

From the Rectory

Writing this, we have just had our Remembrance Sunday Service, with a packed church and prayers of thanksgiving as we looked back to remember with gratitude those whose dedication and service have made the freedom we enjoy possible. It was wonderful to see villagers from every generation gathering together to give thanks, to see rows of medals from the World War, including the Légion d'honneurs, awarded to Fitzroy Somerset earlier this year, to more recent Service medals from service across the world worn by one of our young Dads. We have so much to thank our armed forces, past and current, for! Moving on, when you read this, Advent will have started, and with this, our preparation for Christmas. Just as we all get ready in our homes for Christmas, preparing special food, sending cards and greetings, buying and wrapping presents, so we also need to prepare our own hearts for the coming of Jesus. Without Jesus, there would be no 'Christmas'! I wonder what this means to you as you read.... On Advent Sunday, this year 3rd December, the Church of England begins a new year, changing from the Gospel of Matthew to Mark for many of the Sunday readings through the year. Our Diocesan Bishop, Martin Warner, has also declared this to be a Year of Prayer. There will be many extra opportunities through the year to try out different ways of praying (as well as those familiar to us) and I would encourage you all to get involved. Why not write a simple prayer and hang it on the Lady Chapel Altar during our Christmas Tree Festival?

So, what is prayer? If I asked you, I'd get many different responses, all of them valid! The simplest answer I believe is

that prayer is **communication**. Whether you believe in God or not, there are times when we ponder over things – whether the beauty of the natural world or what appears an insurmountable problem and that pondering could be classed as prayer to someone or something outside our own selves, something greater than we are. As a Christian, for me prayer is communication with God. That means speaking to God and, more importantly, listening to him too. Reading the Gospels, we can see that Jesus often turned to his heavenly Father in prayer, seeking a guiet place where he could be alone; this may be how you like to pray too. Other people find being in a large crowd, praising and praying together, is uplifting. As I said, there are many answers to the question, 'What is prayer?' and many ways to pray. If you'd like a chat about prayer, please get in touch and we can meet up over a cup of coffee!

Returning to Advent preparations, as you carefully plan what presents to give to loved ones this year, have you considered giving a present to Jesus? It is his 'birthday' after all! If you are in a position to make a donation to church funds, it helps us maintain our outreach into the community, or you might consider making an extra donation to another charity. There are boxes at our supermarkets for people to donate to food banks, supporting families who struggle with making ends meet, or you might like to wrap a gift of toiletries, socks or gloves for a homeless person this Christmas. If these are left at the back of the church or in the Rectory porch, I will ensure they arrive with WCHP before Christmas.

Wishing you all a holy and prayerful Advent, a joyful Christmas and a peaceful new year in 2018.

Findon Community Shop and Post Office Update

The inaugural shareholders meeting was held at Cissbury barns late in November and was very well attended. We heard from Helen and Dee about the shop finances and it was clear they have everything under control. Then there was an opportunity to ask questions which brought up a few good points. It became clear that there are still many villagers who don't realise the Post Office counter is open whenever the shop is open, this is actually a contractual requirement. This means we have banking services available from 6am-7pm Monday- Saturday and on Sunday mornings. You can pay cheques and cash into all of the major banks and withdraw cash like you can from any cash machine. There is no need to trawl down to the town just to go to the bank, you can do it right here in the village. We can also provide bureau de change services, Euros are kept in stock but all currencies are available to order. We sell gift cards, you can pay your utility bills, top up phone credit, the list goes on and on. Just pop in and ask if there is anything you are unsure about.

There are also lots of people unaware that it is still possible to become a shareholder. We want the collective to be open to anyone who would like to feel invested in our shop. There may be new residents who just moved here and would like to join the project or existing villagers who find themselves able to invest and if so please contact Jan Vandevelde, Company Secretary, at findoncommunityshop@gmail.com.

There has been great positivity towards the range of stock in the shop. Auds has worked really hard to try and select a good broad range. One of the things that hasn't changed is the milk. We are continuing to support local farmer Charlie Hughes who has a herd and dairy over at Bury. Southview Farm is unusual in that the milk is pasteurised and bottled on site and we buy direct from the farm. There has been much talk in the media in recent years about the threat to farms caused by super markets refusing to pay a fair price for milk. In many instances the farmer is receiving less than the cost of producing the milk resulting in many farms going out of business. We feel it's really important to make an ethical choice to support a local farm, even if that results in paying a few more pence for milk. As a rural community we should be supporting those who are working hard to maintain the sustainability of agriculture. Charlie and his family have run the farm for three generations and he won Sussex farmer of the year 2016.

Should you find there is something missing in the shop then please pop a slip into the suggestions pot on the counter. We have been really grateful to those reminding us about products such as shoes laces, almond and soya milk and diabetic and gluten free products to name just a few, all of which are now in stock.

We will be holding a celebration and ribbon cutting to mark the **opening of the shop at 5pm on 3rd December** directly before the switching on of the Christmas lights on Pond Green. The shop will then be open for the evening celebrations until 6.30pm and I hope to see many of you there.

Operation Watershed

After the recent successful completion of two road drainage schemes (the major one in Nepcote Lane next to Nepcote Green and the other at the bottom of Stable Lane) we are pursuing an application for further schemes in the Village with the aim of reducing flood risk.

Christmas Lights

With Christmas fast approaching it is pleasing to report that with financial

support from the Parish Council and the Sheep Fair, a new set of lights have been purchased and the Team led by Corrine, Gez, Mike and Jan will be putting up the lights in the centre of the Village. There will be a grand switching on of the lights on Pond Green on Sunday 3rd December at 17.30 followed by carol singing by the pupils of St John the Baptist School .

Remembrance Day

The Remembrance Day Service on 12th November at Findon Church proved particularly poignant with a long list of the names of the fallen in two World Wars and other conflicts read out from the Roll of Honour. For Findon the number was 52. For Clapham 13 and Patching 7. For Findon these included 2 families who each lost 3 members. What a devastating blow that must have been.

Former Serviceman present at the Service included one in his 90's who fought in Normandy in WW2 and had recently received the Légion d'Honneur and another from a younger generation who saw service in Bosnia . Wreaths were laid at the Memorial in the Churchyard .

Progress on the Updated Findon Neighbourhood Development Plan

Following on from our progress report last month the Working Group are now inviting everyone in the parish to take part in a second ranking survey consultation on the available and deliverable sites that can be considered for housing in the Draft Updated Neighbourhood Plan. The ranking survey form will be very similar to the one that many people completed in late August/early September, but this time will include the Wyevale site, which the owner has put forward as a housing allocation site in association with a new, replacement garden centre. Remember the updated Neighbourhood Plan is for the period up to 2035 so there would be no immediate plans to undertake any redevelopment of the Wyevale site for up to eight years and any proposals would definitely include a modern garden

centre as well as some housing. The housing requirement for Findon would also remain at around 30 dwellings between now and 2035 so the inclusion of a further site to rank in a second survey does not involve any increase in the number of dwellings for Findon.

As before ranking forms will be delivered to every household in the parish and you will have the opportunity to rank your preferences either by handing in the form at the Community Store/Post Office or electronically via the survey monkey web portal. Illustrative proposals for the Wyevale site will be available to view on the Findon Parish Council website and the Findon Village website.

This second ranking consultation will run during the first two weeks in December. Every person in the parish can complete a ranking form, all we would ask is that under 16 year olds add 'under 16' at the end of the form. Additional forms will be available at the Community Store/Post Office and of course individual family members can each complete an electronic form.

Last time we had a really good response from more than 25% of the population (of all ages) and 33% of households, hopefully we can reach that level of response again. It will very much help the Working Group when they come to finalise the draft Updated Neighbourhood Plan at the end of the year, the preferences of the community for the location of future housing will carry a lot of weight in the final version of the Updated Plan.







Would you pay more to support policing in Sussex?

Sussex Police & Crime Commissioner Katy Bourne writes: "This year, we have seen police officers and staff nationally, along with other emergency services, respond with skill and bravery as they play their part in the substantial security effort around the recent terror attacks which have hit the UK. In response, the Government is increasing the money it spends on tackling terrorism, including an amount for policing.

"Further investment is also working to tackle the national threat of cyber crime, which is affecting businesses and individuals across the country. With the new frontline for policing increasingly becoming our front rooms and children's bedrooms – where crimes are being committed down the phone line and behind screens - we have to recognise that the policing we see is not necessarily all the policing we get to keep us safe. "I know that residents support Sussex Police in preparing for threats like terrorism and cyber crime but I'm also aware that issues closer to home, such as anti-social behaviour, are affecting local people.

"In previous years, the Chief Constable has asked for my help to raise more funds to invest in specific areas of policing, including public protection, community investigation and armed response. Thanks to the money you've already contributed through your council tax, Sussex Police has been able to build its capacity and capabilities in these areas, and others, to deliver a more effective and efficient service to the public.

"Now we need your help to sustain this service. All public services have to find

significant financial savings and Sussex Police is no exception. The force has already saved £70m since 2010 and the Chief Constable's Local Policing Plan is working towards delivering further savings over the next four years. "I know the changes Sussex Police has made to its policing model are taking some getting used to but it's vital that the force reshapes its neighbourhood policing teams to meet the challenges of 21st century policing.

"The Chief Constable and I are continuing to work together to drive further reform and substantial progress has already been made through collaboration with local and regional partners and through investment in mobile technology. "I want to help Sussex Police explore and identify all opportunities for investment. That is why I have carried out a review of the amount of money Sussex Police holds in its reserves and released £15m to reduce the impact of reductions in police officer numbers. I've done this because I recognise the scale of the impact that these changes are having on the police and the public, and I remain committed to investing in local policing. "I am also seeking further sources of external funding, including contributions from new building developments that lead to increased demand on local services. I – and other Police & Crime Commissioners - continue to negotiate with the Government for more funding for policing, as well as asking for the removal of the current 'cap' on the police precept. News from PAWS Animal Sanctuary

This morning a lady and her daughter, walking their dogs at Cissbury Ring, picked up an injured dove. They kindly brought it in to PAWS. I treated the injured wing and put the dove in a hutch in the warm with food and water. The next visitor said "Oh I see you have a Turtle Dove!" I looked up Turtle Doves to see if we have in fact got a Turtle Dove. But it should have a pinkish head and orange and brown scalloped wing markings underneath with a zebra striped thumb mark on the nape. Ours had none of these markings so we have an ordinary dove. The sad thing is that Turtle Doves are probably now extinct because they Winter in sub-Saharan Africa where they are hunted as sport being shot as they try to return to the UK. The birds are then under habitat pressure here in breeding grounds in the summer returning to farms that no longer provide seed rich plants for the doves to feed on. The shy summer visitor was a favourite of Chaucer who praised the bird for its lasting pair bonding. In 2002 the UK was down to fewer than 1,000 pairs! With extinction a real possibility, this is nothing short of a wildlife disaster. The RSPB were alarmed by its uncontrollable decline. So, the Turtle Dove's place in The Twelve Days of Christmas Carol may soon be obsolete. How sad. The little Shitzu (that kept biting everyone) that we found a home for last month has settled in very happily. The new lady owner is a carer to William an elderly gentleman with dementia. She told us not only is he a very well behaved happy little dog but that he loves William who is his favourite! On Sunday we were asked to take a rabbit who's owner had died. The rabbit was terrified. We were told he was

never picked up. He was matted over every part of his body with nails so long they were curled under his feet. He is very old also blind in one eye. It took hours to cut all the matts and tangles out. We cut his nails and put him in a nice big pen covered in hay. He didn't have a name so we have called him Kevin. All the Volunteers are so happy to see how happy he is. He hops and thumps and loves his food, and loves to be picked up and groomed. All our surplus goldfish have now gone

All our surplus goldfish have now gone to new ponds. The baby ones were collected in buckets by local residents. Also some of the big ones were given away. We try not to have too many goldfish but they insist in breeding every year.
