From the Rectory

School's about to go back and I hope, like me, you've had a restful and joyful summer. The sunny weather meant, even for those unable to go far afield, there was still a holiday atmosphere have you noticed how sunshine brings the smiles out?! Of course, being British, we grumbled about the heat and the lack of rain, but on balance it was wonderful! Ironically, just when our weather was at its hottest, I got several WhatsApp videoclips from my daughter in Australia, showing our older granddaughter learning to ski while her sister enjoyed tobogganing - somehow you don't associate Australia with snow, do you?

I've been lucky enough to have two short breaks, the first with a group from the Parish, visiting our partner Parish in Schney [see page 11] and the second, more recently, a spur-of-the-moment visit to family in Helsinki, where I was happy to find I hadn't forgotten my 'native' tongue despite not having spoken any Finnish for 8 years! On both occasions, such wonderful hospitality was offered as friendships were renewed and I returned refreshed and renewed.

A couple of weeks ago, there was an article in the Church Times about the British Pilgrim Trust trying to reestablish an ancient Pilgrim route from Southampton to Canterbury, sleeping in churches along the route. Earlier this year, I was approached by one of the group members, wondering if they might stay in Findon Church overnight in mid July. Preparations were made, sleeping bags dropped off a couple of days earlier and provisions ordered via Opodo and everything was ready. Early on Saturday 21st July, I had a text asking if Clapham and Patching Churches were open, as the group wanted to visit these on their way. I met them at Patching Church mid morning, told them a little about the building, then they had a short ceremony at the font [picture below] before setting off for Clapham. The Junction beckoned after a long hot walk from Arundel, so I left them there and joined them once more at Findon.



The Caldecotts generously offered both a swim and liquid refreshment, giving us a chance to chat about their experience so far. The following morning, after a simple Eucharist around the font, they set off on their way to Bramber [photo on next page]. Hopefully their experience will lead to other pilgrims also visiting our lovely buildings in the future.

We have not yet been trading for a year but the shop is thriving. Commercially we still have a lot to learn but we are getting there. Our purchasing practice is improving, and the amount of waste reducing as a consequence. We are listening to what our customers say they would like us to stock and trying to ensure that it is available. So please keep telling us what you would like to see!

Our volunteers are becoming more confident and skilled with the use of the till and the more complicated tasks of processing newspaper bill payments and the lottery – particularly when it comes to making payments for winnings! I am so grateful that Annie Whitchurch has agreed to continue training into August so that we have been able to induct new volunteers as well as undertaking the more advanced training required for the more skilled jobs.

The incredibly hot weather was a bit of a challenge for us. We have had to be so careful about keeping our fresh products at the right temperature and to ensure that our fridges and freezers are up to the task. There are very strict Health and

Safety regulations which we have to be respected at all times, which is why the ice cream freezer had to be brought inside during the most intense temperatures. This has reduced available browsing space in the shop but we hope it will only be a temporary arrangement.

Our shop slogan is 'Run by the Community for the Community'. Our volunteers are our life blood. I am so grateful to them all for all they do to support me and our community endeavour, but we also need our community's continuing support. Last month I encouraged you all to think about placing a regular order for a newspaper or a periodical. I am glad to say that that there has been a limited response but there is room for improvement!. Please do continue to take advantage of our wonderful community facility: always shop with us when you can!

We are still struggling with the monopoly provider of our newspapers. There are no alternatives, we sincerely apologise for the inconvenience and frustration this causes and we are doing all we can to bring pressure to Smith's to improve their service.

"In April 1947 I came from Italy to live at West View Terrace Findon after marrying Oliver Rose.

Oliver was born in the village and lived all his life here until sadly he died in 2013.

Although I thought what a pretty little place Findon was after living in a town with all mod cons It was rather a shock that I had to get water from the well in the garden!!

At the time my English was very limited and I can remember my first visit to the local shop and repeating over and over again in my head 11b Mince.

The first people I really got to know were George & Charlotte Hicks (AKA Bun) who took me under their wing and became an important part of our family. Both our daughters went to Findon School. Just after Sandra started in 1958 I was asked by the then headmistress Mrs Powell could I help out in the kitchen for a few weeks - after 34 years I retired!!! I enjoyed my job and saw so many children start and leave school. Today I still see many of them now with children of their own.

I have seen many changes and obviously lost many friends but I have been fortunate enough to make many new ones through the Lunch Club and the Ladies Coffee Morning."

We all enjoyed our time with friends old and new in Schney, strengthening our ties with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Bavaria and we are now starting to plan their visit to us next June.

Our thanks are due to Helena in Findon and Tanja in Schney for organising this visit and for giving us the opportunity to get to know our Christian brothers and sisters in Germany.

PS from Helena: Our patience was tested when we found (at the airport) that EasyJet had cancelled our home flight, leaving us stranded in Munich. The plus side was that we got to see something of this beautiful city the next day before boarding an alternative flight home. Joshua the Gardener

September, to me anyway, feels like it has come around quick this year. We had little to no spring but a good hot summer and, despite the recent rain however, it is here, and September is a busy month in the garden with lots to be getting on with.

The tide is turning, and Autumn is at our door. Autumn is my favourite season in the garden, although it comes with the loss of most of the beautiful summer flowering perennials and the long summer nights are drawing to a close. It brings outstanding colour with the warming reds of the tree leaves and the morning dew covers the garden giving it a distinct beauty. It also makes me think of roasted squash, hearty onion soup and roast dinners. It's a time to celebrate the harvest and we do just that! For many Pagan and Wiccan traditions it is a time of giving thanks for the things we have, whether it is abundant crops or other blessings. Around the 21st of September is the time of the autumn equinox, and the harvest is winding down. The fields are nearly empty, because the crops have been plucked and stored for the coming winter. Mabon is the harvest festival.

and it is when we take a few moments to honour the changing seasons.

You can honour some of your favourite herbaceous perennials by multiplying them the best and easiest way at this time of year, by division. Let's take a clump of hosta for example, all you need to do is dig up the plant and once out of the ground take a sharp spade (it must be sharp and clean) and with one quick slice cut right from top to bottom through the plant. depending on the original clump size you might be able to get 4 to 6 plants from this. For plants with a more fibrous root system it might be best to insert two garden forks back to back down the middle of the clump and then prize the forks open by the handles to break apart the clump and to cause less damage to the root system.

If your lawn has suffered like so many in the heat this summer September is the month for repair work and the perfect time to sow new grass seed, warm enough for quick germination but cool and damp enough to not worry about drying out. Likewise, if you're laying turf.

So, lots to do and lots to gain. Happy gardening

If anyone finds a lost dog, cat, ferret, rabbit or even a budgie they always seem to leave it until late at night to ring us. Lots of the time saying they need help right away. I tell them they can bring it in to us, or they will have to keep it until the morning, to put it in their bathroom with food and water overnight. Lost dogs, are a different matter, they will obviously bark and upset the neighbours. The Dog Warden is very good and just lives down the road, if not too late, even out of hours, he will come and pick the dog up.

I never go out at night because even with a torch I can never see house numbers in the dark, lots have none you can actually see or even worse just have a house name and no number. Last week someone rang me at 11.30 at night to say they found a little kitten on their doorstep, could I come and pick it up! He had come in from the pub, so agreed to put the kitten in the bathroom until morning. When I tried to find the address next day my sat-nav kept coming up with the wrong road name, it was a new block of flats down a lane behind houses and I couldn't even see the name of the block. In the end the man had to come down the lane and find me. What a nightmare, an ambulance would never have found it at night. After just one day the owner of

the kitten phoned up and claimed it, he only lived in the block of flats next door. We have taken in more stray cats, so all our pens are full again, last count, we have 33 cats! Some are with our wonderful fosterers until we can rehome one and then bring the next one in.

We urgently need more Volunteers, lots of the young Volunteers leave to go to University or find jobs. Some of our older ones find the work gets too much for them.

PAWS have never had so many Guinea-pigs. All the animals are cleaned out every day which involves lots of bending, cleaning cat litter trays, mucking out stables, also cleaning hutches and pens, and grooming all the animals. You need stamina to work here, and lots of Lucozade.

Sussex PCC Opens Community Safety Fund for Local Initiatives

Organisations across Sussex are being invited to bid for funding from the county's Police & Crime Commissioner Katy Bourne.

Grants of up to £5,000 are available for groups that provide a positive and lasting impact on the local community in Sussex.

Since launching the Safer in Sussex funding scheme in December 2013 I have allocated nearly £1.5 million from the Community Safety Fund to support nearly 300 crime reduction and community safety initiatives." says Mrs Bourne.

"It is making a real difference to local people and neighbourhoods. The high numbers that apply each time shows organisations and community groups care about, and are committed to, keeping Sussex a safe place in which to live."

To qualify, projects should demonstrate how they will increase or promote community safety within the local community and have a positive longterm impact. They should also be able to offer evidence to support the need for the project and show how it helps to prevent offending and reduce reoffending. Just some of the organisations from across Sussex that have received grants from the Community Safety Fund to date include:

Antifreeze, a project run by Off the Fence Trust, supports those who have struggled with life-destroying addictions, mental health issues, job loss, family breakdown, violence and bereavement which have led to homelessness. The team and volunteers work to restore self-worth, confidence and independence, and help to address welfare and financial issues (£5,000).

The Friday Night Project – Active Hastings, a project that provides a safe structured environment for young people on Friday evenings, a time when we are aware from discussions with local officers that anti-social behaviour can be a particular problem (£4,904).

Streetlight UK , a charity that provides a specialist, frontline support service to vulnerable groups of women in Crawley and the surrounding areas, involved in and affected by prostitution and sexual exploitation (£5,000).
