# From The Rectory

The lychgate at Findon Church has been decorated with Union Jack bunting for the last few weeks in celebration of the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III. One can imagine it would have been similarly decorated for the coronation of our late and much-loved Queen Elizabeth in 1953 and going back a little further, in celebration of the Allied victory at the end of the Second World War. So the sight of bunting fluttering in the wind is a reminder of the passage of time.

The Coronation was of course a great historical event in the life of our nation. King Charles has now taken his place in a long line of monarchs going back to Egbert, the first king of All England in the 9th century.

One of the things I love about our three churches is the real sense of history and continuity with the past that you get from being around such ancient buildings. It is fascinating to think what people would have worn and what the interior would have looked like down the centuries. Findon Church doesn't go back quite as far as Egbert, but the earliest parts of the church building, including the north wall of the nave are dated to 11th Century, at about the time of the conquest. It seems that like most churches there has been a fair amount of change, particularly in those early centuries as it was enlarged, presumably to cater for a growing population.

Our churches have seen many monarchs come and go. Of course, a change of monarch would have been of a far greater significance in the centuries past, especially around the time of the Reformation. I imagine there would be a good deal of fear or perhaps eager anticipation as to what was to come following a change of ruler in those days.

Even today, there is a vital link between the Coronation and Church, for the Coronation is a liturgical rite that goes back to Old Testament times in the anointing of Kings and consecration of Priests. So, the Coronation was held in a place of worship and within a Eucharist, which is the fundamental form of worship in the Christian Church, and one that we celebrate each Sunday. Those who have since complained that the ceremony was 'too religious' have somehow missed this. At our services on the Coronation Weekend we included special prayers for the King, Queen and Royal Family and we sang the National Anthem. It was also very good to see the wonderful sense of community spirit in the celebration of the Big Lunch and so good was the turn-out that the BBQ at Findon Village Hall soon ran out of food. It was pointed out to Helena that Jesus didn't run out of food when he provided lunch for 5000. In fact he had 12 baskets of leftovers after everyone had their fill. She said she is still working on that one!



#### Findon Parish Council News

The new four-year term for the Parish Council started on 9 May 2023 following an uncontested election. At the time of writing, FPC has five councillors (Cllrs Martin, Wilson, Gilbert, Hellett, and Robinson) and six vacancies by way of co-option. It is hoped that new councillors may be considered for co-option at the FPC meeting on 22 May 2023.

The defibrillator on the Antiques Shop wall in The Square has now been relocated to the flint wall at the Village Stores adjacent to the Notice Boards. A second defibrillator is located at 1 Nepcote on the flint wall facing Nepcote Green and FPC is actively

looking to provide additional defibrillators in the parish.

# **Email Received by Findon News**

Where Did Findon Play Cricket in 1823?

On 21 June 1823 the Brighton Herald reported that Findon cricketers played the Highdown Hill Club at Findon Stone Walls on 13 June. The Findon side included three given men from Storrington. In those days it was not unusual for village sides to be strengthened by players from other villages. It was also not unusual for bets to be laid on the results of matches and in this instance the betting was in favour of Highdown.

However, time did not permit the match to be played out as, whilst Findon batted twice scoring 91 and 90 runs, Highdown batted only once for 95 thereby topping Findon's first innings score by 4 runs.

The match was also reported on by the New Globe newspaper on 23 June 1823. The return match at the Highdown ground took place on 7 July and was again reported by the Brighton Herald.

# Findon Village Gardens Association

At the April meeting we had a talk by Geoff Hawkins, who entertained us with his talk on bugs. Geoff was a font of all knowledge on the many and varied bugs to be found in our gardens and I'm sure that members left with a slightly different perspective on our insects.

This week we also had a day trip for a coach full of members to Kew Gardens. We left Findon to cloudy skies, but with the hope that the weather forecast of sunshine would hold true. Unfortunately, the sunshine didn't appear until we were on the coach on the way home, but a good day was had by all. Kew is a 300 acre garden which, on a day trip, is a challenge to take in. Some took the Kew Explorer to save their legs a little, but there is so much to see it is impossible to do it all in a day.

We visited the Waterlily House, with its 10 metre pond containing the beautiful waterlily blooms of various colours, and the Santa Cruz waterlilies with their lily pads which grow up to two metres wide. Then on to the Palm House, which was built between 1844 and 1848 and contains 16,000 curved panes of glass, offering a hot and humid environment for tropical plants to thrive. It feels like a jungle inside, with huge trees, the leaves of which often encroach on to the paths. Among the specimens is a remarkable, recordbreaking plant - the Eastern Cape giant cycad. Weighing more than a tonne and measuring over four metres in height, this cycad is the oldest pot plant in the world, arriving at Kew in 1775. The design of the Palm House is based on the upturned hull of a ship, as the architects borrowed techniques from the ship building industry to help them with this massive glasshouse.

From the hot and humid palm house to the cooler and even bigger Temperate House, which was opened in 1868 and is the largest surviving Victorian glasshouse in the world. It did however, take 40 years to

complete as construction began in 1859 and the two side wings were not opened until 1899. From there to the Treetop Walkway – an 18 metre high circular walkway through the trees.

The 50 metre high Great Pagoda was completed in 1762 as a gift for Princess Augusta, the founder of the Gardens, and has been completely restored in recent years. The original 80 gold-gilded dragons that adorned the building were removed in 1784 and have never been seen since. However, they have now been recreated and look spectacular, even if the ones on the upper floors are 3D printed! The 80 dragons reduce in size as they ascend the 10 floors of the building. Starting at 2.3m from nose to tail they shrink down to just under 1m in length at the tenth level.

The most modern of the glasshouses at Kew is the Princess of Wales Conservatory. There we enjoyed many different zones, from the dry area with its stunning cacti, to carnivorous plants, to orchids and tropical plants, including the Titan Arum. The huge flower of this plant was growing (very quickly) but thankfully was not open when we visited, as it apparently smells like rotting flesh!

Rock gardens, kitchen gardens and the alpine house all had to be passed in a rush, as we ran out of time, but maybe next time?

At our regular monthly meeting on 30th June our speaker will be David Standing, who will be discussing cottage gardens.

Everyone is welcome to meetings. We meet on the last Friday of the month at 7.30pm in the Village Hall Members £2, Non Members £3, Annual Membership £5.

# Have you made a digital legacy?

When you make a will, you arrange to leave your physical assets and money to beneficiaries such as family members, friends, acquaintances or favourite charities. If you don't make a will, the decision will probably be made in court.

Nowadays, however, most people also leave behind various online assets, including profiles, email accounts, posts and other content in social media and content sharing accounts, as well as files stored in the cloud. Not many people think about this, and the consequences to those who succeed them if they are lost, or if the online accounts associated with them are simply deleted. If you want to protect the assets and your successors, you really should make provision by leaving a digital legacy.

# What are the risks of not having a digital legacy?

All of those precious memories in the form of photos, videos and favourite music libraries – as well as posts, comments and conversations on social media – will be inaccessible to family and friends, and possibly lost for all time. Successors may be unable to maintain links with close contacts as they cannot gain access to them. And

on a more practical level, they not be able to close accounts – including bank, credit card, building society and online store accounts – held in your name.

#### Where to start

Your first priority should be to ensure that online accounts which involve payment information can be immediately closed down upon your death to prevent fraud or identity theft, or continued legitimate payments taken. These include banking, shopping/auction sites, utilities, telecoms, entertainment, gaming, gambling and dating sites. The respective companies or sites should be able to advise on what course of action to take.

There are a number of ways to help ensure that digital assets will not get lost after your death. There are too many websites and online services to mention in this article, so some of the most widely used are listed on the Get Safe Online website at www.getsafeonline.org/personal/articles /digital-legacies. The main thing to remember is to include your wishes regarding all or individual accounts – including logins and other access details – in your will and lodging it securely with your solicitor.


