From the Rectory

Alleluia, Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, alleluia!

This year, Easter Sunday was 31st March so as this month's magazine is circulated, the Church is celebrating the resurrection of Jesus, his coming back to life from the grave after his crucifixion. What does this mean to you? As Christians, we are the 'Alleluia people', given hope of eternal life through our faith in the promise of Jesus. That faith has the power to change lives, removing the sense of hopelessness and futility experienced by so many people at times in their lives. It really is the gift of new life!

It is spring and new life is all around us wherever we look; fresh green leaves unfurling from buds on shrubs and trees, birds busy nesting. I even saw my first butterfly this week! The mild wet weather this year has meant many flowering plants are ahead of their usual time, which may well have an effect on invertebrates, the food source for native bird species and already declining bee populations may well be affected too. Here in our villages, we are surrounded by a wealth of wildlife and nature and I hope that you, like me, are doing your best to encourage nature at this time of changing weather patterns.

Our village volunteers in Findon do such a fantastic job both in maintaining footpaths and open spaces for us all to enjoy and in litter picking weekly. I struggle to understand how people can just drop litter, whether out walking or through a car window as they drive through. How would they feel if you or I dropped our litter in their garden?! I know our Village schools do a great job encouraging our youngsters to care for their environment so perhaps the children can provide a good example to careless adults. I certainly hope so!

I had an interesting phone call today, asking me if I had any information on Nepcote Chapel. The brother of the caller had been a Trustee, along with his wife, but now sadly both have died and his sister is trying to locate the owner of the Chapel. Since she doesn't live locally, I promised to write something in Findon News, asking anyone who has any information about this neglected building to contact me through the Parish Office, then I can pass on any information to her. Ever since coming to the Village, I've wanted to know more about this Chapel myself, but all I've heard is from families at funerals whose relative attended Sunday School there as a child some 60 years ago! I really hope that somebody reading this can tell me something about it's history and ownership.

Finally, next month we will be holding our Annual Parochial Church Council meeting, where new Churchwardens will be admitted into office for the coming year. The role of a Warden is the upkeep of our lovely ancient buildings and working with the clergy to maintain public worship. Free



Findon Parish Council Report

Officially it is now spring and how joyful it is to see flowers in bloom and warmer weather once again. We have had quite enough of the rain.

This month I want to highlight the work of another volunteer group, the Litter Pickers. They are very well organised with Chess at the helm and she has worked out various routes to ensure that all areas of the village are covered. They meet on a very regular basis and can often be seen gathering litter around the village. It is worth noting that the areas which are the worse for rubbish is divided between the High Street and the lay-by on Long Furlong. That we should need a litter collecting group is bad enough as there are litter bins dotted around the village so there is no excuse. I am of the age where we were told from an early age to take rubbish home with you and put it in your own bin. It's a pity that is not adhered to nowadays.

Such is the success of the group, there is a waiting list to join. Like our other volunteers, they are a friendly bunch who share a keen desire to keep the village looking neat and tidy and litter free. As you would have seen, the work on the restoration of the pond on Nepcote Green has been completed and I hope you have been able to have a look at the restored pond. The contractors did a sterling job in clearing the site and carrying out their work especially as the only way to get to the pond was to use the road. Thank you to all those motorists who were patient whilst the contractors had to use their machinery which necessitated going back and forth and temporarily blocking the road. It is really good to see the pond restored to its original use and I am sure this will encourage birds and wildlife back to its natural habitat. The school children were also involved in laying tree branches to encourage wildlife. We are hoping to organise an official opening to mark this special event and further details will be issued once a date is known.

We have been asked by the South Downs National Park Authority to remind all dog owners to please ensure your dogs are on leads if you are planning to go onto the Downs as this is the time for spring lambs to be born.

Later this month, the Parish Council will be hosting the Annual Parish Meeting on 22 April at 7pm in the Chanctonbury Hall. This is not a Parish Council meeting but an opportunity for us to give an 'end of year' report to the village on the work that your Parish Council has undertaken during the past year. Why not come along and meet your councillors and find out the interests of local groups and organisations in the village. All are welcome and refreshments will be available. As is our usual practice, we will have a guest speaker and this year it will be Mrs Maggie Martin, whose talk will be about the work of The Cinnamon Trust. Please look out for the yellow posters around the village for more information.

Village Hall Report

Not a very active month but the additional sound absorption panels have been fitted in Nepcote and we think everyone is pleased with the improvement. We have decided to replace the makeshift curtains in Chanctonbury (which have been effective but not pretty) with similar panels and following the same methodology, fitting some, assessing the results and going further if necessary. The first extra panels in Chanctonbury will be fitted within a few weeks.

Meanwhile, we have reduced the intensity of lighting in Nepcote and would be happy to receive feedback from users. We suspect that it may be necessary to replace the units with "warm white" but user feedback would be useful.

The issues arising from the flood are ongoing, as previously reported, the claim has been accepted by our insurer but the affected area does require more time to dry before work can start.

You may have noticed that a new safety fence has been fitted alongside the kitchen side of Chanctonbury to eliminate the potential fall hazard in that area. This has been planned for some time but the final removal of the hoarding associated with the extension has made it possible to do the work. We thank Findon Parish Council for their contribution to the cost.

The level of bookings remains strong and the Monday afternoon Tea and Biscuits sessions have been just as popular as last year. They will have stopped at the end of March and restart in October. Bookings for children's birthday parties, especially with our package rate and discount for parish residents, continue to be a more significant, and still growing, part of our activities than they were in the past.

Finally, we hope Summer is coming, the rain will, perhaps, relent a little and we look forward to some events in the grounds along the same lines as the Jubilee and the Coronation - after all, we don't need too much of an excuse to have a party!



More News re: Findon Swimming Pool.

Last month we promised more news about the progress being made to achieve the opening of the Swimming Pool, hopefully in time to start swimming sessions after the school's Summer halfterm holiday. We also appealed for volunteers to advise on and help with the various processes to do with the running of public swimming sessions, but sadly we didn't receive any replies to this appeal.

As previously stated we have been fortunate in raising funds to help us achieve a swimming pool that will be working properly again after the decline in its fortunes in recent years – caused by a combination of equipment/plant failures and the setbacks that happened during and after the pandemic.

Financial contributions have come from kind residents and local organisations; we are also grateful to the WI who have made contact and have offered to help fundraise for the pool. This is all very encouraging news, however we are still a little way off reaching a point where the pool can open. Our latest tasks include trying to get the old gas boiler removed, but this is only the first step. Once that's done we will need to raise an extra £10k to fund the boiler room and Air Source Heat Pump installation and then get this fitted.

The next publicity appeal and fund raising initiative may well be via a postcard flyer delivered to all addresses in the village. We can then ask for volunteers and donations and then suggest a date for a public meeting or find out more about how individuals can help.

Last month we also talked about volunteer training and in readiness we have found someone who can conduct sessions on pool maintenance, we have also found someone who has kindly offered to do the First Aid training for swimming session supervisors.

We should be able to provide more news soon.

West Sussex County Council seeks help from local residents to combat flooding

West Sussex County Council (WSCC) is encouraging all householders and landowners, particularly those in more rural areas, to check if they have a responsibility to keep local watercourses free flowing and to help prevent vulnerable areas of the county from flooding.

If a watercourse, ditch, stream, river or culvert runs adjacent to, through or under your land or property (even if it does not fall within your property boundary as set out by your Title Deeds) then you are likely to be what is known as a "riparian owner". In short, you are responsible for the maintenance of the watercourse to ensure that water is able to flow freely into and along it, so that it doesn't pose a flood risk.

The legal responsibilities of a riparian owner are to:

- * ensure the flow of water is not obstructed or polluted
- maintain the bottom and sides of the watercourse (including managing any trees and vegetation growing on the banks)
- remove any obstructions, such as rubbish, fallen branches or garden waste

 * maintain any structures (such as rubbish screens, culverts, weirs and mill gates).

You are more likely to have a responsibility if you live in a rural area due to there not being as widespread a drainage system as in urban areas, particularly alongside roads. Rural roads are especially affected when groundwater levels are high and surface water runs off neighbouring land and property onto them. It is essential that roadside ditches in these areas are kept clear for the water to flow into before it reaches the road and causes surface flooding or even damages the road surface.

It is very stressful when I answer the phone to someone needing help. One call this week from a lady crying, she said she was in Brighton and was homeless and could I come and take her 3 year old bulldog and find a home for it. I said I would do an appeal on facebook for her. I took all the details of the dog and her phone number, but before I could ask her name her phone went dead. I tried ringing her back, but it said this number is not Recognised. Ringing it over and over just gives the same message. My telephone rang again before I could dial 1471 and trace the call.

My phone rings all hours, every time someone's cat doesn't come home, or if owners lose their dogs, they ring me. This week I had a call from a man about a lost dog then hours later a call from someone who had found a stray dog, it was too late to call the Dog Warden and eventually realised it was a different dog. I explained all stray dogs must go to Grove Lodge Vets overnight, and sorry I cannot get out of bed to pick up the dog to take it in to Grove Lodge. "But you are a Rescue, it's your job, and I haven't got a car!" I've heard that so many times!

With so many cats being reported missing, and so many stray cats being around, I am sure all the daily delivery vans cause the problems, the drivers jump out leaving their sliding doors or back doors open and the Cats jump in. Some cats find their own way back eventually. I am always being asked to come and collect a stray cat. Many are not microchipped. The new law says all Cats must be microchipped by May this year or risk a £500 fine. I feel sorry for cat owners if they own lots of cats. Luckily there is a Mobile Service that can come to the house to microchip your Cats (or dogs). Billy Bear's Mobile Pet Microchipping. £15 for Cats or Dogs. 07925 726312.

I had a call this morning from a resident in Findon Village about a baby rabbit lying in her garden. Unfortunately, I have already recently taken two adult rabbits to the vets found in the village, both suffering from myxomatosis. It's so sad.

We were asked to take two guineapigs this week because the owner is too ill to care for them, we now have a total of fifteen guineapigs. Also, a baby newt.




