From the Rectory

Autumn approaches after a busy summer with lots of Baptisms and weddings at our churches. It is such a joy to share the happiness of families on these occasions. As the evenings begin to draw in, we need however to be mindful of neighbours who may be anxious about venturing out and are feeling lonely. Please let us know via the Parish Office if you are aware of anyone who might welcome a visit from our Pastoral Team.

This has been the hottest and dryest summer I can remember, with lawns and fields parched browner than I've seen since 1976. Heath fires have been destroying swathes of habitat for species, many of which are endangered - it has seemed more like an Australian summer! As we think during September of the wonder of creation, giving thanks for a harvest safely gathered in during special Services in our churches, the analogy of rain falling on parched ground is a useful metaphor for our faith too. Only too often, we become complacent, taking all we have for granted, but not recognising that it is through God's bounty. This can lead to our becoming parched spiritually, growing ever more selfish and self-centred. As we give thanks for the blessings of the harvest, we must also remember those across the globe whose harvest has failed through drought or torrential rain and storms, those who go hungry because of fighting or military blockades in the

wars in Gaza and Ukraine. We mustn't forget those in our own area struggling either, and our local Homeless Charity, Turning Tides, has published a wish list of helpful donations that we can collect and pass on at our Church Harvest festivals, their stocks being at a record low, whilst need is increasing. This will be at 10am on September 7th at Findon Church and September 21st at Clapham Church, or donations can also be left in the Rectory Porch. I will be taking all goods donated to their warehouse in East Worthing on September 22nd. With Food Bank donation boxes in our supermarkets, understandably most people wanting to donate do so there, but any support you are able to give to the homeless will be much appreciated.

Finally, I'm sure you would all join with me in wishing our pupils and school staff every blessing for the new academic year. My thoughts and prayers are with all pupils starting a new school this month and I wish you all the best in your learning. If you are going on to an apprenticeship, Vocational training, College or University this will be an exciting new venture into independence – do come and let us know how you're getting on after the first term during the Christmas period – you can always find me in the church on a Sunday morning!

We would like to thank our sponsors, volunteers and the Findon Valley Scouts for their support that allows the event to run.



The Dulaney Dollars

Helena recently reminded us of the importance of maintaining our churches, and it got me thinking. Built with love, by hand, and made to last, they are the oldest buildings in our villages, and today they benefit from the voluntary support of The Friends of each church, but in the past they survived the ravages of time largely through individual donations.

Take St. John the Divine at Patching for example. For centuries, along with Clapham's St. Mary the Virgin, it was dependent for its upkeep on the Shelley family of Michelgrove, but they moved away in 1800, and their successors, the Walkers, went bankrupt. So by the third decade of the 19th century, serious restoration had become increasingly urgent. A benefactor was required, and up stepped local resident, Sir Richard Hunter (1783-1848) of Dulaney House.

Some readers may no doubt recall a talk given to a packed Patching church a few years ago by Kristina Guiguet who had researched the story behind Sir Richard and his family's so generous contribution made to St. John the Divine.

Today a tablet in the church commemorates how, in 1835, Sir Richard paid for the building to be 'repaired and beautified' including, high on the wall of the tower, a mural relief of his first wife, Rebecca Ann (1793-1835). Seven years later he also presented a silver alms dish, and, after his death, his widow, Frederica Emma Bishop (c.1808-70),

contributed to a new rectory. But the generous family were not finished yet, as in 1856, Sir John Kirkland, husband to Frederica's sister, Louisa, paid for further work to be done on the church.

What is not so widely known is that much of Sir Richard's wealth actually came from his first wife, catholic Rebecca Ann, and that it was actually American money that enhanced the church that we love today.

In order to inherit her fortune Rebecca Ann had re assumed her maiden Dulaney name, and thereby returned to a wealthy and interesting family, an early example of the *American Dream*. How had her family gone from rags to riches?

The Dulaneys were Irish catholics and about 1700, Thomas Delaney (sic.), with at least two sons, arrived in America from Leinster. The family were not well off and eldest son, Daniel (1685-1753), served time as an indentured servant, but he was both intelligent and hard-working, and rose to setting up his own legal practice, eventually becoming a prominent attorney. This brought him important contacts and political influence, which in turn led him to making a number of astute land purchases in an expanding and developing Maryland. He was well on his way.

With his second wife, Rebecca Smith (1696-1737), he had several children and named his eldest son Daniel.

Daniel Dulaney the younger (1722-97) was sent to England to be well educated at Eton, Cambridge and Middle Temple, culminating with him being called to the Bar. In short, he carried on where his father had left off, his career accelerating when he inherited the family estates in 1753.

He was now extremely wealthy.

But he was living in troubled times that saw him sympathize with the colonists' political ambitions, but argue against the use of military force to achieve full independence. As a loyalist, when this was achieved in 1781, he refused to swear allegiance to the new government and consequently had property confiscated. But, astute businessman that he was, he had already distributed some of his wealth around his extended family and that is how some of it ended up in Patching, and why a home in the village today is still named Dulaney House.

Simplified route of the Dulaney fortunes relevant to us

- 1. Daniel Dulaney the elder.
- 2. His son Daniel Dulaney the younger
- 3. His son Daniel Dulaney (1751-1824) of London and Brighton, and his daughter Rebecca Ann (1764-1828) wife of William de la Serre.
- 4. Then his grand daughter Rebecca Ann (1793-1835) heiress to her uncle Daniel and who assumed the name Dulaney and married
 - 5. Sir Richard Hunter.

While within the church:

high altar is the vault containing the remains of Rebecca Tasker Dulany (sic.) and those of her son, Daniel Dulany, and of her daughter, Anne Dulany and of the latter's daughter, Rebecca Anne de la Serre Dulany, who was the wife of Sir Richard Hunter. In the right transept are mural tablets. (1)

I slowed down and told the owner "It's too hot to walk your dog "! Only to be ignored. They forget the dogs have fur coats and will burn their feet - (the dog was a greyhound)!

I hope there are no rabbits suffering in hutches in the sun. They are like ovens. Or chickens kept in small runs with no shade. And, I feel sorry for the sheep out in the fields in this heat. I have fans going for the cats and one for the parrot.

I bought two more fans in case it gets any hotter for my lounge and bedroom. The sky immediately clouded over, and they are still in their boxes!


