From The Rectory

At the time of writing our churchyard at Findon is looking especially beautiful with masses of snowdrops and crocuses. The sight of so many delicate flowers in the winter sunshine lifts our spirits and reminds us that Spring is really not that far away.

We are now in the season of Lent at church. It is a time of preparation for the great festival of Easter, when we will celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, with the promise of new life for all who believe in him.

The observance of a holy Lent goes back to the very early centuries of Christianity. Initially it was a time of preparation for those being baptised at Easter. Over the years this time of preparation came to include all who follow Christ. Lent lasts for 40 days because this was the number of days Jesus fasted in the wilderness in preparation for his ministry.

Traditionally the church is unadorned during Lent and we do not have any flowers on display. The liturgical colour purple adds a sombre note. But we are not meant in any way to be miserable. Instead, our preparation for Easter is all about spending more time with God and having a valuable period of reflection and self-examination, so that we can draw closer to our Lord.

We often have a bible study group during Lent but this year, as I mentioned in last month's edition of Findon News, we will be having a service of Compline, or night prayer instead. This will take place each Wednesday in March at Findon Church at 7.30pm. It will include a brief reflection. Compline is a particularly lovely service, so if you are not familiar with it, do come and see!

People often give up something for Lent, and if we were to consider doing that, we might usefully ask ourselves what the benefits of would be. If we cut out sweet things to lose weight, that might be good for the waistline, but would it draw us any closer to God? Alternatively, if we were to give up something we enjoyed so that we could perhaps give the money we save to the Turkey/Syria earthquake appeal for example, then such a sacrifice would be in direct obedience to God's command to help our neighbour in need, and so aligns our will with God's. Just a thought!

Holy week marks the final week of Lent, and on the 2nd April we will be celebrating Palm Sunday at both Findon and Patching Churches. If you are going to Findon, you might want to make a note in your diary that bacon butties will be served at the Rectory at 9am and there will be a procession with a donkey to church for the 10am Worship and Praise service. At Patching there will be an Easter Eucharist at 10am and there will be chocolate eggs!

The Findon Village Volunteers organised transporting the seat to and from the workshop and the re-fixing of it to the new tarmacked surface with help from the Cycle Path Contractors .

The Parish Council's Working Party (The Findon Village Volunteers) has been as busy as ever striving to keep the Village looking as smart as possible but recently doing work on road drains.

With the heavy rains in December there was some flooding and the Findon Village Volunteers got to work to clear those road gulleys which were completely blocked with silt, gravel and mud. Ten of these in the Village have so far been unblocked and the photos show the clearing in progress of the one at the junction of Cross Lane and Nepcote Lane, from which three large wheelbarrow loads were removed. (The camera has caught the barrow in course of being filled with its third load and also shows the cleared gulley which had not seen the light of day of many years).

Findon Parish Council News

Findon Parish Council (FPC) has finalised and approved the annual precept/budget which will help fund changes to the village during the course of 2023/2024 financial year. FPC took the decision not to increase the Precept from £47k during the financial years 2021/22 and 2022/23. This year the precept will increase to £56k (an increase of £8.75 per annum or £0.17p per week per band D equivalent household). This increase includes an annual payment for the Public Works Loan to complete the Village Hall extension, and managing any increase is a strong focus of all councillors.

The shared cycle path alongside the A24 was formally opened on Thursday 16 February 2023 and attended by council members from West Sussex County Council, Findon Parish Council, members of Findon Valley Residents Association and our the Member of Parliament for Arundel and South Downs, Andrew Griffith. This route enables safe cycling and walking between Findon Village and Findon Valley, a welcome addition to our infrastructure.

The project seeking to restore the pond at Nepcote Green to its previously water filled status has taken further steps forward following very positive approval of funding. Lead Councillor Gilbert is working in collaboration with the South Downs National Park Authority and the South Downs National Park Trust and we hope to see the restoration to fruition this year.

A date for your diary - the Annual Parish Meeting (APM) will be held on Monday 17 April 2023 at 7pm in Findon Village Hall. This is not a meeting of the FPC and is an opportunity for parishioners and local organisations to get together and find out what has happened in the last twelve months and look forward to the future. The FPC Chairman will give an 'end of year' report on FPC activities and refreshments will be available. Please look out for posters advertising the APM in the Notice Boards etc during the next few weeks.

Finally, just a reminder that elections will be held in May 2023 for Arun District Council (ADC) councillors and Arun parish and town council councillors. The Polling Day is Thursday 4 May 2023 so please look out for future details in the media, FPC Notice Boards, and the FPC and Community websites, particularly if you are interested in becoming a parish councillor. FPC currently has two vacancies for a parish councillor.

News from Paws

It has been exhausting here at the Sanctuary since Christmas. In January every one of our cat pens was full. Three lots of kittens were given to us to find homes for. We had to treat them all for fleas and worms, have them inoculated. spayed and neutered, and microchipped before we could let them go to new homes. We can breathe again now. All the cats and kittens have been rehomed except just one Ginger boy called Tommy. The pregnant cat who arrived in January is keeping us all waiting as we don't know how long before she has her kittens. I get daily messages from Volunteers asking if she has had them yet. I just tell them "No mews yet".

I always forget to eat breakfast, we are always so busy in the mornings, so I was delighted to find the best ever soup in our Findon Village Store ,"Rod and Ben's Organic Honey Glazed Root Vegetable Soup". I can never find time to cook when visitors are looking at cats. When they leave I often drive down to Findon Valley Parade to buy Senior Citizens Fish and Chips for only £6. What a treat.

Pepper the cat who was found living in a derelict empty house for over a year, was like a skeleton. She's put on weight and is being treated for a thyroid problem twice a day. She needs almost all of her teeth out and can only eat soft food, we think she is about 15 years old. She needs to put more weight on before having the dental work. She is so affectionate and wants cuddles and brushing every time a volunteer can spare the time. We no longer put her in a pen.

We still have constant messages every day from rabbit owners asking us to take their rabbits. All I can tell them is to put photos on facebook, saying homes needed. All the other rescue centres in Sussex also say they are full. Yesterday I was asked to go and pick up a rabbit from a front garden in the village. Lambing - Spring 2023- Nepcote Flock Graham Langford

Sheep farms, at this time of year, are in one of their busiest seasons - lambing time. Some farms, mainly commercial but some smaller farms as well, have already lambed, having put the ram in with the ewes in August to provide early lambs to help their business or provide good lambs for showing. If you have early lambs you generally lamb indoors and have good winter food available.

Early February The Nepcote Flock had the scanning man to view the expectant ewes and our lambs are due in April. With 80% of the lamb grown in the last 30 days, a feeding programme is compiled to suit the sheep to supplement the lack of grass around in early Spring. One has to be careful not to over feed the mums with single lambs as you do not want large lambs which can create difficulties at birth.

Some people ask why we number the sheep after lambing. That is so we

know which lamb belongs to which ewe in case of any problems out in the field. Four to six weeks before the lambs are due, the ewes are vaccinated with Heptavac to protect the ewe and the unborn lamb from various illnesses, for example pneumonia, etc. But this year for some reason there has been a shortage of this preparation and therefore a number of farms are sharing to ensure the flocks are protected.

The ewes are generally shorn in May/June, but again some farmers will shear their sheep earlier so that the sheep will be looking their best for the country shows. The shows are important as a showcase of their stock and winning rosettes are a sign of quality.

If your family want to see lambing live locally, then go to Coombes farm between Steyning and Lancing during March 11th – April 16th 2023

Findon Wildflower Group

Spring is on its way and Findon Wildflower Group have begun Phase 1 in the process of wild flowering areas of Findon Village. The project, initiated by Findon Parish Council, will take up to 3 years and will be carried out in stages, starting with the High Street Embankment, where 5 'beds' have been sown with wildflower seeds. Other designated areas will include: the circular on Downsview Road and the triangular area at top of Steep Lane. Care will be taken to work around the emerging spring bulbs and other naturalised plants already established. If these wildflower 'meadows' are a success, the Parish Council will look to expand the programme to other areas of the village.

Findon Village is a prime location for creating a nectar rich habitat for pollinators. The village itself and surrounding countryside already attract a variety of wildlife and pollinators and with the addition of small wildflower meadows, it can only enrich the community further and enhance the beauty of the village.

The project is run by volunteers who will carry out the ground preparation, sowing, growing and planting the meadows and maintenance, thereafter. Other volunteer groups in the village are supporting the project, such as the Open Spaces Volunteer Working Group who will help prepare the ground areas and the Findon Litter Pickers who can help monitor the meadows. Men in Sheds are making stakes for cordoning off the seeded areas. Funding is secured, with thanks to Findon Parish Council, with further sponsorship pending from South Downs National Park.

There is a great deal of interest and support for this project from the villagers and the group would happily welcome others interested in helping the project in any way.
