From The Rectory

I had this month's article drafted in my head, titled '3 weddings and a sheep fair', but then sadly we had the news on Thursday last week (8th September) that the Queen had died. It doesn't seem appropriate to write a frivolous piece during a time of national mourning! Just a word of explanation; inadvertently I booked 2 weddings in Findon Church followed by one at Patching Church on Sheep Fair Day, September 10th and as the A24 was pretty much at a standstill for most of the day, through into the Village past the Rectory, travelling anywhere was a challenge, but all 3 weddings went without a hitch! The Sheep Fair Weekend however was a resounding success. Well done to everyone involved in planning, on the day, and clearing up. Each day there were times of quiet for reflection on the life of her Majesty Queen Elizabeth and singing of the National Anthem for our new King.

Although we all knew that our Queen's health was declining, it still came as a shock when the news broke on Thursday afternoon. People everywhere have been affected with profound sadness at the end of an era, yet at the same time a great sense of gratitude and admiration for her Majesty's lifelong example of service underpinned by her faith in God. Over the last week, we have been treated to documentaries and previously unseen footage of our Queen throughout her life, revealing not just a Queen, a public figure serving her people as Monarch for 70 years, but also a wife, mother and grandmother, a sister, someone with a great sense of humour, able to relax when out of the public eye with her beloved family, particularly at Balmoral. Many of you reading this will, like me, have known no other Monarch. Like his mother before him, Charles became King Charles III as soon as his mother died. He has taken on her mantle of monarchy ably and immediately despite the personal grief he must be feeling. God bless the King.

Tributes to Queen Elizabeth II have a common theme of gratitude and love for a remarkable woman who gave a sense of stability not just to our own nation but through most of the world. Through her 96 years she has witnessed momentous change, particularly in technology, and times of personal, national and global sorrow as well as joy, but throughout everything, her faith has sustained her, giving her the strength to continue resolutely even in the darkest times of her life. What a wonderful example of Christian faith she has been for us all. The pledge of service with God's help that she made on the 21st birthday has well and truly been kept.

Thank you, Ma'am; may you rest in peace and rise in glory.

We were therefore absolutely thrilled when it was announced in June that Findon Village Store had been recognised in this way and hope you will join us in the Village Hall on 17th October when the Award will be presented by the Lord Lieutenant of West Sussex.

Talking of focal points, the wonderful creations that increasingly sit atop the post box outside the shop, are a real draw. Producing them is no mean feat - the diameter of the top of the post box measures a mere metre! It must be one of the largest in the country. The crocheted pastoral scene of a shepherdess and her sheep, which adorned the box to highlight the Sheep Fair, has been replaced by the crown as a memorial to our late queen Elizabeth. And, who knows, there may be plans for more displays in the coming months. (No pressure, ladies!) A good reason for visiting the shop, in case you needed one.

The shop's buyers are always looking around for new items to stock, especially if it is locally produced, and this month we are pleased to announce that there is a new selection of beers from the award-winning Firebrand brewery in Rudgwick, near Horsham. 'Pacific Gem' is a pale ale, with a pronounced bitterness and signature aroma of berry fruits, 'Heritage Sussex Best' is developed from a recipe passed down five generations of the proprietor's family, while 'Festive 51' is an updated version of a beer created for the Festival of Britain in 1951. Interesting, and definitely worth a snifter!

Findon Sheep Fair & Village Festival 10th September 2022



The sun shone and the crowds came out to make our first post Covid show an amazing (and very busy) event. The show is a cherished event and attracts crowds from far and wide. We believe that across the weekend more than 10,000 people attended Nepcote Green.

We began the event on Friday evening with a 2 minute silence where we paused in honour of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth 2nd. We repeated this twice on Saturday, initially at 11am for the daytime show and at 8pm ahead of the final evening show. We did consider whether it would be right to cancel the event and engaged the thoughts of Findon Parish Council and Arun District Council before deciding to proceed. We all felt that celebrating with a country show was a fantastic way to remember the Queens and her personal dedication to country affairs. As a further tribute to the Queen a 'Condolence book' was made available for visitors to sign. After the show weekend the condolence book is to relocated to the local community shop for locals to sign.

The Friday evening comprised the Harris Fairground and a barn dance which attracted a record attendance of

> close to 400 people with 'Shanalligans' providing a variety of country and folk music.

Saturday 'daytime' filled the green, village and local roads, as crowds flocked in to see the Sheep Judging , Harris's Fair, History of sheep and shearing, Falconry, Morris dancing and the Nicola Miles dancing troop.





Other attractions included tractor tours of the near downs, with a running commentary given by Findon's local historian/archaeologist, Classic cars exhibition, Punch & Judy, Childrens circus, Pony Rides and Horse and Trap rides, 160 stalls & crafts, and outside coffee, bars and catering areas and our first raffle.

Saturday evening led by Murdochs crazy eyes, filled the marquee and a fantastic party feel to round off the Saturday.

Sunday marked the end of the Fair with the traditional salvation Army band and service well attended.

Sheep Show & Judging

The Sheep fair now comprises so many different opportunities to have fun and celebrate, however the history of the show stems from local farming of sheep and the need to show and auction these. For the past 20 years we have been building a worldwide reputation for our Sheep show and Judging at the fair.

In common with other parts of the Sheep Fair and Village Festival, a 2 minute silence was observed by everybody in honour of the queen with just the sound of sheep bleating in the back ground.

40 Farms entered from all over the South of England, Kent, Essex, Surrey, West Sussex, Hampshire and Berkshire. In total over 230 sheep were shown with 25 different breeds in attendance with Judges coming from as far as Shropshire.

The emphasis for this year was to have younger people involved in the show to ensure the show continues for years to come.



The winners of the top prizes were;

'Supreme champion' was a Hampshire ram owned by Viv and David Miles. 'Best farm competition' was won by Viv Miles from the Rother Valley. 'The Most Successful Young Shepherd' was won by Chloe from the Lovejoy farm partnership and the supreme champion young shephard was won by



Poppy also from the Lovejoy farm partnership.

Our Volunteers. An event as cherished and rewarding for so many is not easy to set up & safely deliver. We are indebted to all our volunteers, the vast majority of whom live in the village and gave freely of their time, often through wet weather ahead of the weekend as well as on the Friday to set the event up, Saturday to run it and Sunday to clean away. We are also extremely grateful for the generosity of local landowners in loaning areas of land for car parking and for Findon Valley scouts in marshalling the traffic so admirably.

Our Sponsors. The event also requires funding and support to planning processes. We would like to recognise the support from our lead sponsors Michael Jones (for funding and administrative support throughout the year) and also to thank our 20 sponsors of the sheep judging and sponsors of specific activities (a full list is available on our website). **Our Suppliers**. 2022 marks the first post-covid show and following a gap of 3 years has required a good deal of support and collaboration from our suppliers, our thanks go out to each of our 25 suppliers.

We would like to thanks all exhibitors and traders in the part they played in making this such an eventful & memorable event.

We know that with success comes additional challenges and this years popularity of the show pushed to the limit the capacity of the site and local roads. We will be reviewing both our traffic management and on site facilities to improve these aspects of the show in the future. We also value your feedback and new ideas. Findon Parish Council News

Findon Parish Council (FPC) would like to express its gratitude to all members of the Findon Sheep Fair Committee and all those volunteers who worked tirelessly to create a very successful Sheep Fair. The Fair, along with other historic elements of Findon, represent a priceless connection with our history and heritage, one that we all treasure.

FPC welcomed the co-option of a new councillor to fill one of the two vacancies last month. Cllr Mark Robinson will also be a member of the FPC Planning Committee.

The official opening of the regenerated Homewood Play Area by Arun District Council (ADC) in tandem with FPC was held recently and the heavy use of the facility by children from Findon has been noted. A request to place some picnic tables at the location in order to allow families to supervise children whilst enjoying the environment is being pursued.

Over the last year, our Findon sapling nursery has provided trees for over 200 plantings and following extensive watering in the long dry periods, upward of 90% of these have taken. We plan to continue this initiative with a delivery of another 100 saplings for the nursery in the near future. Thanks are due to the **Open Spaces Volunteers Working** Party, the Findon Village Tree Warden, and members of FPC continue to pursue this excellent initiative which helps replace those trees we have lost and maintain our village's rural environment.

Findon Parish Councillors and Findon Village Hall Trust representatives have recently attended two workshops presented by West Sussex County Council

(WSCC) outlining the principles of village community resilience based on 'What If' scenarios. A working party initially comprising four FPC councillors and two FVHT trustees, has subsequently been formed to compile a Community Resilience Plan for Findon Village with the aim of ensuring we have measures in place to cope with unforeseen localised emergencies and also to engage with ADC to have the Village Hall officially recognised as the 'Survivor Rest Centre/Rest Centre' in the event of an emergency resulting in Findon Village residents being evacuated from their homes. As their work progresses it is highly likely that the Working Party will be engaging with other Village organisations whose co-operation in the event of an emergency could be crucial. Progress updates will be published in Findon News on a regular basis.

The animals suffer every year night after night not just on 5th November. Dogs, horses, cows and sheep are so frightened.

There are some heartless people owning animals. A lady rang to say the neighbours opposite had moved and left three adult cats and two kittens behind in an empty house. They had left a window open and a ladder under the window. She rang different rescues who couldn't help. She said she was concerned because there was a kitten out in the road. She rang me to ask if she could bring them to PAWS. I agreed, but the Landlord arrived and said the last tenant's car was still outside and they still owed him money and might come back for the cats. The next day the RSPCA did come out and take them saying there will be a prosecution because they had left the cats for weeks without food or water.

Some owners get off Scot free. A man in Storrington rang to say he had just picked up an old plastic handbag that was moving, it had a small black cat inside and had just been dumped. The cat is not microchipped, it was so scared, poor little cat. We will look after him until we can find him a home. We have called him Charles. The man who brought him in said to call him 'Handbag' but we didn't think it was very dignified. I suppose we could have called him Bagpuss!

There was a beautiful young white rabbit found running around in Lancing. We have been putting his photo on Facebook each week but so far no one has claimed him. He's so well behaved.

We also have a young black stray cat that had been around for two weeks in

Worthing. He is not neutered or microchipped. The man rang to say he picked him up and left him in a cat carrier outside our gate. Unfortunately nobody heard the bell.

A lady took her mother's pedigree Birman cat home when her mother went into a Hospice. Her teenage son was ill and couldn't breathe around the cat and had a rash on his body. The doctor said he is allergic to the cat. So we have the cat and are looking for a home for the Birman called Tilly.

Weeks ago we had a traumatised terrified cat come in. We still can't get anyway near poor Tumble. Luckily a lady offered to come in and try Reiki on the cat each evening. Sadly her own cat had just died. She is now so fond of Tumble she has decided to give Tumble a home when, and if, we can ever manage to get him in a cat carrier!

We had five hens arrive recently, some featherless, some with bad legs called scaly leg. Sprays don't work, they need their legs soaked in epsom salts every day, and then rubbed with vaseline, so time consuming. But it eventually worked.

Some of us went to the Sheep Fair and enjoyed it enormously. Unfortunately, the queues for food were so long we all came back hungry. Then we had to get back to work.







Muntham Graves

I had no response to my enquiry last month about Jane Aldridge, born Findon 1865, who worked for the Thynne family at Muntham Court. I thought she might be buried at The Clump.

For the benefit of recent inhabitants, here is a brief history.

The family name of the Marquess of Bath from Longleat is Thynne. By the late 19th c. one branch of this family had purchased Muntham Court Findon. In 1925, one son, Edward, shot himself while cleaning his revolver. The, somewhat controversial coroner's verdict was accidental death. However he was not buried in Findon churchyard but in a clump of trees high up on the downs South West of the house. Subsequently three other members of the family were exhumed and buried there. Edward and Toms gravestones were designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens, a family friend.

There are six Thynne graves for eight people, the last being Brian Sheridan Thynne who died Dec. 1985.

Some of the servants of this family asked if they also could be buried there. This is a peaceful spot overlooking the village, with views to Cissbury and Chanctonbury. Indeed for a dozen or so retainers it is their final resting place. A little further out and down the hill, they are here in a perpetual 'Upstairs-Downstairs'.

These graves are rapidly being overgrown by briars and stinging nettles. Those names that are still visible are:-- Attfield, Holm, Howick, Knight, Merrit and Smalley. I feel it is sad that these graves are so neglected as I remember a time when they were well maintained. Soon the Thynne graves will also be overtaken by the march of nature. Therefore I have written to Longleat asking if anything can be done.

Muntham Court was demolished in 1957 and Worthing Crematorium built on the site.

There is a 'You Tube' video, Muntham Graves by the Bald Explorer. Richard Voles. A pity that he only found the Thynne ones.

Riparian Ditches – its that time of the year again...

Autumn is rapidly approaching and the leaves will soon start to fall.

If you are a property owner and have a watercourse running through, adjoining, or below it, then the chances are it is your responsibility to maintain it. A watercourse is any natural or artificial channel above or below ground through which water flows (such as a river, brook, ditch or stream, or piped or in a culvert). Properly maintained watercourses help keep land and roads well-drained, control surface water, and allow water to escape more efficiently – all the reasons they exist in the first place.

Owners' responsibilities include clearing any debris, managing vegetation in the watercourse, and clearing obstructions.


