed TEP (Traffic, Environment & People) Group starting to make some real progress.

Cllr. Del Henty supervised the recruitment and efforts of the Community Work parties who gradually cleared the 'jungle' behind the Pre-School on the Glebe Land early in the year, and shortly thereafter FPC paid for extensive repairs to the rear and side walls of the pre-school.

In May we saw the erection of a new noticeboard for Nepcote Green, donated by the family of Johannes and Maureen Tinner, both of whom had died in the previous few months. This notice-board is available for any village organisation wishing to advertise its future functions. In June we agreed the legal ownership transfer of Pond Green from Arun DC to Findon Parish Council. The title to Pond Green has still not been concluded due to several legal hurdles that have not yet been passed. In spite of that the Findon Volunteers run by Cllrs Carr and Henty have carried out the work to trim the hedges and ground to make the green more usable for villagers.

The Sheep Fair on September 10th was blighted by rain, which cut the normal attendance down to about 60% of the 'norm'.

Nevertheless an excess of £2000 was made, and grants were distributed to the Pre-School and the Governors Fund for St.John's

Primary School. The Sheep Fair Committee are always prepared to consider grant applications from village organisations following each year's Fair (profits permitting!), with preference being given to the youth of the village.

The TEP group organised a speed and parking survey on all the key routes into and out of the village, this has now resulted in an agreement by WSCC Highways to reduce the speed in the centre of the village to 20mph, beginning next January 2018. Later in September the village post office and shop was put on the market by Dave & Gayle Stewart, but as yet there seems to have been little interest from potential buyers.



In October the Village Pre-School started a concerted effort to raise enough money for a new building, FPC having obtained a grant for £16,500 from a special fund being wound up by Arun DC. Later in October the TEP group got confirmation that the village would get a grant of £60,000 from WSCC Highways towards the remodelling of the centre of the village, the introduction of a 20mph limit, and increasing the pavement width up School Hill for the safety and benefit of children and mums going to the school.

November saw the long-awaited Neighbourhood Plan Referendum take place, strangely in the Black Horse. 94.5% of those voting approved the adoption of the plan, which was then 'made' following a meeting of the Planning Committee of the SDNPA on December 8th. More recently there has been a concerted effort by some villagers to have the Neighbourhood Plan amended in the light of opposition to the proposed site allocations by SDNPA.

Later in November we all saw the Christmas Lights go up, and the village was once again grateful for the efforts of Corinne Ball and Cllr.Jan Mackerell, together with many helpers. Each year more lights are bought, either with grants from the Parish Council or indeed the Sheep Fair Committee.

A second grant application for £24000 was made by the council to the Operation Watershed fund from WSCC in December, and this was approved in its entirety, and will be carried out by Edburtons in June/July 2017. The work will involve drainage improvements to the edge of Nepcote Green and the bottom of Stable Lane to prevent water from running into the village square.

Sadly we lost 3 councillors in the last year, Dave Young resigned in July, Melissa Oligario in September and after a rather short stay Simon Moore left us in March. Fortunately John Barnett joined us in December and Sean Smith has also been appointed since the new council year started, bringing us back to full complement again. This is also an appropriate moment to acknowledge the continued efforts and excellence of our Parish Clerk Fiona Macleod, who continues to serve the village so well, as well as all those councillors who give so much of their time and expertise to keep the village alive and well.

Due to the need for someone to chair the AGM, and to give all councillors another opportunity to consider the future, I agreed to stand again as Chairman for the period up to, but not including, the next FPC meeting on June 26th. My resignation will take effect on June 25th.

At the June meeting we must all hope that a new Chairman and Vice-Chairman will be prepared to be proposed and elected for the year ending at the next AGM in May 2018. Should no Chair or Vice-Chair be willing

to stand, then the Parish Council faces a difficult future, with no one to work with our excellent Parish Clerk, or attend County meetings, as well as liaise with SALC (Sussex Association of Local Councils), SDNPA and WSCC.

I fully intend to continue as a councillor until 2019, when I will have served for 20 years as Chairman of the Finance Committee, as well as Vice-Chair to our last Chairman, the much missed Len Prior. I have thoroughly enjoyed leading the council during my tenure, in spite of several difficult years when the village was invaded by the county's scourge of travellers, who even today are still a threat to the village as the summer arrives!

TEP update (Traffic Environment People)

Findon News thought you may be interested in to know the latest developments arising from the work of the TEP (Traffic Environment and People) Parish Council sub Committee.
Last month Cllrs Karen Roberts, John Havenhand, Deborah Urquart and adviser and planning consultant David Hutchison, met with members of the Highways Department from West Sussex County Council. Following that meeting approval has been given for:

Gateways at the four entrances to the village with 20 mph signs on them. (The Nepcote junction with A24 will not have a Gateway but there will be a 20mph sign)

Visually contrasting "imprinted" pedestrian surfacing around the corner of School Hill and the Gun to help improve the safety of pedestrians. The narrowest part of the "imprinted" surface will be 1.1 metres. (It could not be made any wider as the road is two way on School Hill). There may also be a similar imprinted flush pavement outside of the Village House.

Removal of the centre line in the Square. (The longer term aim of the TEP group is to make the Square visually appear as "shared space" helping to improve safety for pedestrians and alter the perception of drivers that pedestrians should get out of the way!).

Yellow lines at the top on the corner of

School Hill as visibility is poor when restricted by parked cars on the corner.

The work, which is to be funded from the West Sussex County Council Highways budget, is due to start in January 2018.

Cllr John Havenhand (Chairman of TEP) noted that progress may appear to be slow but the Parish Council were pushing things forward as quickly as they possibly could. The next stage was to try to improve car parking and establish information points for visitors to the South Downs. The glebe land at the rear of the Village Hall had already been identified as a possibility for parking and if this could be funded it would also help relieve parking on the High St. In the longer term the Square also needed resurfacing and there were numerous suggestions for visual enhancement. He also hoped that a pedestrian footpath could eventually be established on the west side of the High Street linking the Village Hall and the Square - this would not meet the approval of the Highways department unless car parking on the east side of the High Street (opposite the proposed footpath) could be relocated. Otherwise the road is too narrow.



A Gardener's View

The summer solstice falls on June 21st and we can all celebrate the longest day by gardening late into the night. I've long had a love for folklore, myths and legends (especially that of England and the south downs), but its only recently that I've began to explore this fascination of folklore into the world of horticulture! It's been absolutely fascinating! From how to keep witches at bay by nailing the herb Dill to your front door -"trefoil, vervain, johns wort, dill, that hindereth witches of their will..." - to more proven practices such as planting in the right moon cycle for better healthy crops.

Moon gardening is something I've been practicing on our no dig vegetable garden. It's definitely something that I will continue to explore; it's simply sowing, planting and harvesting at the right times - no you don't have to do it at night!

The old ways of gardening I seem to be drawn to. With fewer people having a general understanding of plant husbandry and the knowledge of growing, it's unfortunate that these ways will be the first to be forgotten in the 'modern' age.

But If your not planning to keep witches from knocking or moon dancing around

the garden, here are some other jobs to be getting on with in the jolly month of June:

Vegetable Garden

Pinch out any side shoots from your tomato plants and feed once the first truss is setting fruit. You can pot up the side-shoots to create new tomato plants.

Continue to earth up potato plants as they grow. If you're growing potatoes in bags simply add more compost to half way up the plant stem.

Harvest salad crops and re-sow every 2 weeks for a constant supply of tasty leaves.

Flower Garden

Towards the end of June, if your hardy Geraniums have finished flowering cut them back to encourage new foliage and flowers.

Cut back bulb foliage as soon as it has died down naturally.

Stake tall or floppy perennial plants to prevent wind damage.

As new shoots grow, tie in and train climbing plants such as honeysuckle and clematis to their supports.

Have a lovely solstice and happy gardening

The safespacesussex.org.uk site, developed by the Office of the Police & Crime Commissioner for Sussex, can also help to demystify the process for people when they may be at their most vulnerable, offering information about different types of crime as well as details of what happens at each stage of the criminal justice system.

The site was built in close consultation with local services to meet victims' needs, whatever stage they have reached in their recovery. Whether you've reported it to the police or not, Safe:Space Sussex can provide a secure environment where people who may be feeling unsafe can find out what local help and support is available to them.

Sussex PCC Katy Bourne, who is responsible for commissioning services for victims of crime in the county, says: "Since it was launched almost 18 months ago, this website has become a

trusted, go-to place for anyone who needs advice.

"You can either type your postcode into the site's search facility to find out more about support available locally or you can select a specific crime type – such as hate crime, stalking or anti-social behaviour – and visit a page featuring frequently asked questions as well as live links and contact details for support groups.

"It really doesn't matter whether you have reported a crime to the police or if an offence has happened in the past, you can still find help and support at the click of a button."

Crime Report May 2017

Following the ransomware cyber attack in May which affected the NHS and other organisations globally, the City of London Police's National Fraud Intelligence Bureau has issued an alert urging both individuals and businesses to follow protection advice.
For Businesses the National Cyber Security Centre's technical guidance includes specific software patches to use that will prevent uninfected computers on your network from becoming infected with the "WannaCry" Ransomware: www.ncsc.gov.uk and search for ransomware.

Key Protect advice is to install system and application updates; Install antivirus software and keep it updated; create regular backups of your files to a external device (hard drive/memory stick) - do not leave this connected to your computer as any infection could spread to that too; only install apps from official app stores such as Google's Play Store, or Apple's App Store; do not disable any of the default security features of your device.

Be warned that fraudsters may exploit this high profile incident and use it as part of phishing/smishing campaigns. Sussex Police urge people to be cautious if they receive any unsolicited communications. An email address can be spoofed. Don't open attachments or click on the links within any unsolicited emails you receive, and never respond to emails that ask for your personal or financial details.

The sender's name and number in a text message can be spoofed, so even if the message appears to be from an organisation you know you should still

exercise caution, particularly if the texts are asking you to click on a link or call a number.

'DVLA vehicle tax' text messages:

Police are warning residents not to be taken in by cold callers or text messages suggesting they are due a DVLA vehicle tax refund. A Worthing resident recently reported such an incident claiming he was owed a DVLA vehicle tax refund. The bogus link site was to an equally bogus UK Gov looking site asking for bank details to refund money direct. This resident was wise and the attempt was unsuccessful. Police are aware that that there have been some similar reports elsewhere in the county.

Never disclose your personal or financial details during a cold call, and remember that the police and banks will not ring you and ask you to verify your PIN, ask you to withdraw your cash, or transfer money to another "safe" account.

If you have been affected by this or any other fraud, report it to Action Fraud by calling 0300 123 2040, or visit www.actionfraud.police.uk.

You can **report other crime** and incidents such as anti-social behaviour and vandalism by **ringing the 101** telephone number or online at www.sussex.police.uk/reportonline. If you see any people acting suspiciously and you believe a crime is in progress or about to occur call 999.

Just as we had given up on the owner ever coming back she phoned to say she now works and lives in Devon and was as surprised as we were to hear her cat had given birth. Another lady paying £50 a night in a B&B asked us to look after her cat for two weeks as the house she was waiting to move into was having a new kitchen and bathroom fitted. She said the builders were slow and never there! Her poor cat is still here, and so fed up!
