Findon Parish Council Report – October 2016 2017/18 Village Precept In the next few w

Findon has not increased its precept for the last 3 years, and has one of the lowest Band D costs in West Sussex. To illustrate, Findon's precept costs this financial year for a Band D household are £38.16/household. This compares to Angmering at £88.03, Arundel at £103.70, and £65.46 which is the overall average for council tax in towns and villages in the Arun District Council (ADC) council tax area.

However, the last year has seen a significant drop in our ability to fund village improvements and activities, and the Finance and Governance Committee wishes to give due notice that an increase is now needed, probably of the order of 10%-15%. This would increase our precept from £37,000 to about £41,000, still well below the costs for equivalent villages in the area. To illustrate our needs :-

Our contribution from West Sussex County Council (WSCC) for verge/grass mowing has been reduced from £2700 to £1400, a nearly 50% drop, but we still have to keep the village tidy!

In the next few weeks we should assume ownership of Pond Green from ADC, (legal costs £700), and thereafter care for the Green and its surrounds ourselves, as ADC only cut the green spasmodically, and this area in the centre of the village deserves better care. Should we have spare funds or obtain grants we might then consider putting some children's play equipment on Pond Green.

The Traffic, Environment, People (TEP) Group continue to fine tune their ideas for a major refurbishment of the village square, and although both WSCC and the South Downs National Park Authority (SDNPA) appear to support the ideas and are willing to grant aid, there will be calls on FPC to fund part of the costs.

The Square, Findon Tel: 01903 873202 The play area at Homewood needs expanding and modernising. Ed Wain has taken on the task of coordinating the plans, and is hoping to obtain grants from Tesco, but inevitably will need some funding from FPC.

By early December FPC should have co-opted another new councillor, and be back up to our full complement of 11 councillors. However, whenever we appoint new councillors they have to undergo councillor training courses, this cost has been built into the precept for 2017.

The Operation Watershed work in conjunction with WSCC has benefited Findon, with some major work in 2015/16 along Nepcote Lane. We are now applying for another grant to divert water coming down from Cissbury. As before we are expecting to contribute towards the cost. Last time the cost was $\pounds12,000$, we got a grant of $\pounds9,000$ and made up the difference from FPC Reserves. This time we will budget for a contribution of c. $\pounds2,000$.

The total cost of the above will be more than a 10%-15% increase in our precept, but will mean that we can minimise the extent to which we have to dip into our much depleted reserves.

Findon Neighbourhood Plan (NP)

The plan became part of Planning Law following the referendum on November 3rd, when over 400 residents turned out and voted by 93.3% to approve the adoption of the Findon NP. In spite of the referendum poll being held at the Black Horse rather than the usual venue of the Village Hall, this was a high turnout comparative to other NPs in West Sussex, and is a testament to the high interest that villagers take in the future of the village.

The 70 volunteers who helped Peter Kirk and his Steering Group Team in the 3 year period it took to complete will all be invited to a small celebration in the Village Hall early in the new year, with the Parish Council's gratitude for their hard work.

New Councillor

We are hopeful that the Council will agree to co-opt John Barnett to the last remaining vacancy on the Council at the FPC meeting on December 5th. This would bring our strength back up to our full complement of 11 councillors. John was for many years (2002-2010) a committee member of the Sheep Fair before work and family commitments took precedence, and in the family tradition will succeed his brother Mike Barnett who served as both District and Parish Councillor in 2010-2013. John lives at St Francis Cottage in Soldier's Field Lane, has lived in the village for over 20 years, and is passionate about the future of the village.

News from PAWS Animal Sanctuary

After such a lovely long warm summer I cannot believe how cold it is at night. All our rescued cats have electrically heated beds and heat lamps in the rabbits and the guinea-pig's quarters. We offered to take in a local Pubs "Pets Corner" rabbits and guinea-pigs to keep them warm for the winter (as they were kept outside). We picked them up and put them in the Van. Within minutes the heavens opened and we experienced the worst downpour ever. Thank goodness we picked the little creatures up just in time, they would have been flooded and half drowned if they had stayed out in their pens in the pub garden.

One morning our lawns and paths were white with a very heavy frost, and the water in our horse trough was frozen solid. Fortunately we had turned the pond heater on and all the fish were crowded around the heater and pushing one another to get to the heat. we placed a bird peanut holder over the metal heater to stop the fish from burning their noses!

We worry about owners keeping their rabbits and guinea-pigs outside in this weather. It's dark by 4.30pm and the guinea-pigs need their hutches to be in a shed ideally with a greenhouse heater or heat lamp, and an electric light for feeding them in the evenings. Thankfully we bought a new hen house this year, so all the hens are out of draughts and tucked up at night on their perches or in the nest boxes. One hen was very poorly lying on the ground with her eyes closed. We feared the worst and put her in a box of hay inside in the warm. She was keeping her feet tightly curled and couldn't stand up. I read somewhere that

people with bad feet should soak their feet every day in a bowl of warm water and Epsom salts, so every day I soaked and rubbed her feet in the warm and Epsom salt water mix. After a week she could open and spread her toes and stand up. We bought a bottle of chicken remedy (Lifeguard) and vitamin drops to add to the drinking water which she immediately drank. She is now eating and drinking well and can walk a few wobbly steps. Everyone who comes in comments on how she is improving each day. One of Sheila's hens was limping so she also tried soaking her feet in the Epsom salts & warm water remedy. It worked like a miracle and she no longer limps!

We sit here and wait and remember the days, we were treated so fondly, with our cute baby ways.

Once we were little but we grew and we grew, we are no longer young and no longer new. Out the back door we were thrown like the trash, no longer wanted, why were they so rash?

Put out in the garden, or, worse left to roam. Abandoned, unwanted, and out of a home. Or, they drop us off here and bid us goodbye, "Maybe, somebody else will give us a try".

Now here we all are, confused and alone, in a sanctuary with others all needing a home. Dogs, rabbits, guinea-pigs, cats young and old, safe now at PAWS, all brought in from the cold.

If you can't adopt us, no room at the inn, could you help with Vet's bills, or fill our food bin. Please, make a donation, help pay for the heat Or help buy us something for Christmas to eat.

The people that care for us want us to live and, more of us will if more people give....

One of our rabbits went on a weeks trial to a new home to be with a lonely female rabbit who's boyfriend had died. The lady put the rabbits next to one another in separate pens before trying them together. But the female hated poor Ollie, and she beat him up and wouldn't have anything to do with him - so he was returned to us again. When he was let out he came running up to me. He is so happy to be back and is following me everywhere and wants stroking all the time. He was a house rabbit at one time so we don't shut him in and he jumps in and out of a hutch near the floor. A ginger tabby cat arrived in a neglected condition. Unable to eat properly because of bad teeth, and sores along his back caused by fleas and all his coat matted underneath. We rushed him to the Vets who shaved the matted coat and removed seven teeth, and had to have his gums stitched. He is such a lovely friendly cat, purring all the time and now looking beautifully fluffy with white feet. He is so good and takes his antibiotic tablets without any fuss, and he loves his food.

Veterinary Advice

December has come round very quickly! We have welcomed lots of new clients to the surgery over the past year and look forward to seeing more in the New Year.

Throughout December we will be holding a raffle with proceeds going to PAWS animal charity with a chance to win a hamper! Tickets will be available from the Findon surgery reception.

With the weather getting colder we see gritters out and about. While this makes conditions safer for us to walk and drive, the rock salt can be toxic to dogs if too much is ingested. So remember to clean paws after a walk.

Christmas time at a veterinary surgery always seems to be even more busy than usual - possibly because of all the extra temptations around for our pets to get hold of.

I can remember my first Christmas on call. I was working in mixed practice in Shropshire and spent a straight 72 hours awake performing surgery. This included a caesarean on dairy cows in the early

hours of the morning in a leaky barn surrounded by snow, and fixing a broken leg on a stray cat who one of the nurses took on with the new name of Santa.

Last Christmas at the surgery here was fairly busy - dogs eating boxes of chocolates, and bones from roast lamb, cats eating tinsel etc. We also had a critically ill dog (who I had performed intestinal surgery on the day before) who thoroughly enjoyed her roast turkey on Christmas day!

Remember that if you do have any concerns over the Christmas period and you feel your pet needs urgent attention then we are available 24/7 over the Christmas and New year period.

FINDON'S WINTER SNOW of Long Ago By Valerie Martin



Here's some portrayals of snowy scenes. Hopefully some you will not have previously seen....

Pictured left is the original Black Horse on the left hand side of the High Street (looking northwards) way back in the early 1900's.

The view in the snow on the right is in the early 1900's. Looking South from Chanctonbury Ring over the hamlet of Buddington (now long gone) and to Cissbury Ring. A track winds through the trees past Upper Buddington Farm - and cottages (with well), now covered in



undergrowth. I explored the area back in 2003 and could only find a few remaining foundations.

Some of the Buddngton children headed southwards on foot each day for their education at School Hill in Findon. Sometimes in the winter, due to the dark or mist, they were late and got the cane. The teacher was aware of the distance they had to travel across the downland and fields but this did not stop them children being punished.



To help the pupils get to school on time (and back home at night in the mist or dark) one of the concerned and thoughtful Buddington fathers laid beacons of large lumps of chalk along the way to guide them.



Pictured above is the bakery and the Forge in Nepcote Lane (looking west) in the snow - early 1900s.

Finally (below) I take you into nearby Worthing just prior to Christmas eighty-four years ago. The picture depicts a flower seller in South Street on Christmas Eve back in 1932.
