From the Rectory


Sometimes our children can surprise and often delight us. Sometimes they can really put you on the spot too! A couple of weeks ago, 4 year old Romilly came up to me at the back of the church at the end of the Service and asked me how she could give God a hug. How to answer that?! Thinking on my feet, I asked her who else she might hug. Her answer - Mum, Dad; why? "Because I love them." We talked about how God had made our world and how everything we loved was part of him (see Genesis chapter 1; "and He saw that it was good") and Romilly seemed happy to go away and hug anything she loved as a symbol of her love for God who created it. It makes you think, doesn't it? Our children see things so much more clearly than we do. No wonder Jesus taught that we must become like little children, that 'the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these' (Mark 10:11-16) So often, we complicate issues, bringing along our own 'baggage' and acquired prejudice (even if unconsciously) instead of simply seeing what is there in front of us and accepting it as it is. The children were drawn to Jesus because they loved him; the disciples tried to stop them, maybe for the best of reasons, knowing their Master was tired perhaps, but this gave Jesus the opportunity to teach that important lesson about receiving the Kingdom of God (in his teaching) with the trust and acceptance of a little child. Thank you, Romilly, for reminding me also once more of the importance of the simple things in life! Remember, a hug

is a great gift; one size fits all!

Those of you who came along to the Bernardi Music Group Concert organised by the Friends of St John the Baptist Church, Findon on September 21st will, like me, have been treated to an exceptional evening of wonderful music and classy refreshments, with pre-concert wine and fantastic canapés (made from locally sourced ingredients by Gay Hibbs, Ann Hollyhomes and their helpers) served in Findon Place, thanks to the generous hospitality of Dominic and Sarah and a glass of local Nyetimber during the concert interval. How wonderful to experience a concert of this calibre locally! Volunteer Tree Warden needed for Findon

Findon Parish Council is seeking to appoint a new Volunteer Tree Warden. As an appointed Warden you would be playing an active role in conserving and enhancing the local trees and wooded areas within the Parish.

You would be able to monitor and survey trees in the local area; gathering and recording information about their growth, general health and needs.

As a Volunteer Tree Warden you would be responsible for notifying the Parish Council of 'problem areas' where tree maintenance works are required or where there are signs of disease, as well as ensuring Tree Preservation Orders are complied with and looking at future projects such as identifying

sparse areas where planting could be considered.

You don't need to be a tree expert, but you do need to be enthusiastic and keen to conserve our trees and wooded areas.

The Tree Warden scheme is supported by West Sussex County Council and other organisations who will keep you informed throughout the year on training sessions and information updates that will help you in your role.



He never complains despite sometimes being called out at short notice to solve a problem.

He helps at fund raising events in Clapham and Patching village hall and other venues where he provides sympathetic lighting plus a sound system for music and commentary. He is always the last to leave and lock up after putting all the equipment away. His lighting and acoustic talents also enrich fundraising concerts and special services in the churches. John's home is beautifully lit at Christmas. Until recently he has further delighted local people when he has climbed his ladder each year, to put Christmas lights on the fir tree in the centre of Patching. This has been increasingly difficult as the tree has grown, and alas is now too tall.

John is busy in the summer too. He takes responsibility for mowing the churchyard grass at Patching, taking particular care when there is a wedding, ensuring the grounds are tidy and the wedding party can easily access the churchyard for photographs.



From the Bishop of Guildford

A Christian poet once wrote, "History repeats itself; it has to , no-one listens!" These are words we do well to remember in our current political climate, especially as we remember the 100th anniversary of the end of WWI this month. Looking back on the political context that led to war it is striking how much our culture has changed. A lot of the warlike rhetoric and posturing; the appeal to patriotism; and the sense of our individual identities being tied up with national ones seems strange and dated. At the time, these attitudes combined with the arrogance of empire were a toxic combination that led to the horrific conflict with the loss of so many lives. However, elements of these attitudes remain. We always have a preference for our own tribe . In the current brexit debate there are rational arguments on both sides, but the xenophobia that has been unearthed is deeply troubling.

Christians are instructed to pray for our political leaders and to live in peace where we can, but one of the things that got the early Christians into trouble was their political subversion. Christian religious practices declared that Caeser wasn't Lord; Jesus was. That sort of talk could (and did) get you killed. The personal security that sustained this was a conviction that they were first and foremost citizens of heaven. In Jesus they had experienced the power of the other country break into their experience. For Christians, unlike our wider culture, this hasn't changed.

Lamb attacked by dogs on Cissbury Estate

Shortly after birth a lamb was abandoned by its mother on Cissbury Estate. Luckily Keith Manning a retired shepherd who lives on Cissbury Estate came to the rescue. The lamb was in a poor condition and needed some intensive care. After several weeks of hand rearing the lamb was adopted as a pet by Etta Wyatt and the staff on the Cissbury Estate. They named him 'Boris', and he lived peacefully in the fields at Cissbury.

'Boris' was seven months old on 15th October when Etta heard the sound of dogs attacking. She rushed out to find Boris trying to hide from two marauding dogs. Poor Boris had sustained savage wounds to his legs and neck. Etta chased the dogs off and summoned the vet to see the stricken lamb.

Once again in his short life Boris was in poor condition. Boris was unable to walk and Etta and the Estate staff took turns in caring for him. It took several days until Boris was back on his feet.

Apparently Sussex Police have been informed of the incident.

Paws Animal Sanctuary

We regularly have telephone calls from pet owners asking us to take in their unwanted animals, some for the usual reasons, we have a new baby, we are moving into a flat, (no pets allowed), someone in the family is allergic, we are going abroad. Some people move and leave cats behind, or sadly die and the poor animals are left in the garden to fend for themselves. This happened in a recent case when neighbours rang us to say there are two cats living in a garden in Lancing, their owner died recently, the cats are so frightened and won't eat.

One 17-year-old cat arrived today that had been kept in a garage without a window, they had a dog who would have killed the cat, the cat belonged to their Mother who died and they were about to have the cat put to sleep if we couldn't take it.

In many of our pens are stray cats none of which are microchipped. Some are old needing their bad teeth removed, which involves having a blood test first. Today a Dog needed an X-ray and two cats had blood tests costing £467.49!

Four cats are here after a bad fire in Worthing, three homes were badly damaged and social services told us we were their last chance as no other rescue centre could help. The last time we took in two cats when a house burned to the ground the very next day one of the cats had kittens. The owner lost everything including her mobile phone, so we had no address or phone number for her. We had all the kittens inoculated and found homes for the kittens and had the two adult cats spayed. I saw the owner in Tesco and when she saw me she put her basket down and ran out of the shop. We had the cats for over a year. One day I went out, when I returned one of our Volunteers told me, "A lady had been in and collected her two cats, it was quite alright because she had seen Stacey outside!" A thank you would have been nice!

We are dreading the fireworks; our animals and our hens get so frightened every year.

Lost Property

In alignment with police forces nationally Sussex Police will no longer record reports of lost property in police stations, in person, online, email or through 101.

The national decision was approved by the National Police Chief's Council (NPCC) after discussions between police forces and the National Police Front Counters Forum (NPFCF). Traditionally, police have accepted the responsibility of recording lost and found property, although there is no statutory duty to do so.

Chief Inspector Roy Hodder, Communications Department said: "Although lost property will no longer be recorded by police, we are accepting items of found property.

There are a range of other free services which will allow you to report if an item has gone missing.

Also it is worth noting that some items of lost property need to be reported directly to the relevant issuing authority. For example a lost passport is to be reported to

the passport agency, a driving licence to the DVLA or credit cards to the bank or financial provider. There are a few exceptions though. In cases where items which are dangerous or hazardous such as ammunition, firearms, weapons, chemicals/poisons are lost, these are to be reported to police immediately.

Where an item has a serial number such as electrical equipment, it's recommended that they are registered at www.immobilise.com which is free of charge. This will also help police identify and reunite you with your property if it was ever stolen.
