

From The Rectory

As I sat outside just now for my lunch, the sun warm on my face, it felt more like summer than mid October! But the nights are drawing in and the dog's morning walk has a chill feel in the air now. As winter approaches, we often look back on the past year, reflecting on the joys and sorrows as we begin to look ahead and plan for a new year. November is traditionally the month for remembering. Who would have believed this time last year that Covid would still be restricting much of our lives, certainly so for those of us with family living overseas! A couple of people have reflected with joy on having been able to travel to France to see loved ones after almost 2 years absence. Sadly it will be some time yet before Chris and I can manage to see our Australian family again, but the day will come and meanwhile we have much to be thankful for – our own health and that of those we love.

Technology has played a vital part in all our lives over the last 2 years, enabling us to keep in touch with loved ones, as well as to find new ways of managing our work through various forms of video conferencing. But nothing in my mind comes near a face-to-face meeting. Somehow, even when seeing the person/people you are in conversation with on screen there are barriers in the conversation. So much of our communication is non verbal, through posture, gesture and expression, much of which is lost on a Zoom call! I have however needed to be vigilant about my facial expression – not always successfully – when a meeting has become tedious. I wonder how many of you have had the same experience!

But life is gradually returning to a form of normality, as we feel protected by our double vaccinations (in some cases including a 'booster') although we still need to be mindful of those around us who are

more vulnerable, and respect each other's personal space. There are some good things planned in the run-up to Christmas, beginning with our biennial Christmas Tree Festival in St John the Baptist Church on 4th and 5th December. Keep an eye on our website and the pewsheet for up to date information, and the Parish Christmas card should find its way into every home before the end of November with a full list of available events.

As you begin your Christmas preparations, don't forget the real reason for the season – Jesus Christ, who's birthday we celebrate every year. We buy gifts for those we love each year; have you considered also including a gift for Jesus? We can give him thanks by serving the poor and needy, visiting a lonely neighbour, or through a monetary gift to the Parish (by hand or via the donation button on our website or the phone app in our churches) a thought to consider – thank you.

NEW this month, Lambstails returns to Findon Village Hall with a new look and a welcome for all babies and toddlers with their parents and carers. Do come along to these sessions so your child can enjoy the company of others safely as you have the chance to chat to other adults over a cuppa! **Starting on November 2nd!**



We will have stalls with everything from Christmas cards, paper and decorations through gift sets and pet goods to cakes and treats.





Film Review by Carrie Morrison

'Rising Phoenix' - Directed by Peter Ettedgui & Ian Bonhôte

At three and a half years old, I was diagnosed with Autistic Spectrum Disorder, which impacts the way I process information, which can lead to me struggling with social cues to having difficulty understanding instructions. Through hard work from my parents, teachers, and especially myself, I have learned that my autism makes me who I am. It is not something to distance myself from. I had a hard time learning that because I had little to no *good* representation of disabled people on screen. It was always villains with eye patches or the kid in the wheelchair who is more a prop to deepen the emotions of the able-bodied protagonist. When the London 2012 Paralympics came around, it was too late. I already had this survival instinct to reject anything related to my disability. 'If I am seen to be associated with disabled people, I will be bullied', I thought. So when I sat down and watched *Rising Phoenix*, almost ten years after the games happened, it was like watching it for the first time.

The cinematography by Will Pugh gave some of the most graceful, championing, and gorgeous imagery I have ever seen. The way the camera glides in slow motion as the Paralympic athletes demonstrate to us their prowess in their respective sports. Cutting to broadcasted footage of the games to distanced shots from a phone, it hits that the whole world is rooting for the athletes just as much as you are. Some of my favourite cinematic moments were when we see Italian fencer, Bebe Vio, in her gear, swaying to dodge hits and lunging for attacks. It's so breathtaking to witness.



You can tell the people making this is not posing these athletes as superheroes, but people with sheer skill and strength that is awe-inspiring. The interviews are honest and bring out each athlete's stories with empathy and humanity, and the intent is so genuine that you never feel like they are putting these athletes on these high pedestals just because of their disability. They want to glorify their achievements, not patronise. It also touches on the Rio de Janeiro scandal, stealing Paralympic funding for Olympic games, and the rush for the organisers to get more funding in time. Even though London proudly put disabled people at the forefront and seemed to have changed a mass amount of people's perceptions, disabled people are still treated as second class citizens. The outrage infuriates you. You come to terms with the fact the fight for change is not over.

An additional note: I would double bill this after *The Reason I Jump*, a fantastic documentary about the experiences of autistic people across the world. As an autistic person, I had never seen any media depict my disability as well as that film. Both films are epic yet intimate, and are a safe space for disabled people, as well as being informative and unpatronising for able-bodied people. One fifth of the world's population has at least

one disability. It's time to start listening to their stories.

There is one major item for the Hall this month – but first we can report that the Hall is back to pre-pandemic levels of activity and more. Virtually all regular bookings have re-started, some even running extra sessions. The first of the new Lambtails sessions should take place on Tuesday, 2nd November, 10:30-12:00. More volunteers welcome. One Lambstails issue is that we have become a victim of our own success and finding a suitable time slot problematic. The Tuesday slot is not available every week so, once a month, the session will transfer to the Church. What we could do with is an extension - which brings us nicely to the main topic for this month:-

Exciting times! After a great deal of work on the part of the Parish Council, supported to the absolute limit of our ability by the Village Hall Trust, the effort to secure funding to complete the extension to the hall can enter the next phase. The idea is to secure a Public Works Board Loan to cover the cost of completing the original works plus vital extra works not originally budgeted for. These include resurfacing the car park (which has become a serious trip hazard), creating additional parking spaces using eco-friendly mesh on the grass, covered bike parking and much more, all of which will give us a great Village Hall serving the needs of the community for many more years to come. As extensively reported in the press, building material costs have increased since lock-down and recent estimates indicate a loan of around £130,000 including professional fees plus a 10% contingency will be needed. The loan would be repaid via the Parish Council Precept and, at current interest

rates, would add in the region of ten pence a week to a Band D household.

We have secured some funding from other sources and completed some work ourselves - reducing the loan by over £10,000. Thanks to those who backfilled trenches, shifted spoil and rubble and finished off drainage pipework !

During week commencing 1st November a leaflet will be delivered to every household in the Village requesting support in principle for a Public Works Board loan. An appropriate level of support is an essential requirement for the idea to progress further and I implore you all to get behind this initiative and return the leaflet expressing your support promptly. We have the demand for greater hall capacity, and no realistic alternative source of funds in the near term. With a good level of support The Parish Council will be able to progress matters to the next stage, obtaining a fully costed specification for the works to determine the exact sum required prior to a second consultation exercise with every household in the Village after which, provided the outcome is favourable, a formal loan application can be made. These loan applications have been badly affected by Covid and there is a backlog, so the overall process is likely to take months not weeks – but we NEED YOUR SUPPORT – right now, please.

I cannot emphasise too strongly that a favourable response from you would be very much appreciated so that the Parish Council initiative can be progressed and

Shepherding in Findon

Every year running a flock is never the same and 2021 was one of the those years when you have to look at how you move forward with new ideas.

Having had 10 lambs from 6 ewes the complications set in from the start of lambing resulting in some of the ewes not able to lamb again in the future.

We decided to sell 2 of the best remaining ewes as we cannot lamb in 2022, and they were bought by a farm in East Sussex.

It was very unusual to have more ram lambs than ewe lambs, so with only 3 ewe lambs to go forward for breeding we decided to buy another 3 ewe lambs from a Southdown flock at Nutbourne who was having to give up due to a number of reasons etc. These 6 lambs will be ready to go to the ram next year

Again due to extreme weather during the summer numerous farms have suffered fly strike and we were also affected. For the very first time we had 3 lambs that lost some of their wool due to the fly problem but am very please to say new wool is growing back well in time for winter.

Below is a picture of the 3 new lambs that after two weeks in a field on their own have now been integrated into the flock.




Findon Parish Council

Since work stopped on the extension to the Village Hall, the Parish Council has been working with Findon Village Hall Trust to help them achieve a 'ready to hire' new fully accessible smaller hall for which there is already a list of potential hirers, landscaping to ensure safe access for all to both halls, grass lawns fully restored and unsightly fencing removed, a resurfaced car park, covered cycle storage and additional parking spaces with grass through plastic matting. Matters got delayed during COVID but this year activity has resumed. Volunteers have done a lot of work to drainage, tidying up the exterior and removing building waste and repairing the roof which was damaged by vandals. However, despite their best

endeavours apart from a greatly appreciated grant to equip the kitchen larger grants have not been forthcoming. To resolve the issue, we would like to propose to residents that the Parish Council apply for a loan from the Public Works Loan Board to cover the full costs of the aforementioned works which would be paid back over fifty years via the Parish Council Precept. Please look out for a leaflet coming through your letter box during the first week in November giving each household the opportunity to show support for this proposal.


