Well, by the time you read this, the schools will have broken up and. surprise, surprise, the weather has changed! To the wire' as usual, I'm writing on the day copy is due in to the Editor and the heat wave we've been enioving (or less so if you're a keen gardener) has broken. More heat and sun due next week apparently. Changes can be good or bad. depending on our viewpoint at the time! As I write, we all recall today's 50th anniversary of the moon landing - a historic moment for humankind as well as for those first astronauts. My abiding memory is of awe at the sight of our planet earth, seen from space for the first time, an awe that has grown rather than diminished over this half century as technology has advanced and images become clearer. The vulnerability of our little blue planet is ever clearer, and we all have a responsibility to do our best to reduce our exploitation of creation, reversing the changes that seem to be escalating each vear.

August is a month of changes; one academic year ended, and for many, the wait for exam results before further changes. Children enjoy the break before a new challenge in a different class, or for some the transition to a new phase of education – 'big school', secondary, college or university. GARDENING TITBITS

There were many clumps of sempervivums (houseleeks) in this garden when we came, which I love. However they were all in the way of different planting schemes and I had no idea what I wanted to do with them So I placed these succulent rosettes on a 4" strip of gravel along the outside wall of the conservatory. They had a bit of soil on their roots and now and again if the hosepipe was out and I remembered them I gave them a little spray of water. Now, they are incredible, a real feature. Some are as big as side plates with dark outlines to every fleshy segment and sharp pointed tips. They have numerous babies attached and alien looking seed heads No need to find them a new home. They are already in it.

The pond is my husband's 'baby' and he due the hole himself in November 2017. That winter, we had so much rain that the pond filled up entirely with rain water to the very top. I thought this was good but the water level was out by an inch or two so he emptied it again, took away the pond unit, re-dug the soil underneath and installed it again. Now it is nearly level and doing very well. It is amazing where all the wildlife has come from with three frogs: one large, one medium and one tiny, dragon flies: water boatmen: newts and water snails etc. It is so wonderful to watch the dragon flies hatch. If they are in the wrong position so their wings cannot open properly, he gently moves them to a better spot. It is not quite the same as having a cat but he loves the involvement

Years ago my daughter and I bought a geranium (cranesbill) called Jolly Bee. We fell in love with its cheerful open flowers of sky-blue with a white centre. fading to lavender with dark red veins. It flowered endlessly and spread out far and wide. When we went to buy another one it was unavailable There was a similar one called Rozanne which in 2013 won the award for Plant of the Centenary. It transpires that there was a 7 year court battle between two plant growers because these 2 plants had the same DNA. Blooms of Bressingham won the day and Jolly Bee by Marco Van Noort was taken off the market

It is sad that I do not have Jolly Bee anymore and my 2 new plants in this darden are both Rozanne, one in the ground and one in a 12" tub. They start in mid-June and continue until the frosts, with a cut back half way through. They do not creep along as other geraniums and are easy to divide if necessary. However I have learned through experience that they need a good 4 feet to spread so now I under plant with spring bulbs and primroses etc: plants that quite like a bit of respite from the hot summer sun. This way they are not smothering my choice summer plants. I feel sure that Jolly Bee was different. Firstly, it did not start until July and I believe it had a lower head. Never mind, my daughter and I will always refer to it as Jolly Bee.

Every single Guinea-pig cage is full, all our Cat pens too. This week Sheila is in hospital recovering after having a new hip, and many of the Volunteers are on holiday. So I decided to get up earlier each day because there is so much to do. Lots of new arrivals a baby seagull. baby pigeon, hedgehog, to feed and find cages for. A 15vr old tabby cat who is traumatised after losing his home, after a marriage break, up is meowing all the time wanting attention. Report from Findon Downs WI

At our July meeting we welcomed Mr Bob Wragg who gave a talk on "Miscarriage of Justice". He explained that he joined the Met Police in 1961 and after 3 years in uniform became a detective with the CID, in South London, After talking about various cases, he spoke about a murder case which happened in Woolwich. The murder victim was 25yrs old and her husband was already in prison. When questioned he named a person who had been pestering his wife. This person was arrested and his clothing examined. Mr Wragg pointed out that the scientific data available then was not as sophisticated as it these days, but the blood on the clothing was the same as the victim's. The suspect was found guilty and sentenced. Whilst in prison, after some months, he recalled that he had helped in an accident at work when wearing the clothes that were blood spattered. This led to a second trial which made history, as it was based on evidence not presented at the first trial. At this second trial he was found not guilty. Mr Wragg asked the WI members their thoughts and most of them decided

ActionFraud National Fraud & Cyber Come Reporting Carter

Drivers Targeted With Fake Fines What you need to know

Action Fraud have received an increase in reports and intelligence where elderly victims are being targeted by individuals purporting to be police officers or traffic wardens. The victims are being approached whilst parked in a car park and are told by the suspect that they have parked illegally or broken a speed limit and a photo has been taken of their car for 'evidence'.

Victims are advised that they will face a substantial penalty fine unless they pay a smaller upfront fee immediately. Victims, who opt for paying the smaller penalty, will be directed to a parking meter and asked to enter their card and PIN. These parking meters have been tampered with by the suspect in order to retain the card.

Once the victim inserts their card and are asked for their PIN, the victims are shoulder surfed for their PIN by the suspect. Once victims input their PIN, the card is retained by the machine and victims are told by the suspect to seek help from the company who operates the parking meter or their bank.

What you need to do

If you are suspicious about the authenticity of the fine, do not pay it until you have verified it with your local council.

Always shield your PIN from view when using an ATM machine, and never share your PIN with anyone.

If your bank card is retained by an ATM machine, contact your bank immediately to inform them.
