From The Rectory

Autumn approaches after a busy summer with lots of Baptisms and Weddings at our churches. It is such a joy to share the happiness of families on these occasions. As the evenings begin to draw in, we need to be mindful of neighbours who may be anxious about venturing out. Please let us know via the Parish Office if you are aware of anyone who might welcome a visit from our Pastoral Team.

On 3rd September I have a young German student, Laura Schellenberg, coming to stay with me for a month, at the request of her Area Bishop, Frau Greiner. I hope many of you will meet her during her time in the Parish. She will be planning and leading an act of worship in Findon Church towards the end of her stay, on Sunday 24th September at 4pm and I hope many of you will join us for this, with refreshments afterwards. There will be signup sheets in the churches so we have an idea of numbers to cater for!

As many of you know, I have been involved with exchange visits and conferences in Bavaria for many years, and we set up a Link with a Lutheran Church in Schney nine years ago. The Minister there, Tanja Vincent, has now moved Parish but a group of people there are keen to continue the link with us. I would very much like to invite them over next year to celebrate 10 years of the Parish Link, so please speak to me or Irene Adams if you would like to be involved. Depending on how many people from Germany show an interest, we would need some families to be prepared to host, as we put up visitors in our homes.

A reciprocal visit to Schney the following year could be planned when they are

here with us. These visits are a wonderful way to build new friendships and to experience family life and worship in Europe, as well as for our young people providing experience of a different culture and a great way to develop their German language if learning it in school.

Laura will be with us for Findon Sheep Fair, which will be a great opportunity of traditional English country life for her to experience! There are a record number of farms coming this year and in addition to the sheep, I hear some camels are coming! The Friends of Findon Church will have a stall on Saturday – do support them and buy some refreshments there during the day. We will host the usual Songs of Praise with music led by the Salvation Army Band on Sunday afternoon in the marquee, enjoying fellowship over light refreshments afterwards.

There is a Worthing Deanery Confirmation Service in early November, at St Matthew's Church in Worthing and we already have 5 candidates from our Parish preparing to make their baptismal promises for themselves during the Service, which is very exciting! Bishop Ruth will be presiding and will lay hands on each candidate as she prays for God's Holy Spirit to come down on them, after which they will take Communion (the consecrated bread and wine representing the sacrifice made for us all by Jesus on the cross). Please pray for those preparing here, and in other churches in the Deanery, and if you or anyone you know would be interested in taking this next step in their Christian journey, speak to me or Colin.

St John the Baptist Primary School Clock

You may have wondered over the last couple of weeks why the School Clock is no longer chiming.

I received a communication in July 2023 from the Arun District Council (ADC) Environmental Technical Officer regarding a complaint about noise disturbance from the chimes starting at 7am each morning. The complainant had asked for the chimes to be reset to start at 9am instead.

Long standing residents will recall that in 2014, this historic village clock (one of only six working Victorian clocks in the country at that time) underwent a major renovation including the chimes at a cost of over £7k. The funds for the renovation were raised by parishioners,

community grants, and Findon Parish Council, lead by the late Len Prior.

The Bursar at the School will be in contact with the specialist expert company who renovated and currently service the clock when the school terms starts in September to investigate the cost implications to the School to change the mechanism and alter the chiming from 7am to 9am. In the meantime, the decision has been taken to suspend all the chimes until this information has been received and reviewed.

Findon Sheep Fair and Village Festival

Saturday 9th September 2023 update

Get ready as Harris's Traditional Fair, Sheep, Farmers and Entertainment return to Findon for The Sheep Fair and Village Festival Saturday 9th September 2023.

To be precise - 54 farms, 300 sheep (nearly 100 more than last year), 30 breeds, 184 pens and 42 young shepherds all representing an exciting increase in numbers from 2022, and even more than 2019, pre-pandemic; showing that rural farming life is thriving at the fair.

New for this year is the Farmyard circus, think Cirque du Soleil but with fire and wheelbarrows, certainly not to be missed! And if that's not enough the fair has branched out in celebrating animals on four legs - Camels! Do you know your Bactrian from your Dromedary? Come and learn all about them. Which has one hump and which

has two and what do they store in them? The birds of prey are back too, also the Nicola Miles Theatre Studio.

All this and stalls, fairground rides, pony rides, vintage cars, tractor rides and more. For the evenings, there is the Friday night Barn Dance (tickets still available from Michael Jones and Curtis, Findon Valley and Findon Village Community Shop/Post Office), Saturday night is The Party on The Green (tickets now sold out) and Sunday, the bring your own Picnic on The Green at 1pm followed by the wonderful Salvation Army Band with St John The Baptist Church for Songs of Praise at 2.45pm.

We have a number of things to talk about this month – mainly associated with the extension but one or two others too.

Work on the extension continues apace, the floors are down, internal doors fitted but it's still a hive of activity! We will soon be inviting regular hirers to a preview event so they can see the facility before it is finished. In conjunction with Findon Parish Council, we will announce details of a public opening later.

We are very much looking forward to being able to offer this new facility to the village and hope that the smaller room attracts some events that might have been a bit "lost" in the existing hall. The new room is about 8.5m (or 28 ft) square – the same width as the existing hall but a little less than half the length. There is a small kitchen, for less ambitious catering than the main kitchen, a store room and toilet facilities. Obviously, the Trust is grateful to the Parish Council not only for raising the funds to finish the project but also supervising it. The Village Shop have generously funded the extension sound system and Inspire Leisure provided a near 50% grant to fund the kitchen fitting and equipment, the remaining funds coming from the Trust's own reserves.

This does, of course, bring us on to the question of pricing – we need to set hire rates for the new facility and this means we have to consider the pricing policy for the entire hall. Given the turbulent situation over the recent past, with lockdown and all the rest of it, we have deliberately kept our prices unchanged for 4 years or so but, especially after the energy price rises, we have now

reached the point where the hire rates no longer cover our costs and we need fund raising activities to remain solvent. This is clearly not a sustainable situation and we are afraid that the existing hire rates must increase – but the extension provides the opportunity to offer the smaller facility for less than the main hall rates. We are determined to keep all rates as low as possible but, of course, we don't know either the precise running costs of the extension or the extra income the extension will bring in – so some guesswork will be involved! We do plan to introduce a discount for one-off hirers living in the Parish. We will keep things under review and tweak rates, up or down, should we find our assumptions need adjustment. Ideally, inflation permitting, we will be able to manage another period of stability.

On to other things: for many years Dorothy Barber and her band of willing volunteers have, entirely off their own bat, offered a low cost Light Lunch, in the Hall once a month. This has become an event enjoyed, indeed eagerly anticipated, by many people from the village over that period. Now, Dorothy and her colleagues have decided that the time has come for them to retire and have asked the Hall to consider taking the event on as a Trust organised activity. We would like to do this – but our volunteers are spread thin and we need help! We are trying to arrange a rota such that any individual only supports one lunch in 2 or 3 rather than a regular, monthly commitment – we can part staff it but we need more. Please help, or we will lose an activity of genuine benefit to the community and exactly the sort of thing the Hall Trust want to support.



Poppies on Pond Green for Remembrance Sunday

We are hoping to increase our display of poppies this year. If there are any readers who would like to knit or crochet some we would be very grateful.

I have included a very simple knitting and crochet pattern, but if you prefer to use your own or one that's available on-line

that's fine, and we would get a lovely variety of poppies. Poppies should ideally be in the size range 3 – 4 inches diameter.

Simple Knitted Poppy

Using red acrylic double knitting yarn, loosely cast on 48 stitches using 4mm (UK size 6) needles.

10 rows x Knit 2 Purl 2 to the end.

Pull yarn through the 48 stitches. Pull up tight, fasten and sew edges together.

Fasten a black button in centre.

* * * * *

Crochet Poppy

Red DK and 3.5 mm hook (will work with chunkier wool and bigger hook). Work in the round.

Round 1- Magic ring and 8 half trebles - htr (8).

Round 2- Sl st into 1st htr of previous round, ch 2 and 2 htr all in same st, pull MR tight. 2 htr into each remaining 7 stitches (16, ignore ch2).

Round 3 - Sl st into 1st htr of previous round, pull sl st tight as this gives shape of petals. *2 tr in each of next 3 stitches, sl st in next st, pull tight*

Repeat from* to * 3 more times, (final sl st in same stitch as 1st sl st in this round).

Finish off. Use black felt, button or small crochet circle for centre.

GARDENING TITBITS

Catherine York

Lychnis Coronaria (rose campion cerise flowers)

I started with this 60cm short-lived perennial many years ago and it is my daughter-in-law's favourite plant.

When they moved house in 2019 I gave them one for their new garden. I always dead-head mine to keep it going non-stop from July to October but my son is a working man with three children and a dog and he did not have the time or inclination to follow my advice and the plant quickly went to seed and stopped flowering a lot earlier. I looked at the sorry sight of it but dared not say anything. On the bright side; one day they would probably come across many more of the same plants growing round the garden.

Unfortunately, this year the roots of my very own Lychnis rotted away in the soggy winter soil. I had been a little

over enthusiastic with my own dead-heading and found that I only had one seed head left. I spread these meagre seeds onto the vegetable plot hoping to get more seedlings but not one was successful, presumably because of the continually soggy ground.

Then last week, my son turned up for a visit holding a beautiful plant with silver-felted leaves. At first sight I thought it was Stachys Lanata (lamb's tongue) which has similar leaves but it turned out to be Lychnis Coronaria. I was over the moon. He had literally just pulled the plant out of his gravel drive a few minutes earlier from a plentiful supply of self-sown seedlings. I will purposely allow this new plant go to seed in my garden and create a new batch of seedlings for myself.

News from Paws Animal Sanctuary

All our cat pens are full, most are unwanted or abandoned or are from families who have been evicted. One man brought in a beautiful little tabby cat which he couldn't keep as he is sleeping in his van. Another in need of a home, big ginger cat the tenants had left behind when they moved, (how could you do that?). The landlord had put the cat outside in the garden. Most of the cats end up here because we get phone calls from members of the public telling us there is a stray cat living in the area, been around for a long time, some losing weight, or begging for food. When David our volunteer goes to put the scanner on the cats, if the cat isn't microchipped he brings it in to PAWS. If the cat has a chip number he gets the cat back to the owner. But, most strays we get are not chipped, not neutered, and usually covered in fleas.

Fortunately , we have a new Mobile Vet who visits Paws and treats all our animals. This week he was here at 7.30am and picked up a cat needing spaying. He took her back to his surgery to do the operation, then brought her back in the evening and then gave treatments to our other cats. This is so convenient for me, and no more expensive than other Vets. He's a lovely friendly Vet.

David our Volunteer who did the microchipping course has been really busy, possibly because he is only charging £15 to microchip a dog or a cat, and he is mobile so he will go to the house. This week he was called to go and microchip two cats in Brighton. When he got there he said the lady had fifteen cats in a high rise block of flats! All the others had already been microchipped. She must have a busy time dealing with all those litter trays!

We had a baby Owl brought in with a bad injury. Poor thing, a bone was protruding

where the wing was shattered. Luckily Rod who has a poultry farm was here and was able to set and bandage the wing while I was frantically trying to find a wildlife hospital. Eventually a kind lady from Brighton responded. She is a volunteer and managed to contact Sompting Wildlife Rescue and took the owl there for us.

A man handed me a bag and said his children were fed up with their Guinea-Pigs. I asked him if they were girls or boys and if they had names and their ages. He said they were girls but he didn't know their names or ages but had to rush off. I put them in a pen and gave them names Daisy and Rosie. The next day I stood watching them, one of the Guinea-pigs kept bullying the other, I thought that's most unusual for girls not to get on together. The volunteers had groomed them and filled in their charts. When I checked they are not girls, they are both boys and are obviously are not fond of one another. So I have changed their names to Noel and Liam. (the Oasis brothers).

We are always in need of Volunteers, if you could spare a few hours a week feeding and cleaning pens, grooming animals. We have vacancies Tuesdays and Thursdays 9.30 - 12.30am. Or Fridays, Saturdays or Sundays 6.00pm until 8.00pm. Retired welcome. Also, a Volunteer Gardener needed.

The story is that 'on the run' he found himself in Findon where he went into the Gun Inn and met William Carn, Senior. William felt sorry for Harry so took him home to live and work at Tolmare Farm, on Long Furlong, where he eventually married one of William's daughters and fathered ten children. Granny always said that her first and last child had been born at Tolmare Farm, the family seem to have moved around a lot in between. Perhaps Grandad thought the army were still looking for him? If they were, they didn't make much effort.

In later years the family moved to Barns Farm, Sullington. The last move, with the children grown up and gone, Granny and Grandad moved to School Cottages, also in Sullington (now sadly modernised).

At the age of 80 plus, Grandad still worked at the local farm, no retirement pension in those days. He came home from work, said his feet hurt, sat in the chair and died.

If the army are still looking for him.....he's buried in the Sullington Churchyard. **R.I.P.**
