

From the Rectory

As I write this, it feels as if spring has finally arrived! It was a shock to come home to snow and freezing temperatures in late March, after late summer in Australia with sun every day and temperatures in the mid 30s! Lovely as it was to spend a month with our family, it is good to be home again, if only for a rest (we realised we're not getting any younger as we entertained a 2.½ and almost 5 year old daily!)

We did have a weekend away, spending a day exploring Melbourne, then 2 days in the Grampians, including a night in a 'swag' under the stars, amazing! The dawn chorus sounds very different from ours, and we saw kangaroos, emus, koalas and possums as well as a variety of birds, but no snakes! It made me realise afresh how amazing God's creation is, in all its variety – so much to be grateful for.

We're now half-way through the Diocesan Year of Prayer, and our prayers should always begin with thankfulness: we are so blessed to live in this lovely part of Sussex, having all that we need, as well as remembering those who are in any kind of need and bringing them to God's care. Those who came to our Lent Course found using a selection of paintings a different way in to prayer, and a basis for stimulating discussion. On May 12th, in St John the Baptist Church, we are offering a day of prayer between 10am and 4pm, with a variety of prayer stations and displays to try out. Everyone is welcome to drop in,

staying for as long as you like, and there will be tea/coffee available in the kitchen there if wanted. Colin will be leading a couple of guided sessions on prayer, at 11.30am and 2.30pm, when you can learn more about a specific aspect of prayer. This day falls in the national period dedicated to prayer called 'Thy Kingdom Come', between Ascension Day and Pentecost, so I would encourage you to join us, especially as we hear of fresh atrocities in Syria, to pray for God's Kingdom of peace and justice to prevail over greed and violence in the world.

On Pentecost Sunday (May 20th) all are invited to attend Bishop Richard's Thy Kingdom Come Beacon event at Chichester Cathedral from 7pm. During the week between Ascension and Pentecost, Bishop Richard is walking across the Diocese, visiting many churches on his way, including St John's here, around 3.15pm on Wednesday 16th May. On June 9th, we are invited to be part of a Pilgrimage to Chichester Cathedral, starting at 10.30 at Hunston to walk along the canal path, or meeting in the Bishop's garden for those unable to walk this distance. There will be a 12:00 Eucharisr followed by a 'bring and share' lunch with drinks provided. I hope many of you will join in with at least one of these events; please let the Parish Office know so I can confirm numbers with the Cathedral Office.

The shop continues to introduce new services and stock but would like to expand its Volunteer base as we approach the summer. There must be villagers out there who could help us staff the shop, meet their fellow villagers, and enjoy being more involved in the community. If anyone is interested could I ask you to contact our wonderful Volunteer Coordinator Margaret Bamford, who together with the Training Supervisor Annie Whitchurch, runs our great team of valuable volunteers.

We are delighted to announce that Angus Charlton has accepted our offer to become Shop Manager, effective May 1st. He will be well known to many Findonites having worked at Findon Manor Hotel for many years, and has worked in the shop since February, helping to open the shop early mornings, and organise the newspaper deliveries for the village.

The shop is now ready to supply ice creams from its new freezer, sited just inside the shop. We have also expanded the range of flowers and plants, tastefully displayed just outside the shop.

A pivotal meeting was carried out with the Lancing Depot Manager for Smiths News, who have supplied our newspapers for many years, not always to our satisfaction, and we have received a fulsome apology for their failure to supply over the Easter weekend. We are confident that this meeting may result in some form of compensation for our loss of sales and significant upset to our customers.

A new chiller fridge has been installed behind the shop counter, this will allow us to display our wine and beer and release space in the main chiller units in the front of the shop.

A new local supplier of fresh free-range eggs has been sourced to replace the sad loss of Nanny Sues as suppliers, and the egg stock is now more easily accessible than previously.

A new and prominent sign has been erected at the Findon end of Long Furlong to draw the attention of passing traffic to the existence of Findon Village Store.

We have purchased a new handheld device to allow us to monitor stock levels, take stock when required, and most importantly help enter deliveries in to the stock system as they arrive on Fridays.

Our new Post Office Ltd contract has now been agreed, it starts officially on May 4th, and will allow us vital flexibility to manage the costs of staffing the PO counter. For the moment we will continue to offer a Sunday morning PO service until 12 noon, if demand is worthwhile.

Dear Friends,

'Thy Kingdom Come' is a phrase that trips off the tongue of Christians every time they pray the Lord's Prayer. It sums





up the purpose of Jesus and of his body, The Church. We exist, with Jesus, to build the Kingdom of God. We do that, in part, by seeking to transform the unjust structures of society and conforming them to the intentions of God. We also do it by sharing our faith, hope and love with others. However we help build the Kingdom of God, we must do it in partnership with God and so pray as Jesus taught us: Thy Kingdom come. Prayer is what ensures our partnership with God. Without it, we risk trying to establish not his Kingdom, but some lesser vision of our own.

Paws Animal Sanctuary

This week a lady rang to say, that the previous day a duck had walked up her garden path with 13 ducklings following behind her. She opened her shed door and in they all went. She went out and bought duckling food, fed them and gave them a bowl of water. She then spent hours on the phone asking where they could safely go. She said nobody was interested in helping her so I confidently said "leave it to me," boy was I wrong. I rang every wildlife place with a lake or river I could find. They all had reasons not to take them. In the end I remembered a lovely couple, Simon and Jane, who I knew had rescued a duck with babies when a swan wouldn't let them onto the river because she had a nest nearby. On that occasion, people were frantically ringing me saying the swan was chasing the ducklings and asking me to come quickly. As they were miles away in Chichester, a volunteer here at the Sanctuary suggested to try her friends Simon and Jane. Straight away they said "we are on our way" and went and rescued them all. I searched for their number and again

asked for their help, they said "We will go and rescue them". They caught them and safely put them all on The Rife. Phew, what a relief. What heroes.

This morning a lady arrived with a 9 month old black cat, she said she had to give him away because her two children were in tears nearly every day because the cat went out hunting and would come back with birds, rats, a mouse or squirrels. She said there was blood all the way through the cat flap! We will try our best to find a farm or stables looking for a hunting cat. We urgently need more volunteers, every day we have more unwanted animals arriving, all needing to be taken care of. Retired fit elderly volunteers most welcome. From Stacey


