# SPRING FLOWER SHOW

## Schedule

Where possible the classification of daffodils (narcissi) has been adopted from the Royal Horticultural Society and the appropriate Division definition is used.

**a. Large Trumpet daffodils** (Division 1). One flower on a stem; corona (trumpet) as long as or longer than the perianth segments (petals).



**b. Large-cupped daffodils** (Division 2). One flower to a stem; corona (cup) more than one-third, but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments (petals).



**c. Small-cupped daffodils** (Division 3). One flower to a stem; corona (cup) not more than one-third the length of the perianth segments (petals).



**d. Double daffodils** (Division 4). One or more flowers to a stem, with doubling of the perianth segments or corona or both.



**e. Multi-headed** (Bunch). Multiple flowers to a stem without the doubling of the perianth segments or corona or both.



**f. Miniatures** – Including Cyclamineus. One or more flowers to a stem.



Unless stated otherwise vases will be provided.

## Flower Section

1. One specimen single tulip - single stem.
2. Three stems of single tulips - one variety.
3. One specimen parrot or double tulip.
4. Three stems of parrot or double tulips - one variety.
5. Five stems of tulips - one or more varieties.
6. One specimen stem – large trumpet daffodil. See (a)
7. Three stems - large trumpet daffodils - one or more varieties. See (a)
8. One specimen stem – large cupped daffodil. See (b)
9. Three stems – large cupped daffodils – one or more varieties. See (b)
10. One specimen stem – small cupped daffodil. See (c)
11. Three stems – small cupped daffodils – one or more varieties. See (c)
12. Three stems – any double variety daffodils. See (d)
13. Three stems – any multi headed (bunch) flowered daffodils - one or more varieties. See (e)
14. Three stems – any miniature daffodils - one or more varieties. See (f)
15. A tied bunch of polyanthus or primroses – one or more varieties. Exhibitor's own container - own foliage optional.
16. A tied bunch of muscari – one or more varieties. Exhibitor's own container - own foliage optional.
17. Mixed Spring flowers - may include shrubs, and not more than 15 flowering stems.
18. Five hellebore flower heads floating in a bowl of water. Exhibitor's own bowl not to exceed 9" diameter.
19. Three camellia flower heads floating in a bowl of water. Exhibitor's own bowl not to exceed 9" diameter.

## Flower Section continued ....

20. One house pot plant
21. One orchid pot plant
22. One succulent or cactus pot plant
23. One specimen spray of flowering tree or shrub
24. Three sprays of flowering tree or shrub, one or more types
25. Three sticks of rhubarb – must have 8cm of top foliage and heel

### NOTE:

Classes **20 - 22** are in exhibitor's own pot not to exceed 30cm inside diameter.

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## Floral Art

26. 'Easter Basket' - an Easter-themed arrangement in a basket not exceeding 45 x 45 centimetres, height unlimited
27. Foliage arrangement - an arrangement not exceeding 45 x 45 centimetres, height unlimited
28. 'New Wave' - a modern arrangement not exceeding 45 x 45 centimetres, height unlimited
29. 'Think Small' - a petite arrangement in a ramekin but not exceeding 20 x 20 centimetres, height unlimited

**NOTE:** Exhibitors to provide their own containers, bought material may be used

## Rules

1. All exhibits in Classes 1 to 26 must be grown by the exhibitor or have been in their possession for at least two months before the show.
2. An entrant must be a member of the association. At the time of entering, the member must be either a resident of the Parish of Findon or have been a member of the association for at least three months. Only one entry per class, per person. All exhibits will be shown anonymously.
3. The judges reserve the right to withhold prizes if exhibits are unworthy.
4. Exhibitors must not move or interfere with another person's exhibit. A member of the Committee will make any adjustments necessary and reserves the right to reposition exhibits as required. The decision of the judges shall be final as to the merits of exhibits and the decision of the Committee shall be final in all matters relating to the show. Any complaints should be notified in writing to the Show Secretary by 3pm on the day of the show.
5. Cups will be retained after the show for engraving.
6. All root vegetables should be washed and all fruit should be shown with stalks.
7. Vases and/or paper plates will be provided unless otherwise stated.
8. All prize money to be collected after the raffle is drawn. Prize monies not collected will be regarded as donations to Chestnut Tree House.
9. The Committee will take all reasonable care but will not be responsible for loss or damage to any exhibit.
10. The Committee can refuse any entry and is not required to give reason or explanation for such refusal.
11. All exhibits should be staged between 8.00am and 10.00am on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> April, and may be collected after the raffle has been drawn and before 5pm. Judging commences at 10.15am and no admittance to the hall will be permitted other than for show officials.

## Cookery

30. A flask of hot, vegetable-based soup - own recipe
31. Three plain scones
32. Sussex Apple Cake - recipe provided overleaf
33. A sponge cake - own recipe and own filling, in a round tin not exceeding 9 inches diameter
34. Gentlemen only – Easter biscuits - own recipe
35. A jar of marmalade
36. A jar of chutney

**NOTE:** Classes **31 - 34** to be covered with Clingfilm, both Clingfilm and paper plates will be provided.  
Classes **35** and **36** must be in clear glass jars with clean solid lids. Please do not use greaseproof inner circles or gingham-type pot covers.

37. One black and white photograph, subject 'Graveyard Shift'
38. One coloured photograph, subject 'My Favourite Spot'
39. Four coloured photographs, subject 'High and Mighty'
40. One coloured photograph to be suitable for the 2021 Spring schedule cover

**NOTE:** Single photographic classes must be mounted on A5 card (21cm x 15cm) not framed. The photograph must be smaller than A5.  
Multiple photographic classes must be mounted on a single card. Each photograph must not exceed 4 inches x 6 inches (10cm x 15cm).

Photographs must not have been previously entered.

## Sussex Apple Cake

### Ingredients

225g softened butter  
225g dark brown soft sugar  
3 large eggs  
150g chopped walnuts  
150g sultanas or raisins  
225g wholemeal self-raising flour  
400g cooking apples peeled, cored, grated  
½ tsp ground cloves

### Method

Preheat oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas 4, grease and line 9" loose bottomed tin.

Beat butter and 175g of sugar together until fluffy, then add the eggs and beat.

Fold in 100g chopped walnuts, the sultanas and the flour mixing well so well distributed.

Put half the mixture in the tin.

Mix together the apples and cloves and spread over the layer of cake mixture in the tin. Spread the remaining cake mixture on top and smooth with a palette knife.

Mix together the remaining 50g sugar and 50g walnuts and sprinkle evenly over the top of the cake.

Bake 1 ¼-1 ½ hours until the top is caramelised but not too brown.

Remove from oven and allow to cool in tin.

Once cooled, serve as is or finish with icing drizzled on top.
