From The Rectory

As one might expect given the time of the year, there is a lot happening in the life of the church this month. On the 2nd April we celebrate Palm Sunday, the day of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, riding on a donkey as a sign that he came in peace. The crowds waved palm branches and welcomed him as their king with shouts of 'Hosanna!'. We plan to walk in procession with a donkey at both of our main church services at Findon and Patching. Those joining us at Findon have the chance to fortify themselves with bacon butties at the Rectory at 9am before setting off. Folk at Patching are made of sterner stuff and need no such fortification! (Please see the website/Facebook for further details on where and when to meet.)

We will be marking Holy Week with service(s) each day (except Tuesday, as we have a diocesan service that day). Everyone is very welcome to join us in this annual opportunity to spend some time reflecting on our Lord's Passion. On Maundy Thursday we will commemorate the Last Supper with a Eucharist at 7pm. This is followed by what is called 'The Watch', a time of silent prayer in the darkened church, as we remember Jesus' prayer of anguish in the Garden of Gethsemane, just

before his arrest.

On the first Good Friday Jesus died on the cross for love for us. This year, as in previous years, we will be holding a Messy Church session on Good Friday morning at the Rectory from 9.45am. We plan to finish in time to walk to Pond Green for a short service at 10:45am. We then mark the three hours that Jesus suffered on the cross before he died with a service of meditation, which takes place at noon at Findon Church and 2pm at Patching Church.

Jesus death, rather than being the end of the story, as the Jewish leaders and Romans will have hoped, was in fact only the beginning, and opens the way to eternal life for all of us. So we celebrate Christ's resurrection on Easter Day with a dawn service at 6am. For those who will still be in bed at that time, there are later services at their usual times at both Findon and Patching Churches. Do come and join our celebration of this premier feast of the church.

We are looking forward to welcoming Helena back to the Parish after her three months sabbatical in Australia. She returns in the early hours of Palm Sunday, so if you bump into her early on in Holy Week she may be a little jetlagged and bleary-eyed! Finally, just to mention that we are urgently looking for someone who is good with figures to take on the role of honorary treasurer. See the separate notice for this.



Findon Village Tree News

We are really noticing the ravages of Ash Dieback disease now, extensive felling north of the village either side of the A24 has opened up swathes of the shelterbelts. West Sussex County council are bound to carry out this work to remove any chance of a dead tree falling onto the carriageway. Similar work is going on towards the top of Bost Hill opening up the road to view from the Gallops.

On a more positive note, we received a donation of saplings and three semi mature trees from Arun council and have planted one, a Field Maple, on the

junction of Cross Lane and Steep Lane. With the permission of the owner we also planted a range of native saplings on the exposed bank. The village volunteers did a great job of digging the considerable sized hole for the larger tree. We will also be planting on Pond Green and the north side of Nepcote Green to replace one which had to be felled due to disease.

Please consider planting trees in your gardens and land, there is a tree suitable for all places and they provide so much for years to come.

After what has felt like a long, cold winter, hopefully spring is upon us. The days are getting longer, daffodils are coming into bloom, and it's finally starting to get warmer. Hurrah! And not a moment too soon. Easter is fast approaching, a celebration of new life and hope, which might come as a surprise to some of you chocolate lovers! But, fear not! Look no further than Findon Village Store to indulge your craving. We stock eggs for every member of the family and every occasion (so long as it's Easter). Whether it's Peppa Pig, Hot Wheels, crème egg or smarties for the youngsters, or Thorntons or Lindt for that special person in your life, you can find it all here. I'm particularly taken by Galaxy's Enchanted egg. I could do with a bit of enchantment this year ... (couldn't we all?)

And our Easter stock doesn't stop at eggs. Whistlefish supply our Easter cards, which are creative and often a little bit different, as well as being very good value. am reliably informed that there will be some on sale at the Cinnamon Trust Easter Fair on April 1st at the Village Hall, 10am to 12.30pm.

On the subject of food, our Ginger cakes containing plentiful chunks of stem ginger, sourced from Bramble, are highly sought after. Customers seem to be able to sniff out when they are delivered, and buy them in their droves. Did you know that Findon residents have an exceptionally good sense of smell? I didn't. You learn something new every day. We hope to have some more Ginger cakes in time for Easter, along with some Bramble traybakes.

Some customers have commented on the cream at the top of our new milk bottles. The milk is only pasteurised, which means it probably tastes better, and is easier to digest. The cream stays in its natural state. (As well as being pasteurised, supermarket milk is usually homogenised, when the fat particles are mixed and dispersed so that the cream does not separate.) Just give the bottle a good shake, and all is good – very good, in fact.

Sadly, prices are still increasing, and this month it's the turn of Royal Mail, which is increasing the price of its services, including stamps.
Unfortunately, we have no say in their pricing structure. If you can, stock up from your local Store/PO before 3rd April. While I'm on the subject of stamps, the deadline for the Stamp Swap scheme has been extended to July 31st.

Meeting, but we'll have had it by the time you read this. So, instead, I'll say how much I enjoyed meeting you all recently, which I'm sure will be true, even if it isn't at the time of writing!



A Little about Downsview Farm.

Downsview Farm is a family business. (Our father) John started his first venture over 60 years ago when he bought an 18-gallon milk round. Within two years the milk round had expanded to the point where John was able to achieve his goal – to start farming in his own right. With the help of wife Gillian, John made a success of dairy farming. In the course of natural succession, John and Gillian have been joined in the business by their son Ralph and daughter Sarah.

In June 2006 we launched the "Downsview Farmhouse" brand of **real luxury dairy ice cream**, which proved an instant hit with the customers of local eateries and shops. Since then, we have expanded our range to Butter, Yoghurt, Cream and Pasteurised Milk. Which has a different taste to the milk you get in the supermarkets. We only pasteurise our milk as we believe that it is a lot healthier and *tastier* than homogenized.

Here is the difference.

Homogenization is the physical smashing of the milk fat particles into

smaller particles; (which changes the taste straight away) This stops the fat particles rising to the top and remains in even suspension throughout the milk. This ensures that the colour is consistent and there is no cream at the top of the container.

Pasteurisation is a process of heating the milk to a specific temperature for a predefined length of time and then immediately cooled. This process slows spoilage. When you drink pasteurised milk, with the cream left in its natural state, your body can digest the cream and use the fat that's in the cream for energy and the nutrients that your body needs.

Also, when the cows go out in the spring on the fresh grass the milk has a sweeter taste.

As with all dairy products, our milk must be stored in the fridge, **shaken before use** and used by the sell-by date.

The secret behind the Downsview product range, we believe, is the rich milk produced by our **own herd of dairy cows**...

Mustard Seed Shoe Boxes

After a year when the shoeboxes filled with gifts for underprivileged children in Moldova could not be taken to them due to the conflict in the Ukraine, I have now heard from Mustard Seed Missions that this year they can once again undertake their delivery. Due to the fighting in the Ukraine, and the additional need due to the refugees in Moldova, these boxes will be appreciated more than ever.

If you would like to take part in this scheme, choose whether you are collecting for a girl or a boy and the approximate age, 3-5 years, 6-11 years or 12-15 years. Some suggestions that would be enjoyed are colouring pencils, paper, toothbrush and toothpaste, flannel, soap, hat, scarf, gloves, a ball, playing cards, a doll, a cuddly toy (this is apparently welcomed even by the older boys), marbles, cars, hairbrush or comb, hair accessories, and so on. Also, sweets are a very special treat so they are welcome too. You will need an empty shoe box (boxes from mens shoes I find are best and most shoe shops will be happy to give them to you if they have them), wrap the lid and the

box separately in cheerful Christmas wrapping paper and pop a Christmas card in the box from

you. Do not include your address or any personal details. Your box will be valued as much as its contents.

Mustard Seed do also ask that if you are able, a donation (and they suggest £5) would be welcome to help with the expense of taking them to Moldova. This is done in huge lorries driven overland.

The boxes are collected from me, usually in November, and taken back to their depot before being taken overland to Moldova for distribution. I will collect boxes from early October and more details will be available in Findon News September and October issues.

The Monday afternoon Tea sessions have been a great success with between 20 and 40 people turning up for almost every session. Informal discussions with the attendees suggests that winding up at the end of March would be sensible and we plan to restart in the Autumn. Meanwhile, thanks to those who came and gave informal performances, those who brought in home-made cakes and biscuits and, indeed, all those who have attended and created the lovely atmosphere that developed.

Film Nights of late have been packed and we have an Olivia Coleman film next month: Empire of Light. We have also been lucky enough to have some extra volunteers on the events team which makes running these (and other events) rather easier!

Following the great success of the platinum jubilee party last year, we will be holding a similar event to celebrate the coronation of King Charles III. This will be held on 7th May with gates opening at 12:00 until 16:00 hrs. Once again entry will be free, we will have live music, a bbq, licensed bar, teas, coffees, ice creams and cakes for sale. There will also be a bouncy castle and other side shows all of which will be free of charge. So please come along and help us celebrate the coronation of our new King.

There are a couple of actions under way through which we are taking to try and enhance the usefulness of the hall to the community in general. The first is that we are planning to install a defibrillator in the porch of the hall so that it will be freely available at all times in case of need. We hope to get a grant to part fund it but will proceed even if this is not successful. We

are also working with both Findon Parish Council and Arun DC to set the hall up as a properly equipped Rest Centre in the event of a local emergency requiring people to be evacuated from their homes. This will require us to store a small amount of equipment and train some volunteers so that we are ready in the event of a problem.

Lambs tails seems now to be reestablished with a core group of parent (or grandparents!) and children who attend regularly. Whilst this is not a large group, it is enough to justify carrying on in the longer term. As ever, we would be very happy to hear from anyone who wanted to volunteer to join the team as we don't really have enough people to provide holiday cover etc.

And then the ongoing saga of the extension.... Findon Village Hall Trust must extend their thanks to the Parish Council and especially Sean Hellet and Fiona Macleod who have been indefatigable in pursuing the Public Works loan that we need to fund the work. They understand that they have responded to every query and now expect a verdict within 2 or 3 weeks of your reading this article. Fingers crossed! If we get a favourable outcome, we would hope work can begin quite soon although we have missed our planned slot with the contractor.

Finally, we have realised that we can make a cost (and paperwork!) saving by extending our existing entertainments licence to include the sale of alcohol rather than applying for an individual, "TENS", licence on each occasion. We are therefore investigating this possibility and may make an application in the near future. Please note that the number of times we apply the licence will remain at or close to the level we have currently scheduled under the current system.

St John the Baptist Primary School

We started this month with another busy week of learning in school and our children have welcomed the slightly better weather. Three times a week, they get the opportunity to do a multiskills session with our resident Premier Sports provider - Jamie - and this is so much more fun when we have warmer. drier weather. One of the highlights of the day was children of all ages working together on a 'Bear Hunt' around the school, put together by our Year5/6 teacher, Mrs Stoner. It was

fantastic to see the older children supporting the younger pupils of our school. We finished the day with a reading of the whole school story, put together with contributions from every class. Many photos were taken throughout the day, which were shared with parents via the school's weekly newsletter, including some collages put together by Mrs Griffiths to commemorate the day. We would like to take this opportunity to again thank our parents for supporting the day, with the wonderful costumes the children came to school in, and to those parents who were able to come in and read with groups of children. Findon Parish Council News

Findon Parish Council (FPC) has begun the process of creating a Community Resilience Plan, using a template created in association with West Sussex Association of Local Councils. The template is designed to allow Parish Councils to create a more flexible and tailored resilience plan that will suit local village needs. The main body of the plan will allow task and response responsibility allocation to council members and identified voluntary personnel in advance of a crisis. It will give tasks, equipment, people, skills, support and structure as well as a means for vulnerable residents to consider and request appropriate help and support in the event of a crisis. Even at this early stage, if you feel that you would be able to volunteer your services/skills in the event of an emergency, please contact the Clerk, Fiona MacLeod, with details. clerk@findonparishcouncil.gov.uk

The plan to restore Nepcote Pond to its previous water filled state has gathered pace with initial funding secured from South Downs National Park Authority (SDNPA) and approval that this process would enhance the status of the Conservation Area for that space. On that note, the recent meeting held by SDNPA Planning Committee on 9 March 2023 voted unanimously to confirm the Nepcote Conservation Area (CA) Order. The Nepcote CA is the first designated Order by the SDNPA and has come into immediate effect.

FPC has begun a village wide assessment of signage. The process will first establish a baseline of signage locations and content and then move to an audit of what is required and what may have expired, no longer required

or duplication. Our overall goal is to maintain the rural feel of Findon and ensure that signage does not detract from that.

A reminder of a date for your diary - the Annual Parish Meeting (APM) will be held on Monday 17 April 2023 at 7pm in Findon Village Hall. This is not a meeting of the FPC and is an opportunity for parishioners and local organisations to get together and find out what has happened in the last twelve months and look forward to the future. The FPC Chairman will give an 'end of year' report on FPC activities and refreshments will be available. Please look out for yellow posters advertising the APM in the Notice Boards etc.

Finally, just a final reminder that elections will be held in May 2023 for Arun District Council (ADC) councillors and Arun parish and town council councillors. The Polling Day is Thursday 4 May 2023 so please look out for future details in the media, FPC Notice Boards, and the FPC and Community websites, particularly if you are interested in becoming a parish councillor. FPC currently has two vacancies for a parish councillor.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION The May 2023 elections will be the first to require Voter ID (if available) to be shown at the Polling Station – details of this and other election information can be found at Elections | Arun District Council. The Polling Station for Findon Parish is at the Findon Village Hall.

Findon's Litter Picking Group

Our group has recently celebrated its first year of litter picking. You may remember seeing Robin Carr's advert on the front page of February 2022's Findon News asking for volunteers. He was quick as a flash to start a group, having bumped into me out litter-picking on my own on the High Street. As the rubbish had been building up, I was sure more people would be interested in keeping our village looking beautiful. Sure enough, 10 volunteers initially responded. A year on, we have 30 people registered in the group, which I'm now running with the help and support of my deputy, Philip Goddin, and Robin who has stayed on as a volunteer and who liaises for us with the parish council.

You've probably seen at least one of us out and about on our picking days, as we can't be missed in our high-vis jackets, tooled up with litter grabbers and hooped bin bags. Some kit was initially donated by Arun Council, but most has been paid for by our parish council.

At first, our picking was a bit random, but a few months in, we had four designated routes that concentrated on the residential parts of the village. As the numbers in the group grew, we needed more routes, and we now have nine designated routes that cover the village and surrounds. They extend up and down both sides of the A24, to the Long Furlong layby, and up to Cissbury Ring. We have kept to a regular pick on the last Friday morning of the month, and more recently added a mid-month flexible pick for people who can't make the fixed session. Thanks go to Arun District Council's Cleansing Department who helpfully collect the rubbish a few

days after each session.

Being part of a voluntary group fulfils a social as well as purposeful need, so to celebrate our first anniversary we got together for a skittles night at The Black Horse. Besides several legs of skittles and a good meal, we had our litter pickers 'Oscars' where two prizes were awarded for finds while litter-picking in the last year. There were clear winners in both categories:

- Most useful item Robin Carr won with a tree branch lopper, which was lost by the Wednesday working party about three years previously. Although a bit rusty, it was cleaned up, greased and put back into service with the working party. Found on the Black Route, which runs north up the A24 to the layby near Muntham Lane, on the crematorium side.
- Most bizarre item Lyn Phippen and her step-mum Lyn with their pack of Waitrose organic lamb chops still in the packet and in date! Found on the Pink Route, which runs south down the A24 to the boundary of the village, on the garden centre side.

It's always a perk-me-up to find something useful or weird while you're out picking, as it makes a change from the usual coffee cups and lids, food packaging, and cans. We collect up to 30 bags of rubbish a month, plus other bulky bits of rubbish, such as tyres, buckets and bits of car. As Robin pointed out, we've collected enough rubbish to fill the length of The Black Horse skittle alley and some. All of the prizes given out were donated by local businesses or organisations including The Village House, Peckhams Butchers,
