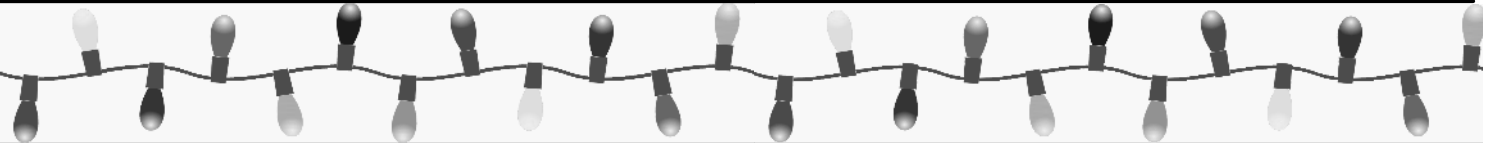

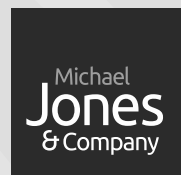

From The Rectory

Another year over, where does the time go? As I write to meet today's deadline for the magazine, I'm aware that we've just celebrated the Feast of Christ the King – the last Sunday of this Church year. Unlike the secular world, our New Year begins on Advent Sunday (27th November this year) not January 1st with the calendar! Advent literally means the arrival of a notable person or thing; we might speak of the advent of computer technology for example.

For Christians, Advent is the 4 week period before Christmas, a time of preparation to welcome the Christ child anew into our hearts on Christmas morning. In many homes, preparation for Christmas means frenzied activity. Spending money we may not actually have to spare, fretting over what present to buy for each relative or friend – will they like it? Will it fit? Christian Advent is, or should be, a time of prayer and reflection, as we think about how God loves the world he created so much that he gave his only Son as a ransom for many, giving thanks and seeking to serve our God better in our daily lives

In the current financial climate, we all need to take stock, to think about how and where we spend our money. For many the choices are stark; food or warmth. 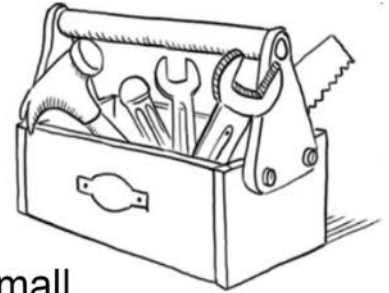

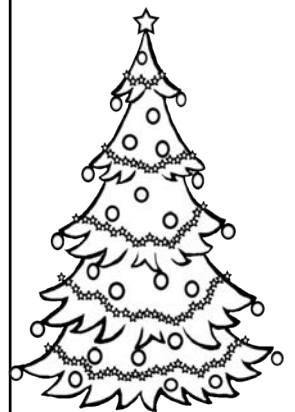

Findon's Dairy History. Part 2

Many, many, years ago I worked with an old cowman called Ruben Barnard. 'I come from a place that I don't expect you have ever heard of, a little village tucked in the downs behind Worthing called Findon. I worked for Col. Thynne at Muntham Farm. We had the first cow in Europe to give 3,000 gallons in a year. I groomed her, fed her and milked her three times a day. In the mornings I'd take her for a walk along a track over the downs, past the Thynne cemetery and on to a dew pond by the main road. Here she would have a good drink and then wander back, grazing as she went.'

(Tolmare pond has long gone. Drained by the army in W. W. II. But I believe that there are still Barnard's in Findon.)

If we go back to 1919, we find Horace Hale at Tolmare being very successful with his Friesian herd. His neighbour, Col. Urlic Thynne, thought he would do the same. He built a model dairy and cow-stall and, using his considerable wealth, bought the best cows in the country. This herd was called the Hache herd for some reason that I don't understand. Its life was all too short, 1919-1928. Was this herd a victim of the inter-war years farming depression, or was it missing the expertise of master breeder Horace Hale? Despite its short life this herd made a difference to the breed.

Those were the days before artificial insemination and it was said that a bull was half of the herd. The trouble was that after three years his daughters were becoming mature so he then had a limited use. Farmers got over this by sharing bulls. Horace Hale and Col. Thynne shared a very good bull called Hedges Second Series. I find this an intriguing partnership between a working farmer and a military gentleman.

Today A.I. has long been used to spread the influence of good bulls. Sometimes referred to as the 'Bull in the Bowler Hat'.

Its early use prompted a parody of a Kipling poem, 'Take up the White Man's Burden.'

*Take up the New Bull's burden,
In patience to abide
While smooth young men in overalls,
Disperse you far and wide.*

Findon Parish Council (FPC) has just been advised by West Sussex County Council (WSCC) Cabinet Member for Environment and Climate Change Cllr Deborah Urquhart that she has approved the FPC application for an Operation Watershed grant. The purpose of Operation Watershed is to support people in their local communities who want to work with the County Council to become more prepared for, or to reduce the risk of, flooding. This work will build on and further enhance the benefit to the community as a whole, local businesses, and the many walkers, cyclists and horse riders living in or visiting Findon, as well as protecting the integrity of Findon Park Road and adjacent properties.

You will no doubt be aware of the new and very visible No U Turn signage on the A24 northbound opposite the Black Horse pub. FPC has been made

aware that there are vehicles ignoring this legal signage as they come out of the Findon Garden Centre and doing a U Turn to travel back south on the A24, rather than use the Findon Roundabout. It is only a matter of time before an accident occurs and FPC will be contacting Sussex Police on this matter.

The Open Spaces Volunteers Working Group and the Litter Clearance Group continue their good work in the village – if you see them in their Hi Viz jackets during December, I am sure they would not turn down an offer of a mince pie or two !!

Finally, as the Festive Season is now upon us and the Xmas Lights are in the village centre, we wish everyone a peaceful Xmas and New Year.

Dedicated Wild Flower Areas for Findon Village

Paws Animal Sanctuary

Late one night in the pouring rain, a man rang from Horsham to say "There is a cat and three kittens living in a huge hedge in my front garden". I said "Well don't leave them there, go and bring them in out of the rain". I then heard the usual excuses "They're not mine, I have rung all the other rescues but they won't come out and help". I rang David one of our volunteers who said he would get up early and go and rescue them in the morning. Easier said than done. As soon as the kittens saw David they were off into the next garden. He wore thick gauntlets but was still scratched all over his arms, neck and face from the hedge and the blackberry bushes and one of the kittens who bit through a glove. He used our cat trap but only managed to catch mum twice! He let her go each time so the kittens would stay around. He returned for four days and with a giant trap borrowed from the City Cat Shelter in Brighton he managed to trap them all by November 5th. We were so relieved.

We were worried about them running off if the fireworks were bad. We now have them all safe in the warm and will now have their inoculations and flea and worm treatments sorted.

We had the usual fireworks going off for a week upsetting the animals. Not as bad as other years, but all the hens stopped laying, and Bruno one of our rescued dogs was terrified and now is so traumatised he follows me all day everywhere and won't settle at night. He keeps barking, won't go to bed, and just keeps pacing up and down even though he is worn out. A couple of the bangs were so loud he was sick everywhere.

We had two wasps nests all summer and had to avoid them, but luckily none of the volunteers got stung. Apparently they all die off in winter. As do the bees, only the queens survive when they hibernate. I asked Alexa.

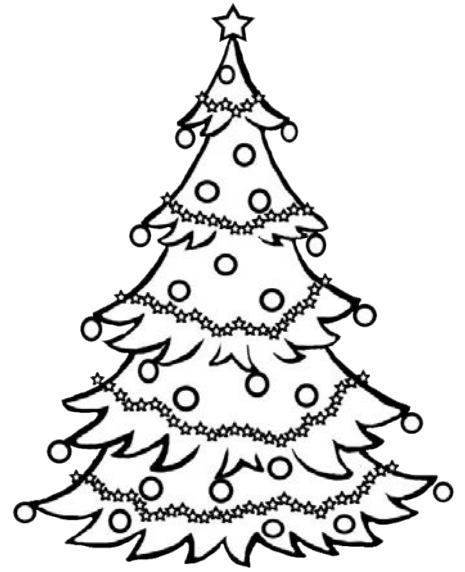
