#### Pond Green and Village grass verges

Pond Green remains the responsibility of Arun District Council so far as grass cutting is concerned. FPC are pressing hard for more frequent cuts to take place. The next one is promised before the end of the month.

The cutting of the grass verges in the Village however is the responsibility of FPC and the future frequency of cuts will be reviewed subject to what the Precept will reasonably allow.

#### **Operation Watershed**

The minor road drainage scheme at the bottom of Stable Lane has already been completed. The much larger scheme along Nepcote Lane adjacent to Nepcote Green is in full swing and will last several weeks. It will mean serious traffic holdups and the intention is that access should only be for the houses north of Nepcote Green. Both schemes are subject to full grants from West Sussex County Council and the purpose of them is to try and minimise the flood risk in the centre of the Village.

#### **Working Party**

To pursue the Parish Council's aim to try and tidy up the Village a Working Party was formed by the Parish Council some 2 years ago and is made up of two Parish Councillors and several

volunteers. The Working Party continues to carry out clearance work in and around the Village every Wednesday morning. We are looking for more volunteers so anyone who is able to help please contact me .My email address is grdcarr@outlook.com.

#### South Downs National Park Authority

Local Plan Final Consultation

The Pre-Submission version of the South Downs Local Plan is open for public consultation until 21 November 2017. This will be the last opportunity for the public to comment before SDNPA submit it to the Planning Inspectorate in spring 2018. The South Downs Local Plan will, on adoption, replace more than a thousand existing local plan policies currently operating in different parts of the National Park with one set of 96 consistent policies.

People are requested to give their final comments this autumn. All comments will be passed to the Planning Inspectorate who will respond to them as part of their examination into the Local Plan.

The plan sets out to protect and enhance ecosystem services – the benefits and services provided to us by the natural environment. It also sets out the National Park Authority's duty to local communities in allocating sites for housing and commercial development. Because the SDNPA Local Plan is landscape-led these allocations are based on the landscape's capacity rather than driven by targets. Once the Pre-Submission consultation is over, the plan, together with all

responses received to the consultation, will be submitted to the Planning Inspectorate. It is likely that public hearing will be held in June/July with the hope to adopt the plan in September 2018.

Anyone who glanced through the window in recent days will be able to see that huge strides have been made in our shop refurbishment.

The Post Office has completed all the technical bits involving alarms and the server, which has allowed our contractors to plough on. Local electrician Jez has worked wonders with the jumble of cables, and Steve Baker, who recently moved to the village and happens to run a company who specialise in commercial flooring, has been very helpful in providing suitable flooring at a very competitive price. Dave the carpenter has worked wonders too and has begun building our new shelving. We hope that this will not only look attractive, respecting that our shop is such a pretty building full of period features, but also be more functional by allowing us to adjust the height and position, unlike the old

shelving. I must also make special thanks and mention to the support given by Mike Maidment which has aided the process immensely.


The new take out coffee machine has been ordered from Ferring-based Kendricks. As well as supplying machines they actually roast their own beans on site. Auds and I were treated to a tour of their tiny factory and were able to enjoy the wonderful aromas and get an appreciation of the care they put into selecting and roasting their blends. We chose a simple bean-to-cup machine which makes coffee at the touch of a button and provides hot water for tea. It also makes the all-important hot chocolate that has been so missed by the school children who catch the bus from outside The Gun. They will once again be able to grab a hot drink on cold winter mornings.



As well as being popular with the teens, the provision of hot drinks is important to many of the guests staying at establishments that don't offer a breakfast service or where the service is not early enough. So many people seemed unaware that the previous store had a hot drinks machine. Although primarily serving people passing through the village, in future I do hope that residents will also make use of the facility. There are endless special syrups on the market and we may offer delicious seasonal treats like pumpkin spiced lattes for Halloween or rum flavoured hot chocolate at Christmas.

The newspaper stall has continued operating throughout the works and is now temporarily housed in a container, kindly on loan from Clive Sadler from Southern Cranes - we owe him a huge thank-you for solving the problem of where we would trade from whilst the contractors are working.

Our Volunteer coordinator Christina Bedford has had to step down and is replaced by Julie Leitch. Julie has already been in touch with volunteers to introduce herself. Many thanks both to Christina for all her hard work so far and to Julie for picking up the role.

We are desperate for more volunteers to keep this service going and to cover

the early shifts in the shop. I know some have already stepped up to the challenge, for which we are so grateful. We understand that many villagers have children to care for, making volunteering at that time of day difficult. However, if you do think you could manage even one or two early sessions a month please do approach Auds or any of the committee, or get in touch via the Facebook page. You don't need to be a shareholder to support this important village asset. The up side of doing the first shift of the day is that you'd be finished at 9am with the rest of the day free. Volunteer shifts will be just 3 hours long and you can take on as many or as few as you think you can manage. Without volunteer support the shop won't be viable, so please do help if you can, even if you can only manage one shift a month.

It seems an age since we have had a working village shop. I hope the next news bulletin, rather than announcing an opening date, will bring news that we are open and the shop is stocked and busy. As always we are keen to hear about local suppliers and products; please let us know of any suggestions.

#### Progress on the Updated Neighbourhood Plan

Thank you to all the parishioners who took the time to come to the Consultation Day on 16th August and for ranking preferences from the eight short listed housing sites and for making comments on other sites, either on the day itself, or on-line, until the end of the month.

The response was very encouraging with more than 450 forms completed, which means that around 25% of the population of the parish and around 33% of households decided to have a say. Well done to everyone and the volunteers on the Working Group.

Local preferences for the location of new housing in and around Findon is one of the fundamental democratic opportunities available to communities who undertake a Neighbourhood Plan that includes housing site allocations.

There are of course other important planning and highways issues to now consider in more detail as well as the mitigating features associated with the allocation of housing on some of the sites.

Over the next six weeks the Working Group will be reviewing these matters with the SDNPA planners, WSCC Highways team, site owners and stakeholders. One site not included in the original ranking form has emerged from the initial consultation responses and will be reviewed by the Working Group, along with any other sites that may yet be suggested by the community

#### **200 CLUB**

The September winner of the 200 Club £25 was number 194 W Vickers

or landowners. If appropriate, this site, or sites, will be brought forward for a second consultation along with the most preferred sites from the initial consultation.

Please remember however we only need to allocate housing sites for around 30 dwellings over the next 19 years, so this is likely to involve only three or four housing site allocations in the Updated Neighbourhood Plan.

And now the summary, from most favoured to least, of the community's ranking preferences for possible housing allocations:

- 1. Former allotments at the Quadrangle (10 dwellings and allotments)
- 2. Former Fire Station (5 flats)
- 3. Paddock north of Nightingales (11 houses and flats)
- 4. Atalanta/Mayland site (6 houses and flats)
- 5. Small part of Monarchs Way field (11 houses, funding the replacement of the pre-school)
- 6. Paddock east of Pony Farm (4 houses)
- 7. Soldiers Field House and grounds (11 houses)
- 8. Paddock east of Elm Rise (15-20 houses and flats)

Once again, please remember that the ranking preferences are NOT actually housing site allocations, but they will be given significant weight when the Working Group brings forward a draft updated Neighbourhood Plan for formal consultation before the end of this year.

#### Military Honour for Clapham Resident Fitzroy Somerset

On Monday 21st August 2017, FitzRoy Somerset was presented with the Legion d'Honneur by Francois Jean, a representative of the French Ambassador, in recognition of his "acknowledged military engagement and steadfast involvement in the Liberation of France during the Second World War."

The Legion of Honour, full name National Order of the Legion of Honour, is the highest French order of merit for military and civil merits, established 1802 by Napoléon Bonaparte.

FitzRoy Somerset enlisted in the Kings Royal Rifle Corps in December 1941, and reported to Bushfield Camp, Winchester in January 1942.

He landed in France on 8th June 1944, having been

promoted to Lance Corporal by 2nd Lieut Bramall, (now Field Marshall Lord Bramall). His unit assisted the Americans at San Lo, then helped in the closure of the Falaise Gap. They then advanced to Belgium and Holland on their way to Arnhem. He was wounded on 31st October 1944 at Goyle in Holland and spent a few days in Antwerp Hospital before being repatriated to the UK. He was still in Convalescent Depot when the war ended.

#### Findon Sheep Fair 2017

Findon's Sheep Fair 2017 went off successfully despite all that the British weather could throw at us. In the lead up to the show we were lucky until the Friday afternoon when there were torrential downpours. Fortunately it had been well signalled and most of the outdoor works were complete. It didn't dampen our spirits as the forecast for Saturday was for better weather.

Having been informed that people were flying in from the USA, France and a couple coming down from London to visit a certain stall, it is evident that Findon sheep fair has a unique draw and atmosphere that people want to come and attend.

The Sheep section at the top end of the Green had 45 farms entered.
Approximately 275 sheep (of 24 different breeds) attended the show -

competition was of a high standard and the quality of the sheep shown was very pleasing to see.

After all the wet weather the sheep were well presented.

The Supreme champion of the show was a Southdown Ram owned by Hannah Turner of Reigate Surrey. The Supreme Champion for the Wool on the Hoof was Elizabeth Bicknell from Saffron Walden in Essex.

The Supreme Champion for the Young Handlers was Tilley Shelford from West Sussex - Tilley also won the Best Dressed Stock person and sheep award sponsored by Margaret Banford.

Local farms were also well represented with two owners living in Findon Valley, one from Clapham and another from Findon.



This year we had the Top Paddock Dairy sheep farm attending selling sheep related products and next year they have asked if they can demonstrate milking sheep at the show.

Our new sheep and committee member Su Pearce ran a couple of events for youngsters. First was a quiz about animals at the show - the winner was Evie Scott. There was also a naming the sheep competition and the favourite name (which had 30 votes) was "Lady Baba".



Thank you to the Judges (who came from as far away as Cornwall, Lincolnshire & Hereford), the stewards and our sponsors.

On the main Green we had 38 craft stalls in

the Marquee & 89 on the field in addition to the Harris Brothers Fun Fair. All of the caterers were busy throughout the day and the car parks were nearing capacity at times. We had closed the top car park due the weather the prior day but had to call it into operation when the traffic became busy around lunchtime. Once again the 1st Findon Valley Scouts helped us by managing the car parking - the scouts benefit by receiving 50% of the car park takings which is used to fund their operational costs and purchase of equipment.

The Village Church occupied the refreshment area adjacent to our site office and remained busy all day. Hopefully they had a successful day which helped their funds.



Our thanks go to Findon Parish Council's Open Spaces volunteer team who helped in trimming back verges and hedges, and to WSCC Highways for cutting the central reservation of the A24 bypass, making it easier and safer to cross the carriageway.

And the biggest thanks go to our volunteers. Having 105 volunteers helping us this year was a tremendous help - without them we couldn't put the show on. That said, we always welcome new volunteers! The show may only be on Saturday but the setup and breakdown now spans five days and is a commitment that falls upon a few. #### News from PAWS Animal Sanctuary

On Sundays we are open to the public. If we didn't the animals would be here for months and we are always very busy with people looking around searching for a new cat, dog, rabbit or Guinea-pig.

We have a waiting list book for anyone looking for a pet and regularly receive phone calls and emails from owners asking us to take their cat, dog, rabbit or Guinea-pig. You would think having the book would be a sensible solution. All we would have to do is ring the person waiting to hear from us and hopefully the poor unwanted animal would get a new home. Wrong! With dogs that's when many of our problems begin. We explain that some of the dogs are neglected, from bad owners who have never taken them for a walk, or brushed them.

People ask for a particular animal but we then have problems if they are not what they expected. One example recently was a man who could no longer keep his little Shih Tzu. She arrived scruffy with a skin problem. We had two prospective owners awaiting a small dog so we bathed, groomed had her nails cut, treated her for fleas and worms. The dog was very friendly, but understandingly scared - licking her lips all the time and continually drinking, meaning she was worried. She only stayed overnight at the first home because she is bigger than the lady wanted, she liked her but she was too heavy for her to pick up. The second home she left a puddle in the house! Because she is drinking she keeps needing to go out, so after being advised to keep her in the kitchen and put newspaper down until she settles in hopefully she will be able to Stay. Of course it is not the dog's fault in any way. Thankfully we have another home waiting if she is returned.

We also have an lady owner going into a nursing home. She too has a Shih Tzu and cannot find a rescue who will take him in, so he's coming to PAWS.

A pregnant mother said she couldn't cope with her year old Cavalier x poodle and all the rescues in her area are full. Hopefully we will be able to find her a nice home. Luckily we have backup from a lovely Kennels who will take her until a home can be found. We already have five elderly resident dogs who have medical problems who will stay.

#### OAP's for OAP's?

We know Britain has an ageing population. It doesn't just apply to humans, however, as Worthing Cat Welfare Trust (WCWT) are well aware.

"With a feline head count around 8 million the number of British pussy cats needing re-homing is booming like the national debt", says Jackie Riddles at WCWT. Sadly, it is often the older animals, which are hardest to place.

Kittens are adorable, but with life expectancy up to 18 years, youngsters represent a long-term commitment. Fine for young families, but possibly daunting for an older person, as Jackie points out, "A neighbour had been looking for a pet to replace her recently lamented 17-year old and was offered a gorgeous kitten. On reflection though, Kitty has a life expectancy longer than her potential owner and the thought of giving up a much-loved friend in the future put her off."

That's why WCWT are re-launching their OAP for OAP Scheme (Old Age


Puss for OAP). The idea is to match older pets to homes, where longer-term commitment may be questionable. But there is still obvious anxiety about giving up a dear companion - no matter what age - if your domestic circumstances deteriorate.

But this can be overcome, explains Jackie, "Our re-homing scheme would place an older cat with a new owner, but the charity retains a full supporting role. Whilst the owner looks after the pet as normal, providing a loving home and food, we would guarantee to take Top Cat back if and when the owner could no longer physically manage. This could even extend to veterinary support if required. It really can be a win-win situation for owner and pet, freeing up WCWT resources to care for more of the backlog of needy cases."

Sounds a bit like leasing. If it works with cars, why not cats!



#### Crime Report

#### Be on the alert for calls from bogus police officers

Bogus phone callers have stolen more than £20,000 from three residents in West Sussex by pretending to be police officers and getting them to hand over money to couriers at the door.

PC John Blight said: "The victims were deceived by different ruses into handing over large sums of cash. "The police would never contact anyone and ask them to withdraw or hand over cash to officers. People carrying out these frauds are deliberately targeting those they think are vulnerable, so please look out for your friends, family and anyone you feel may be at risk by passing on this message. Whenever there is doubt that a telephone caller is genuine, simply hang up the phone. "If you have fallen victim to

fraud of this type, please report online or by calling us on 101, quoting Operation Signature."

#### More phone Scammers

There has also been an increase in callers purporting to be from HMRC (Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs). The caller says that the person who they are calling owes tax in the region of £3,000. The call is aggressive, threatening, urgent and sounds authentic with the suggestion of meeting at a location where the tax owed is handed over. Don't be fooled. These calls are from scammers.



Colin gave a very entertaining talk and demonstration on songs and records of times gone by which he played on his 1920's windup gramophone and welcomed us to sing or tap our toes to the music, the first record being the Charleston followed by many other songs and tunes including Valencia being the most popular song at that time and Lilli Marlene which was a great favourite in the war not only with the English soldiers but the German and American soldiers too.

Colin's main supply of records are obtained by buying job lots from Antique shops. He can still get a good supply of needles but the first ones were probably made of bamboo then sharpened to improve the quality of sound. In 1940 the technology changed and record players became electric.

It was a very enjoyable afternoon of music hall songs and music enjoyed by all and ended with some of the old 78 records which members had brought with them being played.


