Findon Parish Council Report – February 2016

The Findon Neighbourhood Plan was ratified by Findon Parish Council (FPC) on 25 January 2016 to proceed to the next phase and has been formally passed to the South Downs National Park Authority (SDNPA) for the six week Regulation 15 Consultation - more details on the FPC website http://findon.arun.gov.uk I am sure that everyone would like to congratulate Lead CIIr Kirk and the Steering Group members for all their hard work to get the Plan this far.

As mentioned in last month's report FPC was delighted that Melissa Oligario was appointed to the Council on 25 January 2016. Melissa has been involved in village life since childhood, having spent many happy years riding around the South Downs on her four legged friend. Having moved into the village six years ago, Melissa is keen to help preserve the village and ensure of its continued success, for residents and visitors alike. Melissa is currently in her final year at university studying Building Surveying and has a ten year old daughter who attends the village school.

As many of you may have seen, work has started to clear the 'jungle' of undergrowth by the Glebe Land, following the preparatory work undertaken earlier by Cllr Young. This is being carried out by supervised Community Service workers as directed by Open Spaces and further clearance days are planned over the next few weekends. Open Spaces Working Parties, led by Cllrs Carr and Henty, have also been busy clearing the paths along the west side of the A24. If you would like to volunteer to help with such outdoor activities please contact Cllr Carr on 01903 873596 or email grdcarr@outlook.com . The tree damage caused at Nepcote Green pond during the recent gale force winds has been removed by AC Gardens.

Whilst on the subject of Nepcote Green, please can we ask that all horse riders refrain from cantering or galloping across the Green when dog walkers are present, or when the ground is soft as it badly damages the Green.

A new Notice Board will shortly be erected on Nepcote Green which can be used for charitable events only and FPC notices. This will be funded entirely by the Tinner family in memory of their parents John (Johanes) and Maureen Tinner. Other community notices can still be placed in the appropriate area of the Notice Board outside the newsagents.

The next FPC will be on Monday 7 March at 7.30pm and prior to the meeting, there will be an initial consultation presentation by the People, Environment and Transport (PET) Working Group starting at 6.30pm. More details are in PET flyers around the village. [also see page 16]

A Gardener's View

The good news is our episode (No. 5) of Monty Dons "Big Dreams Small Spaces" will air 1st March at 7pm on BBC 2... time for me to get nervous! I would also like to thank everyone for coming to the Findon garden association talk. It was my first time publicly speaking.

The more I garden the more I find my obsession with growing vegetables grows (pardon the pun) sometimes I have to remind myself that the garden should also include flowers and shrubs and when reminded of this I remember just how wonderful all aspects of the garden are.

I love growing anything and everything and last year I managed to get hold of another greenhouse to sit aside the one I currently have, so I am looking forward to doubling the bounty this year - with a little luck.

March is what I've been waiting for since the end of Autumn; it's when everything starts to come together. I am back on my regular gardening round and managing to get an hours gardening at home with the increasing daylight. Some jobs I will be getting on with are:

Planting out early potatoes - bare in mind the soil should be starting to

warm up and remember that new growth can easily be damaged by spring frost.

Plant onion sets - it's best to incorporate some general fertiliser poultry manure to get them off to a good start

Empty compost bin - It's great to start the season with empty bins. If your compost hasn't broken down as much as you would like it can still be used around the base of shrubs and tress.

Harvest leeks - this will be my last harvest from 2015

Sow more sweet peas and start sowing in the greenhouse or window sill annuals such a cosmos and Antirrhinum's

Clear weeds from borders - try to get them early before they flower and set seed. It is also a good time to dig out any bindweed as the new shoots will be appearing.

Out Dammed Spot

Noman Allcorn recalls a local story about the dreaded 'Black Spot'.

It is strange how a memory can be sparked by a smell, a sight, or a song. In this case it was black spot on my roses!

Around 1970 Tolmare Farm decided to grow beans in the field west of Findon roundabout and south of the A280. This field (for reasons lost in time) is called "The Pride and the Glory." - The field on the opposite side of the road is called "The Wicks". In 2015 both fields grew maize which was cut for silage for the dairy herd. This more recent practice has been made possible by the breeding of early maturing strains of maize.

Back in 1970 beans (and peas) were a good crop to grow being high in protein. When ground up with barley they were a balanced ration for milk production. Also, being a legume, they took nitrogen from the air and transferred it to the soil for the benefit of the following crops. That was the upside, there was

unfortunately a downside. The beans needed to be harvested when the seed was hard but before the pods spilt and the beans fell to the ground. Rain could spoil this short period and the crop could be lost. Other problems were that field beans are a variety of broad beans and, as many gardeners will know, are susceptible to Black Fly, Rust and Black Spot.

The choice was to spray the field with a mixture of pesticide and fungicide. These days most spraying is done by narrow wheeled tractors using the "tramline" method but in this case aerial spraying was chosen. The crop spraying firm used a helicopter instead of the more usual fixed wing aircraft. On the appointed day, a stiff westerly breeze was blowing. There were trees both ends of the field and a road to one side - these may have been the reasons that the helicopter did not get down very low. The result was that a considerable portion of the spray drifted over the village.

That year the roses bloomed exceptionally well with very little black spot!!!

TEP update (Traffic environment people)

Findon News has previously reported on the work being done by a group of volunteers and Parish Councillors to try and make the village safer and even more visually attractive. There are difficulties of course. How can children going to school or pedestrians going to the shops been separated from the cars when the conservation area of the Square and much of School Hill has no pavements? How can we maintain the village's long association with horses if the narrow roads attract more and more traffic? What can be done to encourage a bit of common sense in those inconsiderate or thoughtless people who see no problem in parking on both sides of the High Street making it impossible for large vehicles and buses to get through? And what about those of us

who are not quite as mobile as we once were and need to park near the Post Office or butchers when car parking is so limited? Nor should we forget to mention in passing (but hopefully not overtaking) the Stirling Moss aspirants who confuse the narrow lanes with the Mille Miglia or Festival of Speed.

The easy answer would be more signs, yellow lines, speed restrictions such as road humps and the whole package of conventional urban solutions. However, there is a downside and it is very obvious. None of this is in keeping with the wish of most residents to preserve and enhance the beauty and unique feel of a very special semi-rural village, with many old and listed building, beautiful tree lined lanes and direct access to the South Downs and Cissbury.



The experience is valued by ramblers, dog walkers, horse riders and cyclists and yes... the people of Findon who would like to pass this on to future generations to enjoy as they have done. So too would South Downs National Park who have recently published their views in a document called "Roads in the South Downs".

So the challenge for Findon and all of us living here is to resolve some of these issues while enhancing and conserving the appearance of a semi-rural village. Could the Square be enhanced and made to look and feel a little different? Not a crossroads but shared space with possibly some seats, gateways and different road surfaces to set up the psychological signals to motorists that this is shared space with pedestrians. Could some of our lanes be designated as Quiet Lanes? Can we slow the traffic without ubiquitous road signs?

So – to the point. On March the 7th at 6.30pm in the Village Hall there will be a presentation of some ideas drawn up

by the TEP group. The meeting will start promptly and finish before 7.30pm to make way for the Parish Council Meeting. Questions and suggestions will be welcome both before, at and in the weeks following the meeting. So if you are interested then look out for the sketches drawn by David Hutchison which will be located in various shops and pubs in the village within the next few days. Be prepared to listen to what the group have to say but also to make your views known.

Lastly of course, it's clear that changing and improving things, even a little, will cost! The TEP group are consequently working up the proposals in such a way that they can be broken down and staged over time according to the availability of funds and the Parish Council's success in securing support from South Downs National Park and West Sussex County Council. But without a long term vision of what we would like Findon to be – there is certainly no chance of getting there.

News from PAWS Animal Sanctuary

From April this year the law says all dogs must be microchipped. While I think this is a very good idea I firmly believe it should also be law for all cats to be microchipped as well.

It's not often we see a stray dog? If we do we call the Dog Warden, by the evening a lost dog has usually been claimed. If it is an unwanted, dumped dog the Dog Warden will keep the dog for 7 days before rehoming.

But cats are a different story. We regularly have dead cats brought in to us that have been killed on the road. Sometimes we can contact the owner to give them the sad news but only if their cat is microchipped. We also have calls (almost every week) from members of the public telling us they are feeding a stray cat. So often cats are not microchipped. We collect them and spend weeks trying to find the poor cats owner. But, if all cats were microchipped it would make our lives so much easier.

So many stray cats are simply lost because they get in cars, or run off if they are frightened, or chased by a dog or another cat. It is now so much cheaper to get a cat or dog microchipped the new grooming parlour inside Pets at Home in Rustington are advertising a special offer for only £10 to microchip a cat or a dog. The Dogs Trust at Shoreham are offering to microchip dogs free of charge.

So many times cat owners ring us to report that they have lost their cat. When I ask for details and if the cat is microchipped they tell me they didn't need to get them microchipped because the cat never goes out!!

Veterinary Advice

Compulsory Microchipping Know The Facts!

Microchipping involves the insertion of a chip the size of a grain of rice between the shoulder blades of the dog. The chip will have the animal's and keeper's details registered on an approved database. This procedure is easily performed in a regular appointment at the surgery.

Permanent identification of dogs through microchipping has many benefits, including helping to reunite strays with their owners, helping to tackle puppy farming and animal cruelty cases, as well as encouraging responsible ownership.

In pedigree dogs it also facilitates the reporting of hereditary health problems.

From the 6th of April 2016, all dogs must be microchipped and

registered to an approved database by the time they are 8 weeks old, or 12 weeks for pup's certified as a working dog with a docked tail.

If your dog is not currently microchipped, you have until 6th of April to get this done.

The only exemptions are if a veterinary surgeon believes that microchipping would adversely affect the health of the dog.

The breeder of a litter must always be the first registered keeper of any puppy. It will be illegal for the breeder not to be listed as a keeper on the database. The breeder must provide microchipping documents to the person buying the puppy to ensure the new owner can comply with the law and update their own details.

What if your dog is found unchipped?

Police and local authority employees will be issued with microchip reader scanners so that instant enforcement of the law can be carried out. Should a dog be found not microchipped a 21 day notice period will be given to get the microchipping done - failure to comply will result in a £500 fine. As well as needing to be microchipped the contact details registered on the chip must also be kept up to date - any subsequent change of address or contact telephone number, etc. Is not made then the dog is no longer considered microchipped - details not updated within 21 days are subject to a £500 fine being issued.

Keeping your details updated is so important! All so often dogs (and cats) are brought into the surgery as strays and the phone numbers registered to the chip are not of use anymore - making reuniting pets with owners impossible!

Chipping is NOT proof of ownership

With regards to compulsory microchipping the words 'owner' and 'ownership' have been replaced by the words 'keeper' and 'keepership'. As a 'keeper; you are legally responsible if your dog strays, bites or causes any unjust damage. As the keeper you are protected from prosecution if your dog attacks a burglar or trespasser on your land.

Dogs still need a collar with a tag!

The Control of Dogs Order 1992 mandates that any dog in a public place must wear a collar with the name and address (including postcode) of its owner on it, or engraved on a tag. A telephone number is optional (but strongly advisable). An owner can be fined up to £5,000 if the dog is not wearing identification.

Exceptions include dogs used for sporting or pack hunting purposes, for vermin control, driving or tending cattle or sheep, guide dogs for the blind or dogs used for official duties (e.g. Police dogs).

Crime Watch

Rogue Traders – be aware!

Rogue traders are criminals who take advantage of householders by using high-pressure sales

techniques. The work carried out is often expensive, sub-standard and not required at all. Rogue trading is often linked to distraction burglary, which is carried out by an offender who gains access to a property by distracting or deceiving the householder in order to steal valuables or cash.

They prey on the most vulnerable members of our community, so please make sure that your elderly relatives, friends and neighbours are aware not only of the scams that might take place on their phones or through their postbox, but also people turning up on their doorsteps and alarming them into having unnecessary work done in their homes and gardens.

If you are suspicious of anyone calling or visiting your home or you see something going on in your neighbourhood that you're not happy about, please call Sussex Police on 101. If you think a crime is in progress, then call 999 immediately.

Ongoing Scams

Residents targeted by fake police

officers: In the last year Sussex Police have had hundreds of reports of fraudsters phoning or visiting elderly residents claiming to be police officers or bank officials. The fraudsters claim the resident is a victim of fraud and that their bank cards and PIN are needed for the investigation.



A courier is sent to collect the supposedly compromised/old card(s) and these are used to withdraw cash and buy high value goods. In some cases the victims are told not to trust the bank employees and to go to their bank and withdraw all of their money.

Microsoft support scam: victims being conned from 'Tech support' scammer Residents of Sussex have been targeted by phone scammers who claim to be from Microsoft. The scammer tells victims that they need to pay money otherwise their computer will crash. The scam works by the fraudster gaining remote access to a computer, and asking for an initial fee to fix the computer. They then have access to your bank account and can withdraw money from the victim's account.

'Police porn warning message' scam on mobile phones and computers:

Sussex residents have also been targeted by a scam where a message appears on their phone or computer saying that the police have detected that they have been watching child pornography and that their device has been locked as a result. The scammer demands a payment of £100 (or more) to unlock the device, to be paid via a 'Paysafe' card. The victims have not been accessing pornography and the scam is as a result of Ransomware. Experts say this scam can be caused by clicking on social media links, by downloading music, installing a game or program, opening a picture, playing a video file or shopping online.

Romance and dating scams:

These are scams which are particularly distressing because the scammers build an online relationship with the victim, sometimes using a false profile and photos on a legitimate site to lower your defences. Be cautious of giving away personal information and consider your personal safety if you decide to meet in person with someone you meet online. Never send money to someone you have never met or who you don't actually know and trust.

Keep your money safe with these tips:

Check people are who they say they are. Not sure? Don't open the door!

Never send or give money to people you don't know or trust

Remember to protect your identity – don't share your personal information with unexpected callers.

Beware of email and computer scams. Treat all emails from unknown senders with suspicion and never click on links within them.

Never share your PIN number.

If in doubt, phone a relative, friend or someone you personally know.

If you suspect someone you know may be vulnerable to fraud, please share this information.
