From the Rectory

There's an autumnal feel to the air in the mornings and evenings now although as I write the sun is warm and the sky an unbroken blue. If 'old wives tales' are to be believed, we're in for a hard winter judging by the bounty of the hedgerows! I don't remember ever seeing such a harvest of huge blackberries before, branches are heavy with sloes and damsons, hedges sparkle scarlet with rosehips and hawthorn berries, and apples, pears and plums seem abundant too this year. Farm harvests are safely gathered in and I for one feel ready to give thanks again at our Harvest Festivals (September 24th at Patching Church and September 17th at Findon).

Harvest Season is a time for looking back with thanksgiving for what our vegetable plots, orchards and farms have yielded, also for planning ahead for the next year's crops, perhaps thinking what could be improved by a little extra compost being dug in. Maybe it is also a good time to pause and take stock of our own lives. What, over this last year, have we achieved? Could we have done something differently, or better? Here in leafy Sussex, we are so fortunate, we have all that we need and more, surrounded as we are by stunning countryside. How often do we stop to give thanks for what we have? Do we consider ways in which we might share something of what we enjoy with those who have so little? Our Findon Harvest offerings (both from the School Harvest Service and our Parish Church) are given to the Worthing Churches Homeless Project. These donations, along with others from the Worthing area, provide a much needed stock of food and

Centre and Hostels through the year. It would be wonderful if we could double the donations we sent last year! Tins or packets (make sure the food is 'in date'!) can be left at the back of the church or in the Rectory porch. Homelessness is sadly a growing problem, which can affect anyone at any time and the Worthing Centre relies totally on voluntary donations.

Looking further afield, our Diocese is linked to Sierra Leone, where mudslides have devastated lives and livelihoods. The Diocesan Harvest appeal will doubtless send extra aid to the stricken people there in addition to supporting communities across East and West Africa. Any donations would be welcome through the church here in Findon, Clapham and Patching or can be made directly online through options given on the Diocesan website

Chichester.anglican.org/appeal; thank you.

Finally I would like to thank everyone who sponsored my skydive back in July. We still don't have a final total, as there are still donations coming in, but we have raised about £2,500 including online giving, which is fantastic, and I thoroughly enjoyed it too! Why not join us for our next coffee morning in Findon Church on 16th September to look at the lovely stained glass windows which will benefit from our fundraising!

Plans are well in advance with the sheep fair and sheep entries have been good again this year with a larger number from Essex and Kent than in previous years. Nine new farms will be participating for the first time and again many younger people are bringing their sheep which is great news as they are the future at shows in years to come.

Every year we have new breeds that have not been at the show in the last 11 years and this year we have North Country Cheviots, and Balwen.

We again focus on wool as it is a commodity we should be using more in our daily lives. Dave Tester a local farmer at Patching will be demonstrating Shearing; we have a fleece competition judged by Sue Blacker who owns a mill for processing fleeces in Cornwall, 6 local spinners who will be pleased to answer your questions on getting started and many finished products. There will also be fleeces to buy at the fleece tent.

Judging will be starting at 9-30am due to the number of entries, the supreme Championship will be around midday, followed by Wool on the Hoof. At approx. 1.45 pm the judging of the Young handler competitions will take place. We have over 30 young handlers taking part this year in 3 age groups, 8 and under, 9 to 11, and 12 and over. At 3pm we plan to parade into the main arena when the trophies will be presented. Then come and see the Alpaca's in the sheep rings from 3.30pm.

New for 2017 is a quiz for children. As you enter the animal area, there will be a stand where each child can take a quiz paper about sheep. All the answers will be found around the sheep and animal area.

Enjoy the day and Come and see the Balwen sheep.

Update on Shop/PO

The newly painted bright red post box that stands outside our village shop serves as a symbol of things to come. Since the community became the proud owners of the building which will once again become our village shop and post office, there has been great excitement amongst just about everyone I speak to, and we all eagerly await its reopening.

Progress has been made, albeit not as much as we might have liked. I'm sure anyone who has ever undertaken any kind of building project or renovation will know that nothing is ever quite as simple or quick to do as we imagine. We are currently awaiting a visit by Post Office contractors, and until they have done vital electrical work we can't proceed very much further. One of my fellow committee members likened the Post Office to a big Victorian Machine, incredibly well put together, solid and reliable but not swift to move or react.

However the delays have given the interim management team some time to turn their attention to projects other than the renovation. As well as facilitating the repainting of the aforementioned post box, Auds, the new manager, has also overseen the opening of the newspaper stall. While the stall had been selling papers and some magazines from 7am-10am every day, this has now been changed to 7am-11am. In spite of Smiths News' determination that the village shop should only receive 8 copies of the Telegraph, the stall has been really well received and supported by residents. Huge thanks go to Liz and Julian for working unpaid so that the stall could be possible and enabling us to take just a little step closer to things returning to normal. Also, thanks to everyone who has been so patient when we have not

been sent the correct number of papers. Thankfully I now believe that this has been rectified.

Amongst other achievements, Helen, our Treasurer, has found a bank that is happy to recognise our company status as a mutual benefit society - this was no small task. We now also have a full complement of contractors able to help us with the refit, subject to the Post Office doing their bit, so you can expect to see workmen on site regularly from now on.

Earlier in August we had the chance to meet some of the wonderful volunteers at our first volunteer meeting in the village hall. It was great to hear such enthusiasm and to get feedback on visions for the shop and what people would like see sold. It was heartening that so many of the suggestions were in line with our initial thoughts and hopes. Lots of people were keen to see the return of a good selection of greetings cards, artisan bread, nice deli type produce and as well as a good range of locally produced goods in alongside all the standard basics. One of our favourite committee tasks has been testing out some of this local produce. We were very excited to receive some samples from Angmering-based producer Alison Driver, who owns and runs 'Loaded Loaves'. These ingenious little bread loaves look very simple from the outside but once cut open, reveal a hidden surprise. Alison will be coming to the Findon Sheep Fair and so I hope you'll have the chance to try them for yourself.

Fingers crossed, by next month's newsletter, we will have a date in sight for our grand opening. In the meantime, the management committee are always glad to receive suggestions and ideas from the community. Please email findoncommunityshop@gmail.com with your your thoughts.



Chairman's Letter August 2017

We have had another busy year at the hall. In the spring we hosted a Coffee Morning for residents to view the plans for the proposed extension, and to meet the Architect.

The extension will replace the existing meeting room to the rear of the existing hall, with a small galley kitchen, toilets, and store for existing village groups, with level access for wheelchair users to all areas. We await planning decision from SDNP.

In March we welcomed Findon's own branch of 'Men in Sheds', fourteen residents signed up to join. This group have already re-furbished some garden furniture for the Hall, and have taken some commissions for work. They meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10am.

Popular events include the Lamb to Loom Coffee Morning, Film Nights which run from September to March each year, Christmas Fairs, and of course the Findon Fun Dog Show which is in its third year.

Our Mexican Feast & Quiz was a sell out in March, so look out for the posters advertising The German Beer Fest & Quiz scheduled for 28th October.

Sadly we heard the news that the Cissbury Players have dissolved their organisation as they were no longer financially viable. Their dwindling numbers meant that they were unable to form a cast for their July performance. This amateur dramatic group, under the strong leadership of Mrs Ann Burfoot for over 30 years, produced 3 productions annually. Earlier this year Mr & Mrs Burfoot left the Village, and I am sure they were much missed by the group. Many of the residents of Findon have fond memories of past productions.

We have their old shed to demolish, with it's contents of old scenery, and props. I have organised a working party for Sunday 3rd September starting 10am. If anyone would like to volunteer to help with this clear up, please just turn up on the day.

Film Nights resume on 22nd Sept with "Sully". Look out for posters.

I think it is so sad when a new baby arrives and then the cat has to go. We have three cats in that have all come in for the same reason. One is only a year old, the owners treated him like their baby called him Cuddles but when their real baby arrived said the cat was jealous of the baby so he had to go. He is so upset, crying for attention all day, he doesn't know what he has done wrong (he did wee in the pram.) Another hissed at the new baby so had to go. Another owner said it would be too risky to keep the cat in case the cat lays on the baby's face and suffocates the baby. One cat came in this week because the baby will be crawling soon so it would be unhygienic to have a litter tray in the house. It became compulsory to microchip all dogs this year, and it has made such a difference. When people bring a lost dog in to us all we have to do is put the scanner over the dog to get the number and then ring Petlog to get the name and address and phone number of the owner. If only it was the same rule for cats. We have so many calls every week from owners who have lost their cats that are not microchipped. But our biggest headache is stray cats that are not chipped. We have so many, we have to wait to see if they are claimed and after 7 days take them to the Vets to be microchipped, and neutered if they need it, and then they can be re-homed.

One young tom cat was in the Vets for three days with nowhere to go, a stray picked up in the local supermarket. The Vets said all the other rescues were full so

we were his last chance. We had him neutered last week and named him Buddy. He is so friendly and relaxed. Every one of the volunteers makes a fuss of him. It is a big problem when someone picks up a lost cat and takes it to the Vet to see if the cat is chipped. If it isn't they are told to take it back to where they found it because they cannot leave it at the Vets! People are then frantically phoning all the cat rescues, who are all full. Our cat pens are always full. Thankfully we have lots of visitors looking for cats on our open days every Sunday. From Stacev.



Findon Updated Neighbourhood Plan (Housing) Public Consultation

On Wednesday 16 August, after a small army of volunteers had delivered leaflets to the whole village, almost 200 villagers visited the Public Consultation Day in the Village Hall. On display were details of all the housing site options researched by the Updated Neighbourhood Plan Working Group: Elm Rise Paddock & Soldiers Field House (both proposed by the South Downs National Park Planning Authority), Monarch's Way field (northern part, with the Glebelands), the former fire station, land north of Nightingales, land north of The Quadrangle, Pony Farm and Atalanta/Mayland on the A24 by-pass). Visitors were invited to study each option and then rank all eight potential sites in order of preference, either on paper or electronically on tablets provided. Voting was also available on-line up until the end of August. The details of all these sites can be found on the parish council and village community websites. A summary of everyone's feedback will be published in the next Findon News.

The weather at the Findon Village Gardens Association Summer Show on 5th August reflected this summer as a whole – ranging from a cool, wet start, through warm sunshine and back to a wet finish. The vagaries of the weather did nothing to dent the enthusiasm of the entrants, visitors and volunteers though. There were over 250 entries from 36 members, ranging from asters to violas; beans to tomatoes; biscuits to Welsh cakes; handicrafts, flower arranging and photography. Audi stolen in Washington

Sussex Supermarket Shoppers Reminded to Be on Alert for Thieves

Police are reminding supermarket shoppers across Sussex to be on the alert for thieves following a recent spate of incidents in which supermarket customers, and some other shoppers,

have been watched whilst entering their PIN numbers and then have their purses and wallets stolen as they leave the store. Suspects then withdraw large amounts of cash from nearby cash machines. A group of men responsible are believed to have been successful in obtaining nearly £20,000 by targeting victims in this way - 22 such reports in Sussex since November last year. Two suspects caught on camera at Sainsburys in Worthing on 20 June are described as male of Eastern European appearance, one bald and the other with dark hair. Anyone with information should quote reference 47170066290. If you see anyone behaving suspiciously in this way, alert store security staff or dial 999.

Police are working with supermarkets to raise awareness about these incidents. Be alert and aware of strangers when shopping in large supermarkets and NEVER leave your bag or trolley unattended at any point. It appears that these men may strike up to twice a day in different towns, and then lay low for a while, so maintain awareness.

Findon Village Enhancements – Speed, Parking and the Square

Things never move quickly when you want them to. Then it all happens at once. As the Traffic, Environment and People (TEP) sub- committee of Findon Parish Council know all too well - the process of making things happen is not always time compliant and neither is money available when you need it. However, there is some good news.

As regular readers will know West Sussex County Council has agreed to introduce a 20 mph limit in the village. Similarly they will improve the corner of the Gun and School Hill with a new pedestrian strip (albeit a narrow one because of the road width). They will also erect gateways into the four main entrances to the village, complete with 20mph signs. The very top of School Hill will also have yellow lines. This work is scheduled for January 2018.

However, the TEP group have also been working on a Phase 2 development which involves a submission to South Downs National Park Authority for funding via the SDNPA Community Infrastructure Levy. This is just as well – because the SDNPA have written very recently to all Parish Councils saying that they must submit an expression of interest and project outline before 29th September if they want to be considered.

Cllr John Havenhand informs Findon News that a proposal for a Phase 2 bid to SDNPA will, as a consequence, be put to the Parish Council at the next meeting on 11th September. From the perspective of village residents the outline bid, if successful, would improve the visual attractiveness and safety of the Square via re surfacing, seating and signage and probably involve a slightly extended Conservation area. Secondly it would improve visitor parking, by using some of the land behind the village hall to accommodate about 20 additional car spaces, plus four extra spaces by Pond

Green/ Stable Lane. But most importantly it would also aim to promote Findon's heritage and gateway location to the South Downs National park for the benefit of visitors as well as residents and businesses. This would require a visitor information point/ centre incorporating guides on walking on the South Downs, the heritage and history of Findon and information about Cissbury, Chanctonbury circles and the flora and fauna on the South Downs.

John points out that because of the short notice required to submit an outline proposal there is not much time for wide consultation. However, the ideas have built on the feedback from the public meeting held over a year ago when David Hutchison (TEP group) gave a presentation which filled the Village Hall. For example, the changes to the Square are intended to introduce the concept of "Shared Space". This is an attempt, by appropriate road surfacing, to create a significant and different visual effect which will signify to motorists that this is not merely a highway with no pavements, as it is currently configured, but an area where people walking about now have priority.

Unfortunately – it seems that the TEP group's hopes to get support for a footpath from the Village Hall to the Gun have not been successful as Highways considers the road is to narrow. However, a time limited restricted parking zone may be considered in the centre of the village at a later date – if the additional car parking is made available behind the village Hall. If the Parish Council supports this outline bid at their 11th September meeting a lot more information and drawings will be available on the Council Web site. It will not be too late to amend the outline bid at that stage and, in any event, changes will be anticipated if SDNPA support any or all of the outline proposals.



The Cissbury Players

On 10th May 2017, The Cissbury Players received, without warning or prior notice, from The Findon Village Hall Trust committee, an official contract for a new storage facility at the Hall.

This lease stated that we needed to move all our scenery and props out of the large store at the rear of the hall that has been used for the past 32 years, in addition to the costume store upstairs, and move everything into one of the new garage sheds that have been built on the grass to the side of the hall, by 1st June 2017.

As residents and long time users of that hall will know, the scenery store and costume store has always been used by the societies of the hall at no cost and were always freely given on this understanding. So, to receive an official lease with a commercial rent attached with no warning came as a shock to us all.

The new storage facility was in no way suitable for our use, mainly due to its small size; with the best will in the world, we estimated that we could only get one third of our belongings secured in a safe and appropriate manner. The further financial constraint of a commercial rent was beyond our reach.

It was therefore decided, after much discussion that after over thirty years at the hall, this was no longer the place for us, which is a great shame as although we have no members left in the village, The Cissbury Players have always been a great friend to the village with stalls at the fete, the erection of Christmas decorations in the hall, the stall at The Sheep Fair as well as our three productions per year which have always been very warmly received by people in the village and beyond.

In their quest to make Findon Village Hall thrive and to turn it into the 'hub' of the community, the current committee have driven out one of their longest standing groups, with the loss of revenue from the continuous use of the hall on a weekly basis for 9 months of the year.

Anyone still interested in local drama will be pleased to know that we have been contacted by the committee at Ferring Village Hall with an open invitation to join them there, so local Am Dram still survives and the curtain will go up in Ferring on some familiar faces again in the future.

Long-established Worthing counselling charity set for growth and new look

On 11 October 2017, Worthing Counselling Centre will become the new name for Offington Counselling Service, a charity which has quietly been serving the community of Worthing for almost 35 years. The date has been chosen to tie in with Worthing Mental Health Awareness Week (WMHAW) at Offington Park Methodist Church, where Offington Counselling Service has been based since 1983. WMHAW will include launch events for Worthing Counselling Centre. The decision to change the name to Worthing Counselling Centre was taken to raise awareness of the charity and its scale.



Anna Hayward (pictured left), Head of Centre says, "Over the years, we have provided ongoing counselling for well in excess of 5,000 people, so we want to make sure that we are a visible, well-recognised point of access for local

support for emotional wellbeing," Over the years, the charity has provided weekly counselling for individuals and couples seeking support for emotional difficulties. It offers fast access counselling for those who do not want to wait and financially supported counselling if cost could be a barrier, aiming to provide support as widely as possible. "It's worth remembering that back in 1983, talking to relieve emotional distress was nowhere near as widely accepted as it is now. The formation of Offington Counselling Service as a charity to provide counselling to those who might not otherwise be able to afford it, was really quite pioneering."

Counselling is taken up by people from all walks of life. It provides the opportunity to talk and explore an individual's situation to find a way forward, with a counsellor who will listen without judging. Currently people

coming to the service range in age from 16 to 80 plus.

"People come to counselling for many reasons," says Anna. "It could be that significant life changes or events, such as bereavement, trauma or work or relationship difficulties prompt a sense of being unable to cope. Sometimes it is feelings of anger, low self-esteem or panic attacks or just simply knowing that things aren't 'right' or when even small decisions seem impossible. No two people are the same."

Currently there are 21 counsellors at the centre. The service is BACP accredited (The British Association for Counselling & Psychotherapy). BACP accredited services are high quality, professionally managed therapeutic services that have been independently assessed.

To celebrate the new identity, Worthing Counselling Centre is hosting 2 events on Wednesday 11 October at Offington Park Methodist Church, South Farm Road, Worthing BN14 7TN:
