Findon Sheep Fair



The right for a fair at Findon was established by Royal Charter in 1261. Whilst records of past fairs are sparse, it is known that for over 200 years the Sheep Fair has taken place on Nepcote Green. As is in keeping with any historical right it is important to not allow it to lapse, and therefore despite having to cancel the full show for 2021, we intend to hold a short opening and closing ceremony on Saturday 11th September 2021 commencing at 11am.

This ceremony will last approximately two hours and all residents of Findon Village are welcome to attend. Please note that no parking facilities will be made available for this ceremony. There will be an information tent to provide details for the 2022 event. This will include information for existing and future stall holders, information for

existing volunteers and volunteering and information for potential sponsorships. It will also provide a forum for villagers to air their views and provide suggestions for future events.

This short ceremony will include the following activities:

- A few Sheep on the Green
- Refreshment Tent
- One of Harris's large trucks



Paws Animal Sanctuary

A lady rang and asked if I could take a duck. She said she had four children and two dogs and somebody had left it with her, but it follows her everywhere and wants to be cuddled, all the time. I said yes of course you can bring it in. When they arrived, I opened the gate and a couple were coming up the path followed by the duck. A friend had sent for four duck eggs, he put the eggs in an incubator but only one hatched out. He thought their children might like it. But the lady said she didn't realise it would take up all her time and she just couldn't cope with it. He is so tame, his name is Puddles and we have given him a pen on the lawn with a deep water container. He had never been on water so we first put him on a tray of water but he didn't know what to do - he just kept drinking and would only put his head under. Now he is swimming and diving all the time and eating grass. He is so happy and loves all the volunteers and wants to be with people. He is happiest if you cuddle him so he can rest his head on your neck. At night he has a pen inside with puppy pads on the floor with food and water, but complains when he is shut in - he would rather be sitting on a table or shelf but he needs to be put away safe for the night.

My daughter has bought me a new armchair, you press a button on the side and the foot rest comes up, it also heats and vibrates, very useful if you have a bad back. She bought me the same chair about three years ago for my birthday but it stopped working. I really love to sit down for a couple of hours every afternoon and put my feet up. After she put my old chair together, my daughter took the old one apart and we found out why it didn't work anymore - the dogs had been hiding Bonios, bones, pig's ears, dog treats and chews inside down the back and sides. There were at least two carrier bags of

them all. I thought they had been sitting in my chair eating them and I bought them more. The man who came to take the old chair away said "You're not throwing that lovely leather chair away are you"? When I told him it stopped working he said "Its probably only a fuse" !!!

At last the baby birds have stopped arriving but we still have injured pigeons almost every week. Angela, one of our volunteers, takes them to Animal Aid Wildlife Hospital at Leatherhead on Sundays on her way home,

I discovered East Clayton Farm, a Donkey Rescue on the way to Storrington. They are open to the public to go Donkey Walking and the money they raise funds the children's centre they have there. I visited them last week and they have agreed to take my donkey when I die. All our cat pens are full again, luckily most of the volunteers have returned, (still wearing masks.) On Monday I had a skip delivered, the phone rang and a young man asked if he could come and volunteer I told him "Yes please can you come today I've just had a skip delivered and I need help to clear the garden up"? He said "Can I come in September, I live in France so I can't come today"! He wanted to live in, perhaps I watch too many Midsummer Murders, but I declined his kind offer.

Findon Village Hall Status Update

Well! It's all happening – by the time you read this we will have had our Barbeque on Sunday the 22nd – as I type I am hoping it will be a nice day. The hall has a pretty full agenda of regular bookings again now (in fact we are having to jostle them a little here and there), so that's great. We have a full season of Film nights planned starting next month starting with a heart-warming comedy called My Spy. This will be on Saturday, the 18th of September (thereafter back to the traditional Fridays). There will be burgers, there will be a bar! Roll up! We have also had some very successful private bookings for parties etc. – so I think we can say that, at last, after all the problems for everyone over the last 18 months or so, the Hall is coming back to life.

We continue to work with Findon Parish council on the extension and have had some joint success in getting costs down –even though it has been agreed to add resurfacing and extending the car park to the scope of work in the project. I have to thank our maintenance team both for getting stuck in a doing things to eliminate them from the scope of work and also liaising with the building authorities to clear up and eliminate potentially expensive uncertainties. FPC have also recently and very generously given us a grant to erect a fence between the pre-school plot and the back of the Hall. We are liaising with the Pre-School because there are some opportunities to maximise the benefits for us both by getting that right.

There have been some questions about the car park barrier and why the default mode is now down and locked – this is because we have been advised to do this because of problems in the area with “nomadic travellers”. There have also been some issues with physically operating the barrier and securing it in the “up” position. We hope to have an improved arrangement before long – “men in Sheds” are bringing their ingenuity to bear so I think we can be confident!

We hope that the final work on the new CCTV system will also be completed in the latter part of the month and that will then be fully commissioned. Those cameras that have already been installed are a great improvement on the old system.

We were planning to re-open Lambs Tails in the new school term but we are struggling with staff (as well as having to find a new slot). If anyone is interested in helping to run Lambs Tails we would be very happy to hear from you. At present we cannot re-start. The new website is nearly, nearly there – just a few (frustrating) niggles left. We really could do with some support from anyone who has experience with Google Workspace.

That's all for this month – I hope to have seen a lot of you at the barbeque by the time you read this - and the rest of you at film night!

Shepherding at the start of Autumn

September is the month when sheep farms start to plan their next year, deciding whether they have the right number of ewes and rams to produce lambs in 2022.

The Findon Sheep fair used to have sheep auctions on Nepcote Green up to the year 2000 when Foot and Mouth plus a decline in numbers, stopped the sale and judging of sheep at Findon. At the height of yearly sales up to 20,000 sheep were sold over the second weekend in September at Nepcote. Sheep Auctions moved to the Ardingly show ground, where they are still held today, this year on Thursday 16th September. Many people experience auctions but when you are selling livestock you are in the ring with your animals in front of a sea of faces, moving the animals as the auctioneer is taking bids. It is a

different type of experience as we have found when selling sheep.

This summer, grass for the animals has not been a problem as we have had very regular downfalls of rain. Farmers though have had various windows to bring in bales of hay. The last two years in the South East there has been a shortage of hay and supplies have had to be brought in from other parts of the country and this has put up the cost.

A New Beginning in the Garden

In the depths of winter and during “lockdown 2”, I rashly decided that we should take up all the plants in the decorative side of the back garden and start again. This side of the garden has always been a bit of an afterthought, as I tend to prioritise the veg plot, so it was all a bit of a mishmash. I had always wanted a pond too and this was an ideal opportunity to fix the whole thing. I had inherited some money when my father died last year, so decided I would use some of that. The first decision I made was to plant a rowan tree, or mountain ash. My father had been born in a town called Mountain Ash in south Wales, not far from Aberfan, so this seemed like a fitting tribute to my roots. I asked a garden designer to do a planting and pond plan for us and we were off.

Digging out was a good workout in itself and we then had to dispose of the mass of old vegetation and loads of flint. This was quickly followed by the delivery of four tonnes of compost. Much shovelling, barrowing and digging in later, the soil looked greatly improved. The plants were delivered in April (on the day it snowed) and we had to then keep them all going while the pond man was delayed. We had decided that it would be prudent to get someone in to dig and create the pond and when I saw their efforts I was glad. They found the remnants of an old flint wall just under

the surface and in appalling conditions (rain and strong winds - in May!) they finally succeeded. Initially I was a bit worried that it looked very stark, but it was amazing what a difference the pond plants made. Planting out the borders with over 100 new plants took some time, but I then stood back and waited for them to start growing. And waited, and waited... Basically they sulked for a month, whilst spring decided not to turn up to the party! A month later, they had hardly done anything. However, we finally got some warm weather and they decided to wake from their slumbers.

A couple of months and a lot of rain later, the garden is looking lush. The plants have grown and flowered and the dahlias I had stored over winter have been fantastic. The rowan has flowered and now has berries, although they probably won't last long as the birds love them. Don't tell anyone, but I was secretly sort of glad of all that rain – it saved us the trouble of a lot of watering! The pond is looking good too – with frequent visits from damsel and dragonflies; bathing birds; bees and other insects; pond snails and of course our resident frog. Also in the pond we have had water lilies and many other flowers. I like it so much I wish we had gone bigger. Maybe we could have one in the front garden too? Don't get me started....


