From the Rectory

I have frequently been asked the question 'Have you had your jab yet?' We are all eagerly anticipating the day when we will finally be able to put away the masks and hand gel and get back to some semblance of normality. I wonder if it will feel odd to be in a shop or church without wearing a mask, as though we had forgotten to dress properly.

As I write this article in Lent, looking forward to the beginning of April, there is that same sense of anticipation of a joyful celebration in the near future, whilst at the same time living through a period of reflection and preparation. If you read this piece as soon as it is published we will still be in Holy Week, a time when we journey with our Lord in the final few days before his death.

On Maundy Thursday we remember Jesus sharing that very special meal with the disciples, which we often call the Last Supper. In past years we would have shared a rather nice meal together in the church. Sadly, we can't do that this year but we will be having a celebration of the Eucharist at 8.30pm, after which we are invited to spend some time in prayer. We recall Jesus praying in the garden of Gethsemane on the night of his arrest and he asked his disciples to watch and pray with him. They went to sleep but I think the cold will keep us awake!

On Good Friday there will be a short service on Pond Green at 10.00am. This will be followed by Stations of the

Cross in Findon Church at 12.00 noon, which marks the hour of our Lord's crucifixion. There will also be a guided meditation in Patching Church at 2.00pm, marking the final hour before Jesus died. We are only too aware that so many people have suffered this last year and lost loved ones and the cross is a reminder that God came in human form to share our sufferings, and to be alongside those in pain.

Easter, in this country is very much associated with Spring, and the signs of new life are all around us. The churchyard has been full of snowdrops for quite a while. They symbolise hope and rebirth and that is particularly appropriate for all of us this year I think. But even with the continuing restrictions on our lives Easter, reminds us that Jesus has already won the battle over death when he died on the cross. We are all invited to share in the wonderful and abundant new life he offers, which begins in the here and now and continues beyond our death. We will be celebrating this on Easter Morning with a service of light at Findon Church at 8am, followed by a Worship and Praise Service at 10am. This will be supported by the ever popular band 'Canticle' and will use our brand-new Audio-visual equipment. There will also be a 10.00am Eucharist at Clapham Church. Do come along and share in the celebrations!

Helena and I wish you a very blessed Holy Week and all the joys of the Easter Season.

Letter received from Mrs Sheila Steere, The Oval

I have recently been lent a book entitled "Glimpses of Old Worthing". It contains an article about a Mr Richard Walker who was the squire of Michelgrove. He owned Stage Coaches and laid out the Long Furlong road through his land to shorten the journey from Bognor to London. (It's still possible to see the old London Road if you travel east and look to the left of Cissbury Ring.)

Mr Walker later ruined himself by his "sporting activities". What these were the book doesn't say. His splendid house was sold and later pulled down. (I think the Duke of Norfolk had something to do with this.)

My Great Grandmother, Emma Carn was for many years the Long Furlong toll housekeeper. Most of her children were born there. The midwife lived, very conveniently, next to the cricket pitch.

The tolls were abolished about 1876. The family then moved across the fields to Tolmare Farm where Great Grandfather William worked as a shepherd. Sheep could, at that time, be driven along Long Furlong to the Sheep Fair, etc. How peaceful those days must have been.

Our March meeting was a quiz which went well thanks to the PowerPoint presentation Vicki, my daughter, created. Congratulations to our winner, Gay Hibbs.




Easter Sunday 4th April

How we Arrived in Findon - and a Sting in the Tail.....

From six weeks after our wedding, Peter and I spent most of our lives working abroad. After five years in Nairobi, where our three sons were born, we had five years in Cheltenham before Peter was asked to go to Kuwait. Our boys' first year of schooling there was with me at home as the English school was full, but thereafter their education was in Kuwait, followed by A levels in the UK. Summers were spent in Sussex, with many happy holidays with my parents in High Salvington but as the boys grew bigger we looked for a house of our own. And our house in Findon is still our home today.

From Kuwait we moved to Oman which is a beautiful, harsh country with lovely, friendly people and a rich culture. It was an exciting place to be too, sparsely populated and with many remote and interesting places to explore. We would think nothing of driving 500km at the end of the working week so we could go exploring - hiking in the mountainous countryside, and camping in the open air over the weekends. Many of the villages were so remote that at the beginning of each week, the Sultan ensured that helicopters took the village children to school, where they would board, and be returned home by helicopter at the end of each week.

Oman became Thailand, a very different country but one with delicious food, a very interesting Buddhist culture and an impossible language! While Peter was working in Bangkok, I was

working in Lan Krabu, about half way between Bangkok and Chang Mai, so we would fly either up or down the country to spend weekends together and with friends exploring the different regions.

Finally we moved to Manila in the Philippines. At last - a country where we could talk with local people! (For however hard we tried to learn the other languages and writing, in the relatively short periods we were there, we only ever learned the simple niceties.) The Philippines is a vibrant country, with a large Spanish/American influence and welcoming, friendly people. We stayed there till we retired and were particularly sorry to say goodbye to the good friends we'd made. However, several years later, Peter was asked to return for a period to work there and I was able to accompany him and meet old friends. We both had a great time.

But it was not with sadness that we returned to Findon. We had loved our travels and were very grateful to have had the opportunities to work in and also visit so many wonderful people and places. But, I was particularly keen to sort out the garden in England and decided that for starters I'd like a beehive - just for decoration. So I began to look into the subject and, well, the rest is history.

I love my bees, I don't mind if they sting me if I mishandle them, I don't mind cleaning and sterilising the used hives (and bees are very messy!), I don't



mind checking them for diseases, feeding them in a long winter or any of the many tasks that may need to be performed during their active year. And I thank them for producing the delicious honey which takes them through the winter months and provides all the extra honey for Findon.



I am now looking forward to the new season, opening the hives to see how many bees have survived the winter, planning the increase and checking for disease and possible medication. Spring is so exciting for beekeepers!

St John the Baptist Church - A New Audio- Visual System

In July 2019 members of the PCC visited St Peter AD Vincula Church in Wisborough Green to see the recently installed audio visual system. Some twenty months later we are delighted to say St John's now has its own fully operational laser projector and motorised retractable screen. Changes to rural churches in the Church of England never happen too quickly! In fairness this is to be expected with a Grade 1 listed building with parts dating back to the 11th Century.

After many months of consultation including referrals to Historic England, Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings and South Downs National Park we finally received permission in what is formally known as a Faculty, from the Chancellor – Chichester Diocesan Registry in January 2021. The work was completed in February (under the lockdown construction work exemption provisions) with the system first being used for the Worship & Praise Service on Sunday 7th March.

The screen is housed in a cassette which when retracted is virtually invisible when viewed looking down the main church aisle towards the stained glass window. This was an important consideration in making the screen, the laser projector and connecting cabling as unobtrusive as possible.

Having the system will allow all or part of our services to be projected to a comfortable viewing height and, where used, will mean we will no longer need to print service sheets saving time and


considerable cost. Prayers and hymns can be followed on the screen and Helena or Colin will have a "comfort" monitor in front of them reproducing what's on the main screen avoiding the need for them to look up or turn round to check they're on the same "hymn sheet"! We have taken the opportunity of replacing the broken CD player and added a new DVD player which means we have a complete multimedia projection system fully integrated to the existing sound system.

Apart from Sunday services we envisage the system being used in a number of different circumstances. We hope our local church primary school will find it useful – there are a number of educational films and excellent animated religious stories available plus it's becoming increasingly popular for families to show DVD's of happier family times when celebrating the life of a recently deceased loved one. At some future stage it might be possible to "live stream" services of national importance adding a relayed service to one of local thanksgiving. This is certainly stage two requiring a strong and reliable internet signal.

We intend to next use the system on Easter Sunday – 4th April. Please join us if you can. The church is open between 9.00am and 4.00pm each day and if you can't make Easter Sunday you might like to visit to see if you can locate the screen!

Findon Animal Sanctuary

I never use an ansaphone because I would never have the time to listen and reply to all the messages. Also I would miss really important emergencies. Yesterday Kevin a local gardener rang asking if I could go soon as possible to pick up a tiny fox cub, I quickly drove down where the cub was, it was very cold and weak and gasping for air. I decided to take it to my vets to see if we could save it. My car was very hot, the cub started to warm up but it cried pitifully all the way. The vet saw it straightaway but advised me to get it to a wildlife hospital because it was so young: it could breathe properly but couldn't suck. So my daughter and I took the tiny cub to Brent Lodge Wildlife Hospital in Sidlesham, they immediately put it in an incubator and said they would try and feed it, then when it 's stronger it can join all the other orphan cubs.

The other evening it was pouring with rain and blowing a gale. An old Lady rang and said "Can you come and help me there is an injured animal in my garden, its grey and white I think it's a cat or maybe a badger, but I don't have a torch?" She told me she had put food and water down. I never drive at night so I rang all the people I could think of until one of my friends said her Mother and Stepdad lived a few minutes away and would take a torch and cat carrier to rescue the animal. The next phone call from them all I could hear was laughter. During the high winds a very large garden ornament of an owl had blown into the Lady's garden and her dog was going mad barking at it, and she couldn't see very well in the dark. She was so sorry for calling them out

and so embarrassed but the dear Lady did the right thing, it could have been an injured animal.

I was advised by the Vet to have Elvis our rescued pony put down because the operation he had on his shoulder was not a success. He is still limping badly and cannot put any weight on his hoof. He is still on eight painkillers a day. Instead I decided to try acupuncture. After only 2 treatments he is walking on it, and rolling on the field and even chases the cat, and he is much happier. I read about a very expensive product (over a £100) with green lipped mussels, and many other ingredients, to heal bones and muscles in horses He absolutely hates it (it's a powder). I crush polo mints, and sugar, mix it in his bucket with his food and apple and carrot grated. He tastes it raises his head, lifts his lips, shows all his teeth then throws the bucket in the air. Three times I have tried but he won't touch it and threw the bucket each time. I thought it cannot be that bad so I took the lid off and tasted the powder, well it is so bitter and horrible, it made me heave, I can't blame Elvis for not wanting it. Any suggestions welcome how I can mask it and get him to eat it.



British Wool.



What do we use wool for?

It's a natural fibre that helps to keep you cool when it's hot, and warm when it's not!

Typically used in: Clothing, Carpets, Blankets, Upholstery, Horse blankets, Saddle blankets, Insulation, Duvets

Gardeners are using it for keeping slugs and snails off plants, in runner bean trenches to hold moisture for the roots and in hanging baskets.


Characteristics: Crimp, Elastic, Fire resistant, Soft, Warm

Wool has been used historically to protect and keep us warm but has many additional benefits. Wool's unique structure makes it robust and resilient to damage.

Our local breed, the Southdown Sheep on the South Downs, produces excellent wool for yarn.

What is Yarn?

Yarn is a long continuous length of interlocked fibres, suitable for use in the production of textiles, sewing, crocheting, knitting, weaving, embroidery, or ropemaking. Thread is a type of yarn intended for sewing by hand or machine.



General Market

Most of the wool in this country is collected by the British Wool Board who have various sites around the UK. The nearest site to Findon is in Ashford, Kent. Sheep farmers can sell fleeces to local spinners but the general market for wool in recent years has been very poor. The past year it has been a lot worse as carpet sales have dropped alarmingly due to the pandemic.

What can we do?



What can be done to use this commodity. If you are keen to support British wool then you can do your part by buying woollen products made in the United Kingdom. If everybody bought 3 items made with wool each year, instead of imported products, this would give the industry a tremendous boost.
